





FOREWORD

The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.

Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. They include Ministries and other Government institutions, international organizations such as the World Bank (WB), the European Union (EU), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), One-UN, UN Women, UNICEF, UNECA, the United Kingdom AID (UKAID), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the USAID, Enabel, PARIS 21 and others for their support in diverse ways.

My special thanks go to the local government leaders from the province to the village levels who contributed a lot to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. 

CHAPTER 1: POPULATION SIZE, SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION, AND STRUCTURE

1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the population

1.1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Kigali City

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 1,745,555 residents in the City of Kigali, which represents 13.17% of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394 residents). The population of the City of Kigali is predominantly male; 888,882 are men corresponding to 50.9 % of the total population of the City of Kigali. Gasabo is the most populated district with 879,505 residents in 2022. Its population represents 50.4% of the total residents' population of Kigali City. The least populated district in the City of Kigali is Nyarugenge with 374,319 inhabitants, corresponding to 21.4% of the total resident population of Kigali City.



1.1.2 Population Density of the City of Kigali by District

Population density is a measurement of population per unit land area. Density is the number of the inhabitant per Km². The Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022 revealed that the population density in Rwanda is 503 inhabitants per Km². The City of Kigali has 2401 inhabitant per Km². The district with a high population density is Kicukiro with 2,944 Inhabitants per km². The district with a lowest population density is Gasabo with 2,056 Inhabitants per km². The figure below indicates distribution of population density per district.


Figure 1. 2 Population density (inhabitant per Km2) by District in Kigali City

1.1.3 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of the Gasabo district

The results in previous Table 1. 1 Resident population distribution of the City of Kigali by sex and District indicates that 879,505 residents were enumerated in Gasabo district, and the population share is 50.4% of the total population of Kigali City. The population of Gasabo district is predominantly male: 443,987 are men corresponding to 50.5 % of its total population. The Table 1. 2 below indicates the number of the population of Gasabo district by sector, by sex, the percentage of female and their shares across sectors to the total population of Gasabo district. Females are predominant in seven out of 15 sectors of the district: Rutunga (51.6%), Gikomero (51.3%), Jali (50.7%), Nduba (50.9%), Jabana (50.5%), Bumbogo and Rusororo (50.1% respectively). Kinyinya (125,400 residents), Bumbogo (112,899 residents) and Ndera (95,164 residents) are the most populated sectors. They represent respectively 14.2%; 12.8% and 10.8% of the total population of Gasabo district. The two less populated sectors are Kimihurura (16,425 inhabitants) and Gikomero (19,630 inhabitants). They represent 1.9% and 2.2% of the total resident population of Gasabo district, respectively.

1.1.4 Size and Spatial distribution of the Population of Gasabo district by residence area

The results of Rwanda Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that, the total population of Rwanda is predominantly distributed in rural area that represent 72.1% and urban area represent 27.9%. The City of Kigali is predominantly urban area (86.9%) and rural area is only (13.1%). Gasabo district population lives predominantly in urban area (81.2%) while resident population in rural represents 18.8%. The sectors of Gasabo district which are entirely urban are Gatsata, Gisozi, Kacyiru, Kimihurura, Kimironko Remera and Kinyinya while Gikomero and Rutunga are entirely rural. The Table 1. 3 below illustrates the results.

1.1.5 Age-Sex Structure of the Population of Gasabo district



1.1.6 Population share of some specific interventions target groups in Gasabo District by sex

The Rwanda population and housing census 2022 indicates the population on specific ages-based programs, policy and strategies interventions in health, education, employment and also indicates the population categories in their respective characteristics such as children, youth, working population, among other things. For instance, children under five years for immunization programs (Under 5 years children), children in school age (3-17 years), people in the official working age group (16 years and above), etc. Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The below table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Gasabo district. The population aged 0-17 represents 39.5 % of the total population of the district, 16-30 years represent 32.2%; the working age population 16 and above represents 64.4 % of the same population. The table below shows distribution of Gasabo district by targeted interventions by their age.

CHAPTER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

2.1 Socio-cultural characteristics of the population

2.1.1 Nationality of the population of Gasabo district

The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the Rwandan population represents 99.11% and foreigners represent 0.89% at national level. In the City of Kigali, foreigners represent 1.18% and 1.2% in Gasabo district that is to say 10,529 residents' foreigners. Four sectors of Gasabo districts that have the highest percentage of foreigners compared to others are Kimironko (3.46%), Remera (3.33%), Kimihurura (3.18%), and Kacyiru (3.06%). The table below illustrates the distribution of the population by nationality with their respective sectors of residence.

