





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## FOREWORD

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The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.

Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. They include Ministries and other Government institutions, international organizations such as the World Bank (WB), the European Union (EU), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), One-UN, UN Women, UNICEF, UNECA, the United Kingdom AID (UKAID), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the USAID, Enabel, PARIS 21 and others for their support in diverse ways.

My special thanks go to the local government leaders from the province to the village levels who contributed a lot to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. Exceptional gratitude to all enumerators, teachers and young people who collected the information and all respondents for their cooperation and dedication. The National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) deserves special appreciation for the excellent operational and coordination of all census activities.



# CHAPTER 1: POPULATION SIZE, SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION, AND STRUCTURE

## 1.1 Size and spacial Distribution of the population

### 1.1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of The City of Kigali

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 1,745,555 residents in the City of Kigali, which accounts for 13.17% of Rwanda's total population (13,246,394 residents). The population of the City of Kigali is predominantly male, with 888,882 men, representing 50.9% of the city's total population. Kicukiro district had 491,731 residents in 2022, making up 28.2% of the total resident population of Kigali City. The least populated district in the City of Kigali is Nyarugenge, with 374,319 inhabitants, corresponding to 21.4% of the total resident population of Kigali City.



### 1.1.2 Population Density of the City of Kigali and their Districts

Population density is a measure of the number of inhabitants per unit of land area, typically expressed as the number of individuals per square kilometre (Km<sup>2</sup>). Population density plays a vital role in urban planning, resource allocation, and development strategies. According to the Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022, the population density in Rwanda is 503 inhabitants per Km<sup>2</sup>. The City of Kigali has a higher population density, with 2401 inhabitants per Km<sup>2</sup>. Among the districts of the City of Kigali, Kicukiro has the highest population density at 2,944 inhabitants per Km<sup>2</sup>, while Gasabo has the lowest population density at 2,056 inhabitants per Km<sup>2</sup>. The figure below illustrates the distribution of population density across the aforementioned districts.


**Figure 1. 2 Population density (inhabitant per Km<sup>2</sup>) by district in The City of Kigali**

### 1.1.3 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of the Kicukiro district

The results in the previous Table 1.1 indicate that there were 491,731 residents enumerated in Kicukiro district, accounting for 28.1% of the total population of the City of Kigali. Notably, the population of Kicukiro district is predominantly male, with 249,115 men constituting 50.7% of the total district population. Table 1.2 provides further insights into the population of Kicukiro district, presenting data on a sector level, including the population breakdown by sex and the percentage of females in each sector, along with their respective shares relative to the total population of Kicukiro district. In two out of the 10 sectors of the district, namely Masaka (50.8%) and Nyarugunga (51.2%), females hold the majority. The most populous sectors within Kicukiro district are Gahanga (79,082 residents), Masaka (78,788 residents), Kanombe (72,346 residents), Gatenga (67,084 residents), and Kigarama (63,153 residents). These sectors have the highest share of the population compared to other sectors, as indicated in the table below.

#### **1.1.4 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Kicukiro district by area of residence**

Understanding the distribution of the population between urban and rural areas is essential for planning and policymaking to address the different needs and challenges faced by each region. The census data provides valuable insights into the spatial distribution of the population in Rwanda, which help for various developmental initiatives and resource allocation.

The results of the Rwanda Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that the total population of Rwanda is spatially distributed with 72.1% living in rural areas and 27.9% residing in urban areas. The City of Kigali is predominantly urban with 86.9% of its population living in urban areas and the remaining 13.1% in rural areas.

Within Kicukiro district, most of the population resides in urban areas, accounting for 99.1%, while only a small percentage 0.9% live in rural areas. Among the sectors in Kicukiro district, Gahanga, Gatenga, Gikondo, Kagarama, Kanombe, Kicukiro, Kigarama, and Niboye are entirely urban. The only sector with a rural area is Masaka, where 5.8% of its population resides in rural area. The details of these distributions are illustrated in Table 1.3.

### 1.1.5 Age-Sex Structure of the Population of Kicukiro district

Understanding the age distribution is crucial for planning and implementing policies that cater to the needs of different age groups and ensure the well-being of the entire population. The population of Kicukiro is predominantly young; the youthful demographic composition of Kicukiro has implications for various aspects, including education, healthcare, and social services. Approximately 53.1% of the resident population in Kicukiro is under 25 years old, as depicted by the age pyramid (Figure 1.4). This reflects the high level of fertility in the district in the recent past. Conversely, the elderly population (60 years and above) constitutes only 2.9% of the total population of the district. Additionally, the percentage share of the population aged 0-14 is 30.26%.



### **1.1.6 Population share of some specific interventions target groups in Kicukiro District by sex**

The Rwanda Population and Housing Census 2022 provides valuable insights into the population based on specific age groups, enabling the development of targeted programs, policies, and strategies in various sectors, including health, education, and employment. The census data categorizes the population into different groups, such as children, youth, and the working population, among others. These groups, like children under five years (Under 5 years children), school-age children (3-17 years), and people in the official working age group (16years and above), etc, serve as the basis for implementing relevant interventions and initiatives.

