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FOREWORD

The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.


Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. 

CHAPTER 1: POPULATION SIZE, SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION, AND STRUCTURE

1.1 Size and spatial Distribution of the population

1.1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Eastern Province

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (RPHC5) has enumerated 3,563,145 residents in the Eastern Province, which represents 26.9% of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394 residents). The population of the Eastern Province is predominantly female; 1,828,751 are women corresponding to 51.3 % of the total population of the Eastern. Nyagatare is the most populated district with 653,861 residents in 2022. Its population represents 18.4% of the total residents' population of the Eastern Province. The least populated district in the Eastern Province is Ngoma with 404,048 inhabitants, corresponding to 11.3% of the total resident population of the Eastern Province.



1.1.2 Population Density of the Eastern Province by District

Population density is a measurement of population per unit land area. Density is the number of the inhabitant per Km². The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022 revealed that, the population density in Rwanda is 503 inhabitants per Km². The Eastern Province has 433 inhabitants per Km². The district with a high population density in Eastern Province is Rwamagana with 740 Inhabitants per km². The district with a lowest population density in Eastern Province is Kayonza with 338 Inhabitants per km². **Error! 
Figure 1. 2 Population density (inhabitant per Km2) by District in the Eastern Province

1.1.3 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of the Gatsibo district

The results in previous Table 1. 1 Resident population distribution of the Eastern Province by sex and District indicates that 551,164 residents were enumerated in Gatsibo district, and the population share is 15.5% of the total population of the Eastern Province. The population of Gatsibo district is predominantly female: 286,703 are women corresponding to 52.0 % of its total population. The **Error! Reference source not found.** below indicates the number of the population of Gatsibo district by sector, by sex, the percentage of female and their shares across sectors to the total population of Gatsibo district. Females are predominant all sectors the district. The most populated sector is Kabarore with 13.0% of the total population of the District. The two less populated sectors are Gasange and Kageyo (20,725 residents and 24,702 residents respectively). They represent 3.8% and 4.5% of the total resident population of Gatsibo district, respectively.

1.1.4 Size and Spatial distribution of the Population of Gatsibo district by residence area

The results from the 5th Rwanda Population and housing census reveal that, the population of Rwanda are predominantly distributed in rural areas that represent 72.1% of resident population compared to 27.9% in urban areas. The population in Eastern Province is predominantly rural (79.1%) comparatively to urban areas (20.9%). The same trend is observed at district level (Gatsibo) where, the population in that district mostly found to live in rural areas (90%) compared to urban areas (10%). Results presented in Table 1. 3 Distribution (Count and %) of Resident Population of Gatsibo district by sector and Area of Residence in 2022 show that, sectors namely: Gasange, Kageyo, Muhura, Murambi, Nyagihanga and Remera are entirely rural sectors of Gatsibo district.

1.1.5 Age-Sex Structure of the Population of Gatsibo district


The results presented in Table 1. 4 Distribution (Count and %) of Resident Population of Gatsibo District by 5-Year Age Group and Sex in 2022 show that, the population in Gatsibo district is mostly young, 59.8% of the resident population of Gatsibo is under 25 years, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 1. 4 Age pyramid of the resident population of Gatsibo district in 2022), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past. The elderly (60 years and above) represents 6.5% of the total population of the district. The percentage share of the population aged 0-14 represents 39.2%. The **Error! 1.1.6 Population share of some specific interventions target groups in Gatsibo district by sex

The 5th Rwanda population and housing census provides information about the population on specific ages-based programs, policy and strategies interventions in health, education, employment. It also shows the population categories in their respective characteristics such as children, youth, working population, among other things. For instance, children under five years for immunization programs (Under 5 years’ children), children in school age (3-17 years), people in the official working age group (16 years and above), etc. Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The results displayed in Table 1. 5 give the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Gatsibo district. The population aged 0-17 represents 46.9 % of the total population of the district, 16-30 years represent 26.4%; the economically active population aged 16 and above 58.2% of the same population. CHAPTER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

2.1 Socio-cultural characteristics of the population

2.1.1 Nationality of the population of Gatsibo district

The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the Rwandan population represents 99.11% and foreigners represent 0.89% at national level. In the Eastern Province, foreigners represent 1.7% and 1.6% in Gatsibo district 8,856 residents are foreigners. Gatsibo sector has the highest percentage of others (19.6%). The table below illustrates the distribution of the population by nationality with their respective sectors of residence.

2.1.2 Religious affiliation of the resident population of Gatsibo district

In Gatsibo district, Christianity is the predominant religion: 34.4% are catholic, 23.1% are ADEPR, 17.6 % are protestants, 8.2% are Adventists and 6.2% are other Christians. Muslims are 3.2%, other religion and Jehovah witness are (2.6% and 0.9% respectively) while 3.6% of the resident population declared themselves to be without religion. 2.2 Marital Status of the resident population of Gatsibo district

2.2.1 Marital status by sector

The results of 5RPHC-2022 revealed that 49.1% of the resident population of Gatsibo district aged 12 and above were living in union (married officially to one wife/husband, married not officially to one wife/husband, live in polygamous union) at the time of the census, 42.9% were never married, 5.3% were widowed while 2.3% separated and 0.2% divorced. At the sector level, 2 sectors have the highest percentages of the currently married people: Nyagihanga (54.4%), Kageyo (51.9%) while the highest percentages of the never married persons are found in Gatsibo (46.9%) and Gasange (45.0%). Remera and Kiziguro sectors have high percentage of widowed persons (6.7% and 6.3% respectively). Details of the resident population of Gatsibo district aged 12 years and above by marital status and sex are presented in the annex.