2.1.2 Religious affiliation of the resident population of Gasabo District

In Gasabo district, Christianity is the predominant religion: 36.12% are catholic, 29.4% are ADEPR, 9.2 % are protestant, 9.3% are Adventists and 6.4 are other Christians. Muslims are (2.3%), other religion and Jehovah witness are (2.63 % and 1.1% respectively) while 3.56% of the resident population declared themselves to be without religion. 2.2 Marital Status of the resident population of Gasabo district

2.2.1 Marital status by sector

The results of 5RPHC-2022 revealed that 47.8% of the resident population of Gasabo district aged 12 and above were living in union (married officially to one wife/husband, married not officially to one wife/husband, live in polygamous union) at the time of the census, 48.1% were never married, 2.3% were widowed while 1.4% separated and 0.3% divorced. At the sector level, 3 sectors have the highest percentages of the currently married people: Nduba (55.8%), Bumbogo (55.6%) and Gikomero (50.4%) while the highest percentages of the never married persons are found in Kacyiru (63.1%) and Kimihurura (61.8). Rutunga and Gikomero sectors have high percentage of widowed persons (5.2% and 4.0% respectively). Details of the resident population of Gasabo district aged 12 years and above by marital status and sex are presented in the annex.

2.2.2 Marital status by Age groups

The percentages of resident population of Gasabo district by marital status vary by age: The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.8% (age group of 12-14 years) to 2.8% (age group of 80 years and above). The percentage of persons currently living in union starts by increasing from 0.2% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 84.4% (age group of 40-44 years) before decreasing to 46.2% (age group 80+) due mainly to widowhood (50.2%). The highest percentages of divorced persons are observed within the age groups 45-49 (1.1%) and 50-54 (1.2%) while the highest percentages of the separated persons is found in the age group 45-49 years (3.0%) and the age group 40-44 years (2.9%).

2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population of Gasabo district

2.3.1 School attendance

Table 2. 5 below shows that, in Gasabo district, 49% of pre-primary-age population (3-5 years) are currently attending school, 51% of those children have never attended and none (0%) of those children have previously attended (i.e children who have already had prior exposure to pre-primary school education before the time of census but who were not attending nursery school/dropped-out during census time). Kimironko Sector has the highest proportion of children (age between 3 to 5) currently attending school in Gasabo District (65.1%). Following closely, the Kacyiru Sector has a percentage of 63.6 % of children currently attending school. Rutunga sector has the lowest percentage of children currently attending school, with only 39.4% enrolled. On the other hand, Rutunga and Nduba sectors have the highest proportion of children aged 3 to 5 who have never attended school (60.7 and 59.3%, respectively).

Table 2. 6 shows that in Gasabo District 90.5% of children aged 6 to 11 years (the official primary school-going age) are currently attending school, 8.1% have never attended school and only 1.3% have previously attended school (which means that 9.4 of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school).

By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) across sectors in Gasabo District, comparisons reveal the disparities in primary school attendance across different sectors within Gasabo District. Sectors like Rutunga, Ndera and Jali exhibit

lower rates of children currently attending school (86.9, 87.6 against 88.1%, respectively) and higher rates of children who have never attended (11.2, 10.4 against 10.5%, respectively). On the other hand, sectors like Kacyiru and Kimihurura demonstrate higher rates of children currently attending school (96.2 against 94.8%, respectively) and lower rates of children who have never attended (2.9 against 1.8%, respectively).

In Gasabo District 22.0% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school (i.e. they dropped out of school), 75.2% are currently attending school and 2.8% have never attended secondary school.

The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) across sectors in Gasabo District, shows that Kimihurura sector has the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school at 82.4%. Conversely, Rutunga sector has the lowest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school with 71.1%. Rutunga Sector also has the highest percentage of the population between the ages of 12 and 17 who have never attended school at 3.7%.

2.3.2. Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Primary School in Gasabo District

Gross and Net Attendance Ratios are used to measure the extent of coverage of an educational program. It gives a comparison of the children attending school with the total size of the school-age population. It can also be used for assessing how far a country has succeeded in bringing to school all those who are eligible to attend.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years). The gross attendance rate in Rwanda is 141.7, in the City of Kigali GAR is 132.5 and 131.8 in Gasabo district. The Net Attendance Rate (NAR) in Primary school for Gasabo district (90.4%) is below the NAR of the City of Kigali (91.4%) and NAR of Gasabo higher than the NAR of national level (89.3%).