Knowing the size of these target groups is of utmost importance for effectively designing, implementing, monitoring, and evaluating programs that cater to their specific needs. The provided table 1.5 illustrates the size of the main intervention target groups by sex and their respective shares in the entire population of Kicukiro district. Specifically, the population aged 0-17 represents 35.8% of the total district population, while the age group of 16-30 years accounts for 35.6%. Additionally, the economically active population aged 16 to 64 years represents 66.2% of the district's population. This data on targeted interventions by age groups is crucial for informed decision-making and resource allocation, ensuring that appropriate support and services are directed towards the specific needs of different age cohorts within the district.

## CHAPTER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

### 2.1 Socio-cultural characteristics of the population

#### 2.1.1 Nationality of the population of Kicukiro district

The results of the 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (RPHC) conducted in 2022 reveal that the Rwandan population represents 99.11% at the national level, while foreigners make up 0.89% of the total population. In the City of Kigali, foreigners account for 1.18% of the population, and in Kicukiro district, the percentage of foreigners represent 1.37%, which corresponds to 6,749 foreign residents. Among the sectors in Kicukiro district, four sectors have the highest percentage of foreigners compared to other sectors. Niboye sector has proportion of foreigners at 2.81%, followed by Kigarama with 2.57%, Kicukiro with 2.26%, and Gikondo with 2.08%.

The table below provides a clear illustration of the distribution of the population by nationality in their respective sectors of residence, showing the percentage of foreigners in each sector.

#### 2.1.2 Religious affiliation of the resident population of Kicukiro district

In Kicukiro district, Christianity is the predominant religion: 35.82% are catholic, 22.91% are ADEPR, 10.35 % are protestant, 9.97 % are Adventists, other Christians represent 9.98%. Other religious represented are Muslim (3.96%) and Jehovah witness are (1.07%) while 2.7% of the resident population declared themselves to be without religion. The table below displays details.

## 2.2 Marital Status of the resident population of Kicukiro district

### 2.2.1 Marital status by sector

The results of 5RPHC-2022 revealed that 43.5% of the resident population of Kicukiro district aged 12 and above were living in union (married officially to one wife/husband, married not officially to one wife/husband, live in polygamous union) at the time of the census while 52.6% were never married while 2.1% were widowed, 1.4% separated and 0.4% divorced. At the sector level, four sectors have the highest percentages of the currently married people: Gahanga (53.3%), Masaka (48.6%), Kanombe (45%) and Gatenga (43.6%) while the highest percentages of the never married persons are found in Niboye (64.1%), Kicukiro (63.8%), Nyarugunga (60.3%). Widower is close to 2% across all sectors of Kicukiro district Details of the resident population of Kicukiro district aged 12 years and above by marital status and sex are presented in the annex.

## 2.2.2 Marital status by Age groups

The percentages of resident population of Kicukiro district by marital status vary by age: The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.8% (age group of 12-14 years) to 3.3% (age group of 80 years and above). The percentage of persons currently married starts by increasing from 0.2% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 82.8% (age group of 45-49 years) before decreasing to 43.3% (age group 80+) due mainly to widowhood (51.9%). The highest percentages of divorced persons are observed within the age groups 45-49 (1.6%) and 50-54 (1.5%) while the highest percentages of the separated persons are found in the age group 45-49 years (3.2%) and the age group 40-44 years (3%).

## 2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population of Kicukiro district

### 2.3.1 School attendance

Understanding school attendance at different education levels is crucial for assessing the effectiveness of early childhood education programs and identifying areas that may require targeted interventions to improve attendance rates. It also helps in promoting equal access to education and fostering a strong educational foundation for children.

Table 2. 5 below shows that, in Kicukiro district, 60.1% of pre-primary-age population (3-5 years) are currently attending school, 39.9% of those children have never attended and none (0%) of those children have previously attended (i.e children who have already had prior exposure to pre-primary school education before the time of census but who were not attending nursery school/droped-out during census time). Noboye Sector has the highest proportion of children (age between 3 to 5) currently attending school in Kicukiro District (81.0%). Following closely, the Nyarugunga Sector has a percentage of 79.5 % of children currently attending school. Gahanga sector has the lowest percentage of children currently attending school, with only 46.9% enrolled. On the other hand, Gahanga and Gatenga sectors have the highest proportion of children aged 3 to 5 who have never attended school (53.1% and 42.3%, respectively).

Table 2. 6 shows that in Kicukiro District 93% of children aged 6 to 11 years (the official primary school-going age) are currently attending school, 5.4% have never attended school and only 1.6% have previously attended school (which means that 7% of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school).

