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Microdata Release Policy

Kigali, August 2012

#### I. Preamble

The NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF STATISTICS OF RWANDA (NISR) plays the leading role in improving capacity to use evidence-based information for decision-making for the benefit of Rwanda. It accomplishes these goals by coordinating national efforts to collect and compile reliable data and to analyze, disseminate and archive data within an integrated and sustainable framework. These objectives are achieved by disseminating a wide range of information and data products.

This policy addresses the conditions and the manner in which anonymised microdata files may be released to users for research purposes while ensuring that the confidentiality of information provided by respondents is respected.

## II. Objective

The objective of this policy is to define the nature of the anonymised microdata files that will be released, the intended use of these files and the conditions under which these files will be released.

## III. Rationale and Authority

The NISR aims to support research and teaching about the economic and social conditions of the Rwandan population. In particular, this policy aims to support the needs of specialized researchers and students to by providing anonymised microdata files to be used strictly for research and educational purposes. The output from this type of research forms the basis for decision-making about policies and programs in Rwanda while exposing students to actual, current data.

Furthermore, the access by researchers to microdata is a way of increasing the returns on theon the high cost of collecting official statistics and enabling the use of best quality of data which could lead to the expected outputs. Conversely, if researchers do not have access to relevant official statistical data, there is the risk that they will collect their own data, which will often be with smaller samples and of inferior quality relative to official surveys.

Under the provisions of Article 21 of the Organic Law No.01/2005 of 14/02/2005 on the organization of statistical activities in Rwanda it is stated that:

"Data collected by the services of the national statistical system through surveys or any other method of collection are protected by statistical confidentiality. Statistical confidentiality implies that the dissemination of such data as well as statistical data which can be calculated from them, shall be conducted in a way that those who provided it are not identified whether directly or indirectly."

This policy will identify the types of statistical products that will be released by NISR to ensure that respondent confidentiality is preserved while meeting the needs of researchers and students.

#### IV. Policy Statement

Microdata files will only be made available for statistical purposes when:

- The Director General has received the advice of the Microdata Release Committee and is satisfied that all reasonable steps have been taken to prevent the identification of individual respondents,
- the release of the data will substantially enhance the analytic value of the data that have been collected,
- for all but purely public files, researchers disclose the nature and objectives of their intended research, and
- the researchers have agreed to an appropriate undertaking regarding the manner in which the files can be used.

See Appendix A for definitions of terms used in this policy.

#### V. Classes of users

The NISR recognizes that micro-data files are intended for specialized users with advanced quantitative skills. This policy distinguishes among the following classes of users:

 Policymakers and researchers employed by line-ministries and planning departments who are engaged in the development of regional and national strategies and programs including the monitoring and evaluation of these programs,

- national strategies and programs including the monitoring and evaluation of these programs,
- international agencies involved in the conduct of special studies aimed at identifying development to support opportunities and development programs and infrastructures within Rwanda,
- research and academic institutes involved in social and economic research,
- students and professors mainly engaged in educational activities, and
- other users who are involved in conducting scientific research (to be approved on a case by case basis)

## VI. Notes on Degree of Anonymization and Types of Files

Files may be anonymised using a variety of technics including removing variables, removing records, global recoding, top and bottom recoding and local suppression.

There are two types of anonymized files that are covered under the terms of this policy. The major differences between these files are the levels of geographic and characteristic detail. The file types are:

- Public Use Files (PUFs): Microdata files that are disseminated for general public use. They have been highly anonymised by removing the names and addresses and by collapsing geographic and respondent characteristic details to ensure that identification of individuals is highly unlikely. These files are made available for downloading from NISR website to individuals who identify themselves by name, provide their email addresses and agree to abide by the terms and conditions appropriate for a PUF (See Appendix B).
- **Licensed files:** These files require that there be a signed agreement between NISR and major users to permit them to access data files that are less highly anonymized and/or more sensitive than PUFs. For these files, all individual identifiers have been removed and some characteristic details may be collapsed or removed. Licensing agreements are only entered into with bona fideusers working for registered organizations. The primary and secondary researchers must be identified by name and a responsible officer of the organization must co-sign the license agreement (See Appendix C).

#### VII. Notes on Access Methods

The files to be disseminated will have been documented/curated. This ensures that the files are well-documented for users. PUFs can be freely accessed from the NISR website by users after they have registered online and agreed to the terms and conditions contained in the license. See Appendix B

Licensed files require that there be a signed agreement between NISR and major users to permit them to access data files that are more detailed (and thus less well anonymised). Licensing agreements are only entered into with bona fide users working for registered organizations. The primary and secondary researchers must be identified by name and a responsible officer of the organization must co-sign the license agreement. The files may be transferred to the users via online methods or on digital media such as a DVD or by secure FTP (File Transfer Protocol).