A Gross Attendance Rate (GAR) of 131.8% in Gasabo District for the population 6 to 11 years indicates a high percentage of those who attended primary schools aged below 6 years and or above 11 years. On the other hand, the NAR of 90.4% for the population 6 to 11 years indicates that only 90.4% of the population 6 to 11 years were attending primary schools in Gasabo District by 2022 (Table 2.8). In 2022, students older or younger than the official primary school age range made up 31.4% $[(GAR131.8 - NAR90.4)/GAR131.8]$ of the primary school population of Gasabo District.

With a NAR of 95.9%, the Kacyiru Sector has the greatest percentage of pupils that are attending primary school and are of primary school-age. In comparison to other sectors, the Rutunga sector has the lowest NAR at 86.8%, indicating a lesser percentage of pupils who are attending primary school within the eligible age range. Al most all sectors have gender parity indexes greater than 1.00 except Kimironko sector (1.00), suggesting better access to education for female students compared to male students.

2.3.3 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Secondary School

The table 2. 9 provides information on the gross and net attendance rates in the secondary school level (12-17 years) in Gasabo District, disaggregated by sex and sector. The City of Kigali and Gasabo District both have higher NARs than the national average (35.2% and 31.9%, respectively, versus 22.3%) when compared to the national average. Comparing males and females in Gasabo District in terms of Net Attendance Rates (NAR), the table 2. 9 indicates that a higher proportion of females (33.9%) in Gasabo District, within the secondary school-age range (12-17 years), are attending school compared to males (29.9%). Female students older or younger than the official secondary school age range made up 39.8 % $[(GAR56.0 - NAR33.7) / GAR56.0]$ of the female with secondary school age of Gasabo District, while for male students it made up 45.2 % $[(GAR54.6 - NAR29.9) / GAR54.6]$. This shows that females have a higher attendance rate in Gasabo District compared to males when considering the overall attendance rates, regardless of age or grade-level eligibility.

Among the sectors in Gasabo District, Kacyiru and Kimihurura have the highest GAR for both sexes, with a rate of 93%. Sectors such as Rutunga, Gikomero, and Nduba have relatively lower GAR compared to others (31.2%, 34.8% and 36.3% respectively). Kimironko has the highest NAR for both sexes in Gasabo District, with a rate of 51.9%. Sectors like Rutunga, Nduba, and Gikomero have relatively lower (less than 25%) NAR compared to others (20.7%, 20.9% and 21.4% respectively).

2.3.4 Highest level of school attended in Gasabo district

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate the total population of Rwanda aged 3 and above is 11,999,691. The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary, University, and Not stated. In Rwanda, 16.7% of the population aged 3 years and above has never attended school, while 2.7% have attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, 7.1% for upper secondary, 3.6% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of the City of Kigali aged 3 and above is 1,603,405. The distribution of the highest level of education attended is like the national level, with slight variations. In the City of Kigali, 9.6% of the population has never attended school, while 3.4% have attended nursery, and 46.8% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 1.1% for

INGOBOKA/Vocational, 12.8% for lower secondary, 14.2% for upper secondary, 12.0% for university, and a small proportion 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of Gasabo District aged 3 and above is 805,159. In Gasabo District, 10.8% of the population has never attended school, while 3.5% have attended nursery, and 48.6% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 1.1% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 12.2% for lower secondary, 13.1% for upper secondary, 10.7% for university, and a small proportion less than 1% have not stated their highest level of education attended. The distribution of the highest level of education attended varies among sectors, with differences in the percentage of individuals at each education level. For example, Rutunga has a higher percentage (18.2%) of individuals who have never attended school compared to other sectors, while Kacyiru has a higher percentage (20.4%) of individuals attended upper secondary school. Each sector has its own unique distribution of educational levels attended by the population. The table below indicates the findings:

2.4 Characteristics of the Employed Population in Gasabo District

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Aggregate employment generally increases with growing population. Therefore, the ratio of Employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment-to population ratio is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

2.4.1 Employment to population ratio by sex, Province, District and area of residence

The results presented in the below Table 2. 11 shows that the employment to population ratio stood at 45.9% in Rwanda, it is lower among females (40.2 %) than males (52.4 %). On the other side, it was observed that the employment to population ratio is higher in urban areas of Rwanda (53.5%) than in rural areas (42.7%).

It was observed that in the City of Kigali, the employment to population ratio stood at 55.4 percent, it is higher in urban areas (56.6%) than in rural areas of City of Kigali (46.1%).

It was also revealed that the employment to population ratio is 55.0 percent among people residing in Gasabo districts, it is higher in urban areas of Gasabo (57.0 %) than in rural areas of Gasabo (44.7%).