By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) across sectors in Kicukiro District, comparisons reveal the disparities in primary school attendance across different sectors within Kicukiro District. Gahanga sector exhibit lower rates of children currently attending school (88.7%) and higher rates of children who have never attended (9.8%). On the other hand, sectors like Kagarama and Kicukiro demonstrate higher rates of children currently attending school (97.1 against 95.8%, respectively) and lower rates of children who have never attended (2.6 against 1.4%, respectively). The table below illustrates findings:

In Kicukiro District 19.6% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school (i.e., they dropped out of school), 78.1% are currently attending school and 2.4% have never attended secondary school.

The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) across sectors in Kicukiro District, shows that Kagarama sector has the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school at 86.6%. Conversely, Gahanga sector has the lowest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school with 71.8%. Gahanga Sector also has the highest percentage of the population between the ages of 12 and 17 who have never attended school at 4.2%.

### 2.3.2 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Primary School in Kicukiro district

Understanding the attendance rates in primary schools is essential for assessing educational access and identifying areas that may require interventions or improvements to ensure that all children have equal opportunities for education. It also helps in measuring the effectiveness of educational policies and programs in Rwanda.

Gross and Net Attendance Ratios are used to measure the extent of coverage of an educational program. It gives a comparison of the children attending school with the total size of the school-age population. It can also be used for assessing how far a country has succeeded in bringing to school all those who are eligible to attend.

The results of 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years). The gross attendance rate in Rwanda is 141.7, in the City of Kigali GAR is 132.5 and 132.7 in Kicukiro district. The Net Attendance Rate (NAR) in Primary school for Kicukiro district (92.9%) is higher than the NAR of the City of Kigali (91.4%) and the NAR of national level (89.3%).

A Gross Attendance Rate (GAR) of 132.2% in Kicukiro District for the population 6 to 11 years indicates a high percentage of those who attended primary schools aged below 6 years and or above 11 years. On the other hand, the NAR of 92.9% for the population 6 to 11 years indicates that only 92.9% of the population 6 to 11 years were attending primary schools in Kicukiro District by 2022 (Table 2.8). In 2022,

students older or younger than the official primary school age range made up 29.7%  $[(GAR132.2-NAR92.9)/GAR132.2]$  of the primary school population of Kicukiro District.

With a NAR of 96.7%, the Kagarama Sector has the greatest percentage of pupils that are attending primary school and are of primary school-age. In comparison to other sectors, the Gahanga sector has the lowest NAR at 88.7%, indicating a lesser percentage of pupils who are attending primary school within the eligible age range. At most all sectors have gender parity indexes greater than 1.00 except Gikondo and Kagarama sector (0.96 and 0.99 respectively), suggesting better access to education for female students compared to male students.

### 2.3.3 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Secondary School

The net attendance rate provides a more accurate reflection of actual school attendance, as it considers factors such as dropout rates and overage students. Identifying disparities in attendance rates can help in designing targeted interventions to improve access to and retention in secondary education, especially for children in Kicukiro district.

The table 2. 9 provides information on the gross and net attendance rates in the secondary school level (12-17 years) in Kicukiro District, disaggregated by sex and sector. The City of Kigali and Kicukiro District both have higher NARs than the national average (35.2% and 40%, respectively, versus 22.3%) when compared to the national average. Comparing males and females in Kicukiro District in terms of Net Attendance Rates (NAR), the table 2. 9 indicates that a higher proportion of females (40.9%) in Kicukiro District, within the secondary school-age range (12-17 years), are attending school compared to males (38.9%). Female students older or younger

than the official secondary school age range made up 42.3 %  $[(GAR70.8-NAR40.9)/GAR70.8]$  of the female with secondary school age of Kicukiro District, while for male students it made up 47.3 %  $[(GAR73.9-NAR38.9)/GAR73.9]$ . This shows that females have a higher attendance rate in Kicukiro District compared to males when considering the overall attendance rates, regardless of age or grade-level eligibility.

Among the sectors in Kicukiro District, Kicukiro and Niboye have the highest GAR for both sexes, with a rate of 101.7% and 102.7%. Sectors such as Gahanga, and Masaka have relatively lower GAR compared to others (47.9%, and 57.6% respectively). Kagarama has the highest NAR for both sexes in Kicukiro District, with a rate of 57.2%. Sectors like Gahanga, Masaka, and Gatenga have relatively lower NAR compared to others (27.3%, 33.2% and 36.8% respectively). The table below provides details.

### 2.3.4 Highest level of school attended in Kicukiro district

Understanding the educational attainment of the population at the district and sector levels is essential for assessing the level of access to education and identifying areas that may require targeted interventions to improve educational outcomes. It also helps in planning and implementing educational policies and programs to cater to the diverse educational needs of the population.