The decisions on the access to confidential micro data are made are based on theon the provisions of the NISR. In cases when microdata are released to individuals or institutions, its authorization is granted to a specific person representing the institutions. In order to grant an authorization, NISR evaluates the proposal of organization carefully by considering the credibility and educational standards among the applicants.

An online application for an authorization to use data must be submitted to the NISR in which the applicant specifies the purpose for which the statistical data are to be used.

When considering the granting of an authorization to use basic data, the NISR determines whether the data can be processed in-house by the applicant. Even if the microdata sought by the researcher are available on NISR website, a direct access to these licensed files has to be authorized by introducing a password which could be accessed on request.

#### VIII. Timing and Release Policy

Recognizing the important needs of users and the importance of timely data, the NISR will strive to release documented micro-data files within 6-24 months after the first release of data from a survey/census.

## IX. Cost Recovery

It is the policy of the NISR to encourage broad use of its products by making them affordable for users. Accordingly, the NISR attempts to ensure that the costs of creating anonymized microdata files are built-in to the survey budget. At the same time, the NISR attempts to recover costs associated with the provisions of special services that benefit only a specific group.

The following cost-recovery principles will apply to the dissemination of microdata files.

- Public use files posted in the NISR data server for broad download will be available without charge.
- Licensed data files will be made available to survey sponsors without charge providing that the cost of preparing the files is part of the survey budget.

#### X. Responsibilities

The NISR is responsible for producing quality, relevant and timely statistics within the constraints of their budgetary means. It will release microdata files conforming to international standards of statistical confidentiality for statistical and research purposes. The Organic Law No.01/2005 of 14/02/2005 prohibits employees of the NISR from disseminating information related to an enterprise or an establishment and the individual he or she may know during his or her job or in relation to his or her activities.

Users of the files disseminated by the NISR are required to abide by the terms and conditions under which they are granted the right to access and use these files. Attempts to re-identify respondents are expressly forbidden. Breaches to the undertaking by users may result in the loss of access to files for the individual or in the case of licensed files, for the entire organization.

## Appendix A: Definitions

- **Microdata** are defined as files of records pertaining to individual respondent units. Microdata files for dissemination purposes are those in which all direct and indirect identifiers have been removed through various anonymisation procedures.
- **Anonymisation** refers to the process of removing direct and indirect identifiers from survey, census or administrative data files to conceal the characteristics and the identity of individual respondents.
- <u>Direct identifiers</u> include such information as names, addresses or other direct personal identifiers which must be removed from all files made available to users.
- <u>Indirect identifiers</u> refer to characteristics which are shared with several other respondents and when combined with other information, can lead to compromising the identity of the respondent.
- Microdata Review Committee refers to the committee of senior officials
  who guide the release of microdata files, review the files prior to release
  and make recommendations to the Director General regarding the release
  of the files.
- **Dissemination** refers to the act of making microdata files and supporting metadata available for access and use with the data.
- **<u>Dissemination Unit</u>**refers to the person or group within the NISR that is responsible for facilitating the dissemination of the files and responding to users' enquiries.

## Appendix B:Terms: Terms and conditions of use of public data files

Users of Public Use Files (PUF) may access these data files and supporting documentation from the NISR website by agreeing to respect the terms and conditions shown below. Users must agree to these terms by completing a web-based registration form found on the website:

- 1. The data and other materials provided by the NISR will not be redistributed or sold to other individuals, institutions, or organizations without the written agreement of the NISR.
- 2. The data will be used for statistical and scientific research purposes only. They will be used solely for reporting of aggregated information, and not for investigation of specific individuals or organizations.
- 3. No attempt will be made to re-identify respondents, and no use will be made of the identity of any person or establishment discovered inadvertently. Any such discovery would immediately be reported to the NISR.
- 4. No attempt will be made to produce links among datasets provided by NISR, or among data from the NISR and other datasets that could identify individuals or organizations.
- 5. Any books, articles, conference papers, theses, dissertations, reports, or other publications that employ data obtained from the NISR will cite the source of data in accordance with the Citation Requirement provided with each dataset.
- 6. An electronic copy of all reports and publications based on the requested data will be sent to the NISR.
- 7. The original collector of the data, the NISR or other agencies comprising the National Statistics System, and the relevant funding agencies bear no responsibility for use of the data or for interpretations or inferences based upon such uses.

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