2.4.2 Employment to population ratio(EPR) among the resident population of Gasabo aged 16 years and above by age group and sex

Figure 2. 1 allows the study of intensity of Employment to population ratio and its variation by sex. The figure reveals the following remarks: The employment to population ratio among males as well as females increases from age group 16-19 to 35-44 and starts decreasing from age group 45-49 to 85 years and above as people starts getting very older and retire. It was observed that in district of Gasabo, the highest employment to population ratio among males stands at 78.9% and was observed in age group 35-39, On the other side the highest employment to population among females is 53.8% and was observed in the age group 40-44. The lowest employment to population ratio among males stands at 10.2% and was observed among males in the age group 80-84, the lowest employment to population ratio among females is 3.1% and was observed among females in the age group 85+.

CHAPTER 3: SUB-POPULATION

3.1 Children Population (0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda, as stipulated in Article 3 of the National Law n° 54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child, which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0–17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

3.1.1 Number and share of children in Gasabo district

At the national level, the children population constitute 44.5% of the total population of 13,246,394 residents. The City of Kigali has 661,643 children with a share of 37.9% of the total resident population. In Gasabo District, the children constitute 39.5% of the resident population of the district with a percentage of females slightly greater than the males' one (40.3% to 38.7%). At sector level, the children's share is high in Rutunga (48.0%), Gikomero (46.9%) and Nduba (46.4%) and is small in Kacyiru (27.5%), Kimihurura (28.0%) and Kimironko (28.6%). The table below indicate distribution of children by sector and by sex.

3.1.2 Children with birth registration in Gasabo District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 94.3% at the national level. The birth registration rate in Gasabo district is 92.4%. The variation by sex is not very significant but the birth registration in rural areas is high (94.2%) than in urban (91.9%). The table below illustrates the findings:

3.1.3 Birth registration by sector

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that birth registration varies across sectors and areas of residence (urban and rural). Note that Gikomero and Rutunga sectors have not urban areas while Kacyiru, Gatsata, Kimihurura, Kimironko, Kinyinya and Remera have not rural areas.

The higher percentages of birth registrations are found in Gikomero (96.1%), Rutunga (96.0%) and Jabana and Kimironko (95.4% each) while the lowest is in Kinyinya (88.8%). The percentage of birth registration for males is almost the same as the one for females.

3.2 Youth population in Rwanda

For statistical purposes, the United Nations defines "youth" as those persons between the ages of 15 and 24 years, without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda's Development, the definition of Youth in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14 -35 years to 16–30 years.

3.2.1 The youth population in Gasabo district

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 revealed that the youth population represent 27.14% (3,595,670) of the total population (13,246,394). In Gasabo district, the youth population was 282,898 which represents 32.2% of the total resident population of the district (879,505). The sector with the highest youth share is Kacyiru (41.4%) while Rutunga (23.1%) and Gikomero (24.3%) have the lowest share of youth. The table below indicate distribution of youth by sector and by sex.

3.2.2 Educational characteristics of youth

Youth who never attended school represent 5.1% of the youth resident population at national level; it represents 3.1% of the total youth resident population in Kigali City and 3.4% of the total youth resident population of Gasabo district. The percentage of youth who never attended school varies a lot within sectors of Gasabo district. The highest percentage was registered in Rutunga (5.1%) while the lowest percentages were registered in Kacyiru (1.5%), Kimihurura and Remera (1.7% each). The table below presents details on the distribution of the youth population of Gasabo District by school attendance status.

3.2.3 Highest level of education attended by youth in Gasabo District

In Gasabo district, 37.9% of youth attended only the primary school level, 21.9 % attained the lower secondary education, 23.1% attended the upper secondary education, 12.7% attained university and 3.4% have never attended school.

The highest level of education attended varies across sectors of the district. The sectors with the highest percentage of youth never attended school are Rutunga (5.1%), Ndera (4.4%) and Bumbogo (4.3%). The percentage of youth with university level is high in Kacyiru (30.3%), Kimihurura (27.6%) and Kimironko (26.1%). The sectors with the highest percentages of youth with primary education are Gikomero (58.4%) and Rutunga (57.7%). The table below indicates details:

3.2.4 Employment to population ratio among youth(16-30).

The Census results showed that in Rwanda the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.3%, it is higher among males than females 44.8% and 36.2 % respectively. It was observed that in the district of Gasabo, the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 48.5%, it is higher in among males (56.3%) than females (41.2%)

The highest employment to population ratio among youth in Gasabo district was observed in Kacyiru sector (52.7%), Remera (52.7%) and kimihurura (52.5%), the lowest employment to population ratio among youth was observed in Gikomero (26.7%), Jali (38.4%) and Rutunga (39.8%).