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate the total population of Rwanda aged 3 and above is 11,999,691. The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary, University, and Not stated. In Rwanda, 16.7% of the population aged 3 years and above has never attended school, while 2.7% have

attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, 7.1% for upper secondary, 3.6% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of the City of Kigali aged 3 and above is 1,603,405. The distribution of the highest level of education attended is like the national level, with slight variations. In the City of Kigali, 9.6% of the population has never attended school, while 3.4% have attended nursery, and 46.8% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 1.1% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 12.8% for lower secondary, 14.2% for upper secondary, 12.0% for university, and a small proportion 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of Kicukiro District aged 3 and above is 453,368. In Kicukiro District, 7.6% of the population has never attended school, while 3.8% have attended nursery, and 42.6% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 1.0% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 13% for lower secondary, 15.3% for upper secondary, 16.6% for university, and a small proportion less than 1% have not stated their highest level of education attended. The distribution of the highest level of education attended varies among sectors, with differences in the percentage of individuals at each education level. For example, Gahanga has a higher percentage (12.8%) of individuals who have never attended school compared to other sectors, while Kicukiro sector has a higher percentage (21.6%) of individuals attended upper secondary school. Each sector has its own unique distribution of educational levels attended by the population. The table below indicates the findings:

## 2.4 Characteristics of the Employed Population

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Aggregate employment generally increases with growing population. Therefore, the ratio of Employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment-to population ratio is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

### 2.4.1 Employment to population ratio by sex, Province, District and area of residence

The results presented in the below Table 2. 11 shows that the employment to population ratio stood at 45.9 percent in Rwanda, it is lower among females (40.2 percent) than males (52.4 percent). On the other side, it was observed that the employment to population ratio is higher in urban areas of Rwanda (53.5 percent) than in rural areas (42.7 percent). It was observed that in City of Kigali, the employment to population ratio stood at 55.4 percent, it is higher in urban areas (56.6 percent) than in rural areas of City of Kigali (46.1 percent). It was also revealed that the employment to population ratio is 55.7 percent among people residing in Kicukiro district, it is higher in urban areas of Kicukiro (55.8 percent) than in rural areas of Kicukiro (37.7 percent).



### 2.4.2 Employment to population ratio(EPR) among the resident population of Kicukiro aged 16 years and above by age group and sex

Figure 2.1 allows the study of intensity of Employment to population ratio and its variation by sex. The figure reveals the following remarks: The employment to population ratio among males as well as females increases from age group 16-19 to 35-44 and starts decreasing from age group 45-49 to 85 years and above as people starts getting very older and retire. It was observed that in district of Kicukiro, the highest employment to population ratio among males stands at 81.2% and was observed in age group 40 - 44, On the other side the highest employment to population among females is 57.2% and was observed in the age group 45-49. The lowest employment to population ratio among males stands at 9.7% and was observed among males in the age group 80-84, the lowest employment to population ratio among females is 2.3% and was observed among females in the age group 85+.

## CHAPTER 3: SUB-POPULATION

### 3.1 Children Population ( 0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda, as stipulated in Article 3 of the National Law n° 54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child, which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0–17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

#### 3.1.1 Number and share of children in Kicukiro district

At the national level, the children population constitute 44.5% of the total population of 13,246,394 residents. The City of Kigali has 661,643 children with a share of 37.9% of the total resident population. In Kicukiro district, the children constitute 35.8% of the resident population of the district with a percentage of females slightly greater than the males' one (36.8% to 34.8%). At sector level, the children's share is high in Gahanga (42.2%), Masaka (40.3%) and Gatenga (36.4%) and is small in Niboye (25.8%), Kicukiro (27.2%) and Gikondo (28.5%). The table below indicate distribution of children by sector and by sex.

#### 3.1.2 Children with birth registration in Kicukiro District

The results of 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC 2022 indicate that the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 94.3 % at the national level. The birth registration rate in Kicukiro district is 93.8%. The variation by sex is not very significant but the birth registration

in urban areas is high (93.8%) than in rural (89.8 %). The table below illustrates the findings:

### 3.1.3 Birth registration by sector

The results of 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC-2022 indicate that birth registration varies across sectors and areas of residence (urban and rural). Note that Gahanga, Gatenga, Gikondo, Kagarama, Kanombe

Kicukiro, Kigarama, Niboye, Nyarugunga have not rural areas. The higher percentages of birth registrations are found in Niboye (96.6%), Kagarama (96.6%) and Kagarama (96.6%) while the lowest is in Kigarama (92.4%). The percentage of birth registration for males is almost the same as the one for females. The table below provides details.

## 3.2 Youth population in Rwanda

For statistical purposes, the United Nations defines "youth" as those persons between the ages of 15 and 24 years, without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda's

Development, the definition of Youth in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14 -35 years to 16–30 years.

### 3.2.1 The youth population in Kicukiro district

The results of 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC-2022 revealed that the youth population represent 27.14% (3,595,670) of the total population (13,246,394). In Kicukiro district, the youth population was 175,298 which represents 35.6% of the total resident population of the district (491,731). The sector with the highest youth share is Gikondo (40.6%) while Kagarama (39.1%) and Gahanga (30.7) have the lowest share of youth. The table below indicate distribution of youth by sector and by sex.

### 3.2.2 Educational characteristics of youth

Youth who never attended school represent 5.1% of the youth resident population at national level; it represents 3.1% of the total resident population in The City of Kigali and 3.0% of the total resident population of Kicukiro district. The percentage of youth who never attended school varies a lot within sectors of Kicukiro district. The highest percentage was registered in Masaka (4.1%) while the lowest percentages were registered in Kicukiro (1.2%).

### 3.2.3 Highest level of education attended ed by youth in Gasabo District

In Kicukiro district, 31.8% of youth attended only the primary school level, 20.6% attended the lower secondary education, 25.3% attended the upper secondary education, 18.2% attended university and 3.0% have never attended school. The highest level of education attained varies across sectors of the district. The sectors with the highest percentage of youth never attended school are Gahanga (4.8%), Gikondo (4.5%) and Masaka (4.1%). The percentage of youth with university level is high in Niboye (34.5%), Kicukiro (28.1%) and Nyarugunga (25.9%). The sectors with the highest percentages of youth with primary education are Gahanga (43.2%) and Masaka (39.6%). The table below indicates details:

### 3.2.4 Employment to population ratio among youth(16-30)

The Census results showed that In Rwanda the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.3%, it is higher among males than females 44.8% and 36.2 % respectively. It was observed that in the district of Kicukiro, the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 48.5%, it is higher in among males (54.3%) than females (43.0%). The highest employment to population ratio among youth in Kicukiro district was observed in Kagarama (55.3%) and Gikondo (52.2%). The lowest employment to population ratio among youth was observed in Gatenga (42.5%) and Kigarama (47.4%).

### **3.2.5 Status in employment of youth population in Kicukiro district**

In Kicukiro district, the majority of youth aged 16-30 currently employed are employees (82.5%) followed by self-employed (13.9%). The highest percentage of youth employees is found in Nyarugunga (90.8%), while the lowest is in Masaka (72.4%). The biggest share of self-employed youth is found in Masaka (23.8%) while the lowest is in Niboye (7.6%) and Nyarugunga (6.5%).

### **3.2.6 Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Kicukiro District by sex, district, and area of residence.**

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, In Rwanda the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training stood at 39.5 %. It is higher among females (43.8 %) than males (34.9 %).

In City of Kigali, the proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training is 31.2 %, it is lower among males (23.7 %) than females (38.3 %). 2022 census results also revealed that the aforementioned proportion is higher in rural areas of Kigali (42.2 percent) than in urban areas of Kigali (30.1 percent).

The proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among people residing in Kicukiro district stood at 29.2 percent. It is much higher (57.1 percent) among people residing in rural areas of Kicukiro district than the ones residing in urban areas of Kicukiro district (29 percent). The table below (Table 2.10) indicates results on Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in City of Kigali by Sex, District, and Area of Residence.

### 3.3 Persons with disabilities

In 2015, 193 countries agreed to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals with a commitment where possible, “to disaggregate the statistics they generate by disability to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities (PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programmes, or are included in the workforce. At the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 years and above have a disability while in Kicukiro district, the disability prevalence rate is 2.1%. At sector level, the highest prevalence rates of the resident population aged 5 years and above with disability are in Gahanga (2.3%), Nyarugunga (2.5%), Gatenga (2.2%) and Masaka (2.2% each).

Regarding the prevalence of disability among the population age 5 years and above by type of disability, 1.4% have a disability of not seeing, 1.1% have a disability of walking. ### **3.4 Elderly Population(60 years and above)**

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person.

It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action programme, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programmes on ageing. This was done to guarantee economic and social security to older people and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

#### **3.4.1 Elderly population of Kicukiro district by Sector**

In 2022, the elderly persons constitute 2.9 % of the total resident population of Kicukiro district. The share of the elderly females (3.3%) is higher than the male's one (2.5%). By sector, Niboye (4.1%) and Kicukiro (3.7%) have the highest share of elderly among their total population while Gahanga (2.2%), Gatenga (2.5%) and Kanombe (2.6%) have the lowest number of people with disabilities.

### 3.4.2 Employment among elderly people

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.2%. The aforementioned share is higher among the elderly males (38.3%) than elderly females (15.0%). In Kicukiro district, 25.2% of elderly people were employed. The percentage of employed elderly people is higher among males than females (38.3% vs. 15.0%). Employment among elderly residents is high in Kicukiro (31.1%) and Kagarama (31.0%). It is low in Kanombe sector (21.3%) and in Nyarugunga (22.2%).