3.2.5 Status in employment of youth population in Gasabo district

In Gasabo district, most of the youth aged 16-30 currently employed are employees (78.6%) followed by own account worker without regular employees (17.1%). The highest percentage of youth employees is found in Kimihurura sector (89.4%) while the lowest is in Gikomero (59.0%). The highest percentage of currently employed population who worked as own account worker without regular employees among youth is found in Gikomero sector (36.6%) and in Jali sector (28.4%) while the lowest is observed in Kimihurura sector(8.0%), in Kimironko setor(9.3%) and in Kacyiru sector (10.7%).

3.2.6 Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Gasabo District by sex, district, and area of residence.

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, In Rwanda the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training stood at 39.5 %. It is higher among females (43.8 %) than males (34.9 %).

In the City of Kigali, the proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training is 31.2 %, it is lower among males (23.7 %) than females (38.3 %). 2022 census results also revealed that the aforementioned proportion is higher in rural areas of the City of Kigali (42.2 %) than in urban areas of the City of Kigali (30.1 percent).

The proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among people residing in Gasabo district stood at 32.8%. It is much higher (43.7%) among people residing in rural areas of Gasabo district than the ones residing in urban areas of Gasabo district (31.0 %). The table below (Table 3. 9) indicates results on Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Gasabo District by Sex, Sector, and Area of Residence.

3.3 Persons with disabilities

In 2015, 193 countries agreed to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals with a commitment where possible, “to disaggregate the statistics they generate by disability to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities (PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programmes, or are included in the workforce. At the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 years and above have a disability while in Gasabo district, the disability prevalence rate is 2.3%. At sector level, the highest prevalence rates of the resident population aged 5 years and above with disability are in Gikomero (4.4%), Nduba (3.2%), Rusororo (3.1%) and Jali and Rutunga (3.0% each). The lowest is in Remera and Gisozi (1.6% each).

Regarding the prevalence of disability among the population age 5 years and above by type of disability, 1.4% have a disability of not seeing, 1.1% have a disability of walking. All the remaining type of disabilities (Hearing, communicating, Remembering or concentrating, self care, short stature and albinism their respective prevalence is under 1%). The table below indicates that in Gasabo District the prevalence of disability of seeing is at 1.1 %. All the remaining disabilities have a prevalence below 1%.

3.4 Elderly Population(60 years and above)

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through

an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person.

It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action programme, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programmes on ageing. This was done to guarantee economic and social security to older people and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

3.4.1 Elderly population of Gasabo district by Sector

In 2022, the elderly persons constitute 3.2% of the total resident population of Gasabo district. The share of the elderly females (3.7%) is higher than the male's one (2.7%), reflecting the higher life expectancy for women. By sector, Rutunga (7.1%) and Gikomero (6.9%) have the highest share of elderly among their total population while Gisozi and Kinyinya have the lowest (1.9% each).

3.4.2 Employment among elderly people

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.2%. The aforementioned share is higher among the elderly males (33.7%) than elderly females (24.3%).

In Gasabo district, 28.2 % of elderly people were employed. The percentage of employed elderly people is higher among males than females (39.1% vs. 19.9%).

Employment among elderly residents is high in Kimihurura sector (36.1%) and Remera (33.8%). It is low in Gikomero sector (18.7%) and in Jali sector (22.9%).

3.4.3 Marital status of elderly people

In Gasabo district, more than half of the elderly population (64.4%) were living in union (Married to one wife/husband officially, Married to one wife/ husband not officially, Live in a polygamous union) and 29.4% were widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly was 3.7% while divorce or separation rate is 2.7%. Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector of residence. Marriage among elderly people is more important in Kimironko (61.8%) and Remera sector (61.6%) sectors. widowhood is widespread in Rusororo sector (34%) and Rutungu sector (32.7% each) and lowest in Kimihurura (20.2%) and Remera (21.8%) sectors. The table below illustrates distribution of elderly people across sectors.

CHAPTER 4: HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

4.1 Household characteristics

In this chapter, the 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, households' heads by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and cooking, water sources, sanitation facilities, asset possessed by household and mode of waste and disposals.

4.1.1 Number and mean size of the private households

The results of the 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the total of 3,312,743 private households in Rwanda. In the City of Kigali, they are 448,868 and 249,420 in Gasabo District.

The average household size in Gasabo District is 3.5 persons per household. At the Sector level, the highest sizes are found in Gikomero (4.1 persons/household) and Rutunga (4.0 persons/household). The smallest household sizes are found in Kimihurura and Remera (3.1 persons/household each) and in Kacyiru (3.2 persons/household).

The table below indicates number of households and size of household members per sector.

4.1.2 Private households' heads of Gasabo District

The results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 28.9% of private households are headed by women at national level. In Gasabo district, private households headed by females are 23.6%. At sector level, the highest percentages of households headed by women are found in Kimihurura (29.2%) and Rutunga (29.0%) while the lowest are found in Bumbogo (20.5%).

4.2 Housing Characteristics

4.2.1 Type of habitat

The results of the 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that in the City of Kigali, the predominant type of habitat is Modern planned urban housing (42.9%) and Spontaneous/squatter housing (40.1%). The most common type of habitat in Gasabo district is spontaneous/squatter housing (41.1%) followed by modern planned urban housing (37.7%) and dispersed or isolated housing (10.2%). The type of habitat varies across sectors. Spontaneous/squatter housing is most prevalent in Gatsata (80.0%) and Kacyiru (68.7%) and low in Gikomero (0.2%) and Rutunga (4.8%). The sectors with the high percentages of dispersed/isolated housing units are Gikomero (85.8%) and Rutunga (51.3%). The table below displays results by sector.



According to the area of residence, the predominant types are spontaneous/squatter housing (46.5%) and modern planned urban housing (45.5%) in urban areas. In rural areas, the predominant type is dispersed/isolated housing (47.4%) followed by Umudugudu/Planned rural settlement (34.2%). The figure below indicate details:

4.2.2 Tenure of the housing

The results of the 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the ownership of housing in the City of Kigali represents 34.1% and tenants represent 61.3%. In Gasabo district, 58.5% of housing units are occupied by tenants while 37.0% are occupied by their owners. At the sector level, the percentage of owners of households' units is high in Gikomero (86.0%), Rutunga (84.0%) and Nduba (61.0%) and low in Remera (18.8%), Kimihurura (20.3%) and Gatsata (20.4%). The percentage of tenants of housing units is high in Remera (77.6%), Gatsata (77.5%), Gisozi (76.2%) and Kimihurura (74.4%) and low in Gikomero (8.9%) and Rutunga (10.8%). 

According to the area of residence, 3 types of tenure of housing units (owners, tenants, and free lodging) predominate in urban area as well as in rural area. The percentage of owners of housing units is 29.2% in urban areas to 77.6% in rural areas and the percentage of tenants of housing units is 66.8% in urban areas to 18.4% in rural areas. The percentage of free lodging is 2.2% in urban areas to 5.7% in rural areas. The figures below indicate details:

4.2.3 Material of the housing units

4.2.3.1 Main materials of the roof

The results of the 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets in Rwanda (74.1%) and in the City of Kigali (98.8%). In Gasabo district, housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets (98.5%). Only 0.6% are covered by industrial tiles, 0.5% by local tiles and 0.3% by concrete. The variation by sector is not very significant. The high percentages of housing units covered by iron sheets are found in 8 sectors: Jali (99.9%), Gatsata and Jabana (99.7% each), Ndera (99.5%), Gikomero (99.3%), Rusororo (99.2%), Gisozi and Nduba (99.0% each). The lowest is in Rutunga with 94.9% of housing units covered by iron sheets. The highest percentage of the housing units covered by local tiles is found in Rutunga sector (5.1%). 

According to the area of residence, the predominant roofing materials are the iron sheets in both urban areas (98.6%) and rural areas (98.3%). The percentage of housing units covered by local tiles is 1.6% in rural areas while it is 0.3% in urban areas. Housing units covered by industrial tiles are found in urban areas only (0.8%). The figure below illustrates details:

4.2.3.2 Main materials of the walls

The results of the census show that the most materials of the walls of the housing units are sundried bricks with cement: 36.3% in Rwanda, 59.8% in the City of Kigali and 63.1% in Gasabo district. At the national level, it is followed by sundried bricks without cement (30.7%) while the second most materials of the walls of the housing units in City of Kigali and Gasabo district are wood with mud and cement (11.4% and 7.6% respectively). At the sector level, sun dried bricks with cement are the mostly used materials in Kinyinya (77.4%), Gisozi (72.9%) and Remera 71.2%). Wood with mud and cement is the most frequently used material in Jali (28.6%), Gikomero (25.4%) and Rutunga (19.7%). The table below displays details:



According to the area of residence, the main materials used for walls of the housing units in urban areas are mostly sun-dried bricks with cement (71.0%). Other materials used for walls with relative percentages are burnt bricks with cement (6.3%), and sun-dried bricks without cement (6.2%), wood with mud and cement (3.9%) and cement blocks (3.1%). In rural areas, wood with mud without cement are predominant materials with (32.6%) followed by wood with mud and cement (25.4%) and sun-dried bricks with cement (25.2%). 4.2.3.3 Main materials of the floor