### 3.4.3 Marital status of elderly people

In Kicukiro district, more than half of the elderly population (63.2%) were married and 30% were widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly was 4.5% while divorce or separation rate is 2.5%. Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector of residence. Marriage among elderly people is more important in Niboye (67%) and Nyarugunga (65.8%) sectors. widowhood is widespread in Gahanga (33.9%) and Masaka (32.5% each) and lowest in Niboye (25%), Nyarugunga (25.5%) and Kicukiro (27.3%) sectors. The table below illustrates distribution of elderly people across sectors.

## CHAPTER 4: HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

### 4.1 Household characteristics

In this chapter, the 5<sup>th</sup> Population and Housing Census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, head of household by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and cooking, water sources, sanitation facilities, asset possessed by household and mode of waste and disposals.

#### 4.1.1 Number and mean size of the private households

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the total of 3,312,743 private households in Rwanda and, 448,868 in the City of Kigali and 135,463 in Kicukiro district.

The average household size in Kicukiro district is 3.6 persons per household. At the Sector level, the highest sizes are found in Kagarama and Nyarugunga (3.9 persons/household respectively). The smallest household sizes are found in Kicukiro (3.1 persons/household). The table below indicates number of households and size of household members per sector.

## 4.1.2 Private households' heads of Kicukiro District

The results of 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC 2022 revealed that nationally 28.9% of private households are headed by women. In Kicukiro district, private households headed by females are 23.7%. At sector level, the highest percentages of households headed by women are found in Gikondo sector (28.9%), Kicukiro sector (28.6%) while the lowest is found in Gahanga sector (21.0%).

## 4.2 Housing Characteristics

### 4.2.1 Type of habitat

The results of 5<sup>th</sup> Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that in the City of Kigali the predominant type of habitat is Modern planned urban housing (42.4%) and Spontaneous/squatter housing (40.1%). It is in the same as in Kicukiro district as one of districts of the city of Kigali. The most common type of habitat in Kicukiro district is modern planned urban housing (61.8%) followed by spontaneous/squatter housing (28.4%). The type of habitat varies across sectors. Modern planned urban housing is most prevalent in Niboye (81.3%), Nyarugunga (80.1%); Kanombe (71.3%) and Masaka (70.2%) and the highest spontaneous/squatter housing are observed in Gikondo (75.1%). The sectors with the lower percentages of Modern planned urban housing are in Gikondo (21.9%) and Gahanga (42.6%). The table below displays results by sector.



By area of residence, the predominant types are modern planned urban housing (62.4%) and spontaneous/squatter housing (28.7%) in urban areas. In rural areas, the predominant type is umudugudu/Planned rural settlement (87.1%) and dispersed/isolated housing (6.2%). The figures below indicate details:

#### 4.2.2 Tenure of the housing

The results of 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC 2022 indicate that the ownership of housing in the City of Kigali represents 34.1% and tenant represent 61.3%. In Kicukiro district, 64.1% of housing units are occupied by tenants while 31.0% are occupied by their owners. Regarding the area of residence, the owner of housing units represents 30.5% in urban and 76.2% in rural areas while tenants represent 64.5% in urban and 16.1% in rural areas. At the sector level, the percentage of owners of households' units is high in Masaka (40.7%) and Gahanga (36.4%) and owners of households' units is low in Kicukiro (19.6%) and Gikondo (22.8%). The percentage of tenants of housing units is high in Kicukiro (74.7%) and Gikondo (72.1%) and low in Masaka (51.3%) and Gahanga (59.2%). The table below indicate details:



According to the area of residence, 3 types of tenure of housing units (owners, tenants, and free lodging) predominate in urban area as well as in rural area. The percentage of owners of housing units is 30.5% in urban areas to 76.2% in rural areas and the percentage of tenants of housing units is 64.5 % in urban areas to 16.1% in rural areas. ## 4.2.3 Material of the housing units

### 4.2.3.1 Main materials of the roof

The results of 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets in Rwanda (74.1%), in the City of Kigali, the Iron sheet represent (98.8%). In Kicukiro district, housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets (98.5%). Regarding areas of residence, iron sheets represent 98.8% in the urban and 98.1% in rural areas. Only 0.6% are covered by industrial tiles, 0.2% by local tiles and 0.2% by concrete. The variation by sector is not very significant. The high percentages of housing units covered by iron sheets are found in both Gahanga and Gatenga (99.4%). The lowest is Kagarama with 96.0% and Niboye (97.1%) of housing units covered by iron sheets. The table below displays details:




According to the area of residence, the predominant roofing materials are the iron sheets in both urban areas (98.1%) and rural areas (98.8%) The percentage of housing units covered by local tiles is 1.8% in rural areas while it is 0.2 in urban areas. Housing units covered by Others type of roofing materials (Industrial tiles, Asbestos, Concrete, all non-durable roofing materials, and Grass) represent 1% in urban and 0.2% in rural areas. #### 4.2.3.2 Main materials of the walls