The results of the 5RPHC 2022 indicate that the main material of the floor of the housing units is the Earth (60.4%) in countrywide. In the city of Kigali, the cement is the main material of the floor of the housing units (63.1%). In Gasabo district, the main material of the floor of the housing units is cement (59.9%) followed by earth (21.5%) and ceramic/clay/granite tiles (16.6%). At sector level, the cement as main material used for the floor is most found in Gatsata (85.4%), Gisozi (69.2%), Kinyinya (68.4%), Remera (62.0%) and Ndera (61.5%). The high percentages of housing units whose floor is ceramic/clay/granite tiles are found in Kacyiru and Kimironko (37.6% each), Kimihurura (36.5%) and Remera (32.9%) and the high percentage of the housing units with earth as main material used for the floor is found in Gikomero (66.3%) and Rutunga (64.5%). 

By areas of residence, the results of the census indicate that the predominant materials used for the floor of the housing units are cement (65.3%) followed by ceramic/clay/granite tiles (19.8%) and earth (13.0%) in urban areas. In rural areas, the predominant materials are earth (62.7%) and cement (34.0%). The figure below provides details:

4.3. Source of energy of the private households

4.3.1 Grid line connectivity in Gasabo district

At national level, the results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 52.5% of private households are connected to the national grid while 47.2% are not connected. In City of Kigali, the percentage of private household connected to the national grid line is 88.8% while it is 85.4% in Gasabo district. At the sector level, over 95% of private households are connected to the national grid line in 7 sectors out of 15. Remera (98.5%) and Kimironko (98.4%) have the higher percentages. Sectors with lower percentages of private households connected to the national grid line are Gikomero (38.4% and Rutunga (46.4%). The table below displays details:



4.3.2 Main source of energy for lighting in Gasabo district

In Gasabo district, the main source of energy for lighting used by households is electricity (86.5%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using electricity for lighting is high in Kimironko and Remera (98.4% each), Kacyiru (97.9%), Kimihurura (97.7%) and Gatsata (97.1%). The sectors with the high percentages of private households using flashlight/phone flashlight for lighting are Gikomero (46.7%) and Rutunga (41.3%). Table below provides details:



According to the area of residence, the main source of energy for lighting is electricity (54.5%), followed by flashlight/phone flashlight (31.8%) and candles (9.4%) in rural areas. 4.3.3 Main sources of energy for cooking in Gasabo district

At the district level, the main sources of energy for cooking used by the private households are charcoal (56.6%) followed by firewood (23.0%) and gas (17.5%). At the sector level, firewood is the most used source of cooking energy by private households in Gikomero (92.8%) and Rutunga (92.4%) followed by Jari (55.6%) and Nduba (43.5%). Sectors with the high percentage of private households using charcoal as main source of cooking energy are Gatsata (77.4%), Kinyinya (73.4%) and Gisozi (65.3%). Sectors with the highest percentages of private households using gas as main source of cooking energy are Kimironko (46.9%), Kacyiru (45.0%) and Kimihurura (42.3%). 

4.3.4.1 Main source of drinking water

The results of the 5RPHC 2022 reveal that improved drinking water sources is the most water sources in Rwanda that represent (82.3%). In Gasabo district, 95.8% of private households use improved drinking water sources. At the sector level, the percentage of the private households using water from improved drinking sources is highest in Remera (99.9%), and the lowest in Gikomero (75.1%). 


Figure 4. 9 Percentage of the private households of Gasabo District by main source of water and by Sector

4.3.4.2 Main type of toilet facility

The results of census reveal that the main types of toilet facility used by the private households in Rwanda are Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (68.8%). In Gasabo district, main types of toilet facility used by the private households are Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households (44.0%), pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (39.8%) and flush toilet used by one household (11.0%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household is high in Gikomero (89.2%) and Rutunga (83.5%) while it is low in Kimironko (16.7%) and Remera (17.3%). The high percentages of households using Flush toilets used by one household are found in Kimironko (38.0%) and Kacyiru (27.7%). For pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by several households, Gatsata (65.0%), Remera (57.5%), Kinyinya (56.9%), Gisozi (56.6%) and Kimihurura (55.2%) are the sectors with the high

percentage of private households using this kind of toilet. The lowest percentage is found in Gikomero (7.0%). The table below indicates the types of toilets facilities.