The results of the census show that the most materials of the walls of the housing units are sundried bricks with cement: 36.3% in Rwanda, 59.8% in the City of Kigali and 62.7% in Kicukiro district. Sundried bricks with cement in urban area represents (62.8%), and it represents (57.4%) in rural area. The second most materials of the walls of the housing units in Kicukiro district are burnt bricks with cement (11.3%). At the sector level, sun dried bricks with cement are the mostly used materials in Kicukiro sector (71.7%) and Gahanga sector (68.6%).The table below displays details:



According to the area of residence in Kicukiro district, the main materials used for walls of the housing units are mostly sun-dried bricks with cement (62.8%) in urban area followed by burnt bricks with cement (11.4%). In the rural area of Kicukiro district, the main materials used for walls of the housing units are also mostly sun-dried bricks with cement (57.4%) followed by sun dried bricks without cement (38.8%). Other types of wall materials (Wood with mud without cement, all non-durable wall materials, Concrete, Stones with cement, Stones without cement, Timber, burnt bricks without cement) represent 4.9% in urban areas and 0.8% in rural areas. #### 4.2.3.3 Main materials of the floor

The results 5RPHC 2022 indicate that the main material of the floor of the housing units is cement (31.2%) countrywide. In the city of Kigali, cement is the main material of the floor of the housing units (63.1%). In Kicukiro district, the main material of the floor of the housing units is cement (62.7%) followed by Ceramic/clays/Granite tiles (22.0%). At sector level, the cement as main material used for the floor is most found in Gatenga (71.8%), and Kicukiro sector (71.1%). The highest percentage of the housing units with Ceramic/clays/Granite tiles as main material used for the floor is found in Kagarama (48.7%) and Nyarugunga (42.7%). 


By area of residence, the results of census indicate that the predominant materials used for the floor of the housing units, the materials are cement (62.7%) followed by ceramic/clay/granite tiles (22.0%) and earth (13.3%) and other materials used for floor (Dung hardened, Concrete, Stones, burnt bricks, Wooden floor) represent 1.2 % in urban areas. In rural areas, the predominant materials are earth (67.4%) and cement (31.9%). The figure below provides details:

### 4.3. Source of energy of the private households

#### 4.3.1 Grid line connectivity in Kicukiro district

At national level, the results of the census indicate that, nationally 52.5% of private households are connected to the Grid line while 47.2% are not connected. About 88.8% of households in the City of Kigali are connected to grid line. The Grid line in Kicukiro district represents 92.2%. The Grid line in urban area of Kicukiro represents 92.9 and 17.5% in rural area. At sector level, Niboye sector is the sector that has high grid line (99.2%) and the sectors that has a least connected grid line is Gahanga (87.1%). The table below indicates details:



#### 4.3.2 Main source of energy for lighting in Kicukiro district

In Kicukiro district, the main source of energy for lighting used by households is electricity (92.2%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using electricity for lighting is high in Niboye (99.2% each), The sectors with the low percentages of private households using electricity are Masaka (82.8%). The Flashlight/Phone Flashlight was mostly used in rural area of Kicukiro district (42.6%). The table below illustrates details:



According to the area of residence, the main source of energy for lighting is electricity (93.4%), candle (3.1%), Flashlight/phone flashlight (2.8%) and others (Lantern, Kerosene/Paraffin lamp, Firewood; Batteries/Bulb; Rechargeable Batteries; Biogas) represent 0.7% in urban area. In rural areas, of private households use electricity (43.2%) and flashlights (42.6%) as main source of energy for lighting. The figure provides details:

### 4.3.3 Main sources of energy for cooking in Kicukiro district

In Kicukiro District, the main sources of energy for cooking used by the private households are charcoal (57.4%) followed by Gas (26.2%) and firewood (13.6%). At the sector level, Charcoal is the most used source of cooking energy by private households in Gatenga (66.9%) and Kigarama (64.8%). The gas as main source of cooking is predominantly in Niboye (58.1%), Kagarama (50.5%). Regarding areas of residence, firewood is predominantly in rural areas (92.1%), Charcoal and gas is predominantly in urban areas (57.9% and 26.1% respectively). The table below illustrates details:



### 4.3.4 Water and sanitation of the private households in Kicukiro district

#### 4.3.4.1 Main source of drinking water

The results of 5RPHC 2022 reveal that improved water sources is the most water sources in Rwanda that represent (82.3%). In Kicukiro district, 99.1% of private households use improved water sources. At the sector level, the percentage of the private households using water from improved sources is highest in Nyarugunga (99.9%), Gikondo, Kigarama, and Kagarama (99.8%) each, and the lowest in Gahanga and Masaka (98.2%) each. 


**Figure 4. 9 Percentage of the private households of Kicukiro District by main source of water and by Sector**

#### 4.3.4.2 Main type of toilet facility

The results of census reveal that the main types of toilet facility used by the private households in Rwanda are "Not shared Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab" (68.8%). In Kicukiro district, the main types of toilet facility used by the private households are " Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by several HHs " (45.5%), " Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one HH " (29.0%) and " Flush toilet used by one Household " (20.5%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using " Flush toilet used by one Household " is high in Kagarama (47.5%) and Niboye (44.4%) while it is low in Gahanga (6.4%) and Masaka (11.9%). " Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by several HHs" are mainly and the high percentages of households using this type are found in Gatenga (59.5%) and

Kigarama (57.2%). The table below indicates the types of toilets facilities.