4.3.4.3 Mode of waste disposal in Gasabo district

The results of the census reveal that, in Gasabo district, the high percentage of households (48.6%) evacuate their waste through the waste collection companies while 27.9% of private households evacuate their waste in the household's fields and 18.7% in the compost dumping. At the Sector level, the high percentages of households evacuating their waste through the waste collection companies are in Kimihurura (95.6%), Kacyiru (94.2%), Kimironko (93.7%)

and Remera (92.6%). The household's fields as main mode of waste disposal is the most used Nduba (51.9%), Bumbogo (46.1%) and Jabana (46.0%). The high percentages of households using household compost dumping are in Gikomero (65.6%) and Rutunga (52.8%). The table below indicates details:



The results of the census indicate the main modes of waste disposal used by the households vary also by area of residence. In urban areas, domestic waste is mainly collected and evacuated by companies (58.5%). Other private households evacuate their domestic waste in the household's fields or in the bushes (24.3%) or in the household compost dumping (12.4%). In rural areas, the households evacuate their waste mainly by compost dumping (49.6%) and others in their fields or in the bushes (45.7%). The figure below illustrates details:

4.4 Assets possessed by private households in Gasabo district

4.4.1 Communication assets possessed by private households in Gasabo District

At the district level, 93.2% of private households possess a radio, 91.3% a mobile phone, 48% a smartphone, 32.6% a TV and 14.3% a computer. The percentage of private households possessing a radio is high in Kacyiru (97.7%), Kimihurura, Kimironko and Remera (97.3% each), Gisozi (95.9%) and Gatsata (95.3%). It is low in Gikomero (79.9%). The percentage of

private households possessing a television is high in Kimironko (51.8%) and Kacyiru 50.7%) while it is low in Rutunga (7.3%) and Gikomero (6.4%). Mobile phone is mostly possessed by private households of Remera and Kimihurura(96.9% and 96.6 respectively), Kacyiru (96.5), Kimironko (95.9%). The sectors with high percentage of households with smartphone are Kacyiru (77.5%) and Kimironko (74.5%) while the percentage of households possessing this asset is low in Rutunga and Gikomero (12.5%).

The computer is mostly possessed in Kimironko (38.2%), Kacyiru (34.6%), Kimihurura (29.4%), Remera (25.6%) and Gisozi (20.2%). The table below provides details:

4.4.2 Access to the Internet

The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the percentages of households with at least one member using internet are 22.2% at national level while they are 53.4% in Kigali City and 49.2% in Gasabo district. At sector level, the high percentage of households with at least one member using internet is high in Kacyiru (79.0%), Kimironko (75.9%) and Kimihurura (72.8%). The sectors with the lower percentages of households with at least one member using internet are Rutunga (12.7%) and Gikomero (14.7%). The table below presents details.



CHAPTER 5: AGRICULTURE IN GASABO DISTRICT

The agriculture was the one of the areas of investigation of the 5th Rwanda Population and housing census conducted in 2022. The households engaged in Livestock husbandry; the number of private crop farming households cultivating different types of crops, by Sector, the number of private households raising different types of livestock, by Sector and type of household raised in district were captured in the census.

5.1 The households engaged in crop farming and livestock husbandly

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 2,280,854 private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture country wide. Among them, 62.6% are engaged in crop farming and 50.4% are engaged in Livestock husbandry. In Gasabo district, crop farming and animal husbandly are on small scale. Agricultural households represent 23.5% with 18.3% of households engaged in crop farming and 15.7% in Livestock husbandry.

At the sector level, the highest percentages of agricultural households are found in Rutunga (86.6%) and Gikomero (85.0%). Households engaged in crop farming are more represented in Rutunga (80.4%) and Gatsata (76.7%) while those engaged in livestock husbandry are in Rutunga (69.9%) and Gikomero. 5.2 Distribution of private household engaged in crop farming of different types of crops, by Sector

The results of 5th Population and housing census 2022 indicate that the most cultivated crops by the private households of Gasabo district are fruits, maize, cassava, beans, sorghum, sweet potato, banana, and vegetables. Those households that apply agriculture activities are found in the rural areas of Gasabo district in the following sectors: Bumbogo, Gikomero, Jabana, Jali, Kinyinya, Ndera, Nduba, Rusororo and Rutunga.

5.3 Distribution of private households engaged in raising different types of livestock, by Sector

Nationally and in the City of Kigali, the results of the census indicate that most private households are considerably more engaged in raising cows, goats and chicken than other livestock. It is in the same extent in Gasabo district.

The sectors that have high proportion of private households that are engaged in livestock are: Rutunga, Gikomero, Bumbogo, Jali, Nduba, Rusororo, Ndera and Jabana where more than 1,000 households declared engaged in livestock.