According to the area of residence in Kicukiro district, the type of toilet facility used by the private households varies. In urban areas, the types of toilets most used are "Shared pit latrine with constructed floor slab with several households" (45.8%) and "pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by one household" (28.5%) followed by "Flush toilets not shared" (20.7%).

In rural areas, the main types of toilets used are not shared pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by one household (84.5%) and shared pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households (11.1%). The figure below indicates details:

#### 4.3.4.3 Mode of waste disposal in Kicukiro district

The results of the census reveal that, in Kicukiro district, the high percentage of households (58%) evacuate their waste through the waste collection companies while 25.1% of private households evacuate their waste in the household's fields and 15.1% in the compost dumping. At the Sector level, the high percentages of households evacuating their waste through the waste collection companies are in Kicukiro sector (94.6%), Niboye (93.8%). The household's fields as main mode of waste disposal is the most used Gahanga (43.5%) and Masaka (27.1%). The high percentages of households using household compost dumping are in Masaka (34.1%) and Gahanga (26.3%). The table below indicates details:



The results of the census indicate the main modes of waste disposal used by the households vary also by area of residence. In urban areas, domestic waste is mainly collected and evacuated by companies (58.5%). Other private households evacuate their domestic waste in the household's fields or in the bushes (21.7%) or in the household compost dumping (14.6%). In rural areas, the households evacuate their waste mainly by the household's compost dumping (66.9%) and others in their fields or in the bushes (30.0%). The figure below illustrates details:

#### **4.4 Assets possessed by private households in Kicukiro district**

##### **4.4.1 Communication assets possessed by private households in Kicukiro District**

At the district level, 95.6% of private households possess a radio, 94.3% a mobile phone, 58.9% a smartphone, 41.9% a TV and 22.5% a computer. The percentage of private households possessing a radio is high in Niboye (98.8%) and Nyarugunga (98.3%). It is low in Gahanga (91.9%). The percentage of private households possessing a television is high in Nyarugunga (60.2%) and Niboye (57.5%) while it is low in Gahanga (27.6%) and Masaka (32.2%).

The mobile phones are possessed at the extent range of (89.7% to 98.1), Mobile phone is mostly possessed by private households of Niboye (98.1%) and Nyarugunga (97%). The extent of possession of smartphone is ranging between (37.8% to 83.8%).

The sectors with the highest percentage of households with smartphone are Niboye (83.8%) and Nyarugunga (80.2%). The computer is mostly possessed in Kagarama (45.0%) and Niboye (44.5%). The table below provides details:

#### 4.4.2 Access to the Internet

The results of the 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC-2022 indicate that the percentages of households with at least one member using internet are 22.2% at national level while they are 53.4% in The City of Kigali and 60.8% in Kicukiro district.

At sector level, the high percentage of households with at least one member using internet is high in Niboye (84.8%) and Nyarugunga (81.1%). The sectors with the lower percentages of households with at least one member using internet are Gahanga (40.1%) and Masaka (47.0%).



## CHAPTER 5: AGRICULTURE IN KICUKIRO DISTRICT

The agriculture was the one of the areas of investigation of the 5<sup>th</sup> Rwanda Population and housing census conducted in 2022. The households engaged in Livestock husbandry; the number of private crop farming households cultivating different types of crops, by Sector, the number of private households raising different types of livestock, by Sector and type of household raised in district were captured in the census.

### 5.1 The households engaged in crop farming and livestock husbandly

The results of 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC 2022 revealed that nationally, 2,280,854 of private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture, among them 62.6% are engaged in crop farming and 50.4% are engaged in Livestock husbandry.

Kicukiro district is the one of districts of the city of Kigali where crop farming and animal husbandly are on small scale. In Kicukiro district, Agricultural households occupy (17.7%) with 12.1% of households engaged in crop farming and 11.1% Households engaged in Livestock husbandry. Kicukiro district has sectors located in rural areas where the agriculture activities are applied, Gahanga sector has a slightly proportion of Households engaged in crop farming (24.3%) and Households engaged in Livestock husbandry (20.3%). The table below provides details:

## 5.2 Distribution of private household engaged in crop farming of different types of crops, by Sector

The results of 5<sup>th</sup> Population and housing census 2022 indicate that the most cultivated crops by the private households of Kicukiro district are beans (12,409 hhs), maize (8,249 hhs), fruits (8,943hhs) and cassava (7,023 hhs). Those households that apply agriculture activities are found in the rural areas of Kicukiro districts in the following sectors: Gahanga, Kanombe and Masaka.