2.2.2 Marital status by Age groups

The percentages of resident population of Gatsibo district by marital status vary by age: The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.8% (age group of 12-14 years) to 0.9% (age group of 80 years and above). The percentage of persons currently living in union starts by increasing from 0.2% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of more than 86% (age groups of 35-39 and 40-44 years) before decreasing to 44.3% (age group 80+) due mainly to widowhood (53.8%). The highest percentages of divorced persons are observed within the age groups 45-49 and 50-54 (0.5% each) while the highest percentage of the separated persons is found in the age group 45-49 years (4.8%).

2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population of Gatsibo district

2.3.1 School attendance

Table 2. 4 below shows that, in Gatsibo district , 54.6% of pre-primary-age population (3-5 years) are currently attending school, 45.4% of those children have never attended and none (0%) of those children have previously attended (i.e children who have already had prior exposure to pre-primary school education before the time of census but who were not attending nursery school/droped-out during census time). Nyagihanga Sector has the highest proportion of children (age between 3 to 5) currently attending school in Gatsibo District (67.4%). Following closely, the Murambi and Rwimbogo Sectors have a percentage of 61.2% and 60.3% of children currently attending school. Kabarore sector has the lowest percentage of children currently attending school, with 50% enrolled. On the other hand, Muhura sector has the highest proportion of children aged 3 to 5 who have never attended school (59.4%).

Table 2. 5 shows that in Gatsibo district 87.2% of children aged 6 to 11 years (the official primary school-going age) are currently attending school 11.0% have never attended school and only 1.8% have previously attended school (which means that 12.8% of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school).

By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) across sectors in Gatsibo district, comparisons reveal the disparities in primary school attendance across different sectors within Gatsibo district. Sectors like Gasange and Muhura exhibit lower rates of children currently attending school (76.2 % and 81.5%, respectively) and higher rates of children who have never attended (12.1% against 16.0%, respectively). On the other hand, sectors like Murambi, Kiramuruzi, Gatsibo, Kiziguro, Nyagihanga and Rwimbogo demonstrate higher rates of children currently attending school (all these sectors have over than 89% of children aged 6-11 currently attending school) and lower rates of children who have never attended.

In Gatsibo district 24.6% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school (i.e. they dropped out of school), 71.7% are currently attending school and 3.7% have never attended secondary school.

The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) across sectors in Gatsibo district, shows that Kiramuruzi and Gatsibo sectors have the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school (77.6% and 78.4% respectively). Conversely, Muhura and Gasange Sectors have the lowest percentage of the population between the ages of 12 and 17 currently attending school with 65.5% and 65.6% respectively. Ngarama sector has the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 who have never attended school at 5.6%.

2.3.2. Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Primary School in Gatsibo district

Gross and Net Attendance Ratios are used to measure the extent of coverage of an educational program. It gives a comparison of the children attending school with the total size of the school-age population. It can also be used for assessing how far a country has succeeded in bringing to school all those who are eligible to attend.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years). The gross attendance rate in Rwanda is 141.7, in the Eastern Province GAR is 141.7 and 143.3 in Gatsibo district. The Net Attendance Rate (NAR) in Primary school for Gatsibo district (87.2%) is almost the same as the NAR of the Eastern Province (87.4%) and NAR of Gatsibo lower than the NAR of national level (89.3%).

A Gross Attendance Rate (GAR) of 143.3% in Gatsibo district for the population 6 to 11 years indicates a high percentage of those who attended primary schools aged below 6 years and or above 11 years. On the other hand, the NAR of 87.2% for the population 6 to 11 years indicates that only 87.2% of the population 6 to 11 years were attending primary schools in Gatsibo district by 2022 (Table 2.8). In 2022, students older or younger than the official primary school age range made up 39.1% $[(GAR143.3 - NAR87.2) / GAR143.3]$ of the primary school population of Gatsibo district.

With a NAR of 89.7%, the Gatsibo Sector has the greatest percentage of pupils that are attending primary school and are of primary school-age. In comparison to other sectors, the Gasange sector has the lowest NAR at 76.2%, indicating a lesser percentage of pupils who are attending primary school within the eligible age range. Al most all sectors have gender parity

indexes greater than 1.00 except Ngarama (1.00), suggesting better access to education for female students compared to male students.

2.3.3 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Secondary School

The table 2. 9 provides information on the gross and net attendance rates in the secondary school level (12-17 years) in Gatsibo district, disaggregated by sex and sector. The Eastern Province and Gatsibo district both have lower NARs than the national average (19.2% and 19.1%, respectively, versus 22.3%) when compared to the national average. Comparing males and females in Gatsibo district in terms of Net Attendance Rates (NAR), the table 2. 9 indicates that a higher proportion of females (22.2%) in Gatsibo, within the secondary school-age range (12-17 years), are attending school compared to males (16.0%). Female students older or younger than the official secondary school age range made up 39.9 % $[(GAR37.0 - NAR22.2) / GAR37.0]$ of the female with secondary school age of Gatsibo district, while for male students it made up 49.3 % $[(GAR31.6 - NAR16.0) / GAR31.6]$. This shows that females have a higher attendance rate in Gatsibo district compared to males when considering the overall attendance rates, regardless of age or grade-level eligibility.

Among the sectors in Gatsibo district, Gatsibo has the highest GAR for both sexes, with a rate of 49.0%. Sectors such as Kageyo and Murambi, have relatively lower GAR compared to others (24.7%, 26.2% respectively). Gatsibo Sector has the highest NAR for both sexes in Gatsibo district, with a rate of 25.8%. Sectors like, Kageyo and Murambi have relatively lower NAR compared to others (14.3% and 15.6% respectively).

2.3.4 Highest level of school attended in Gatsibo district

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate the total population of Rwanda aged 3 and above is 11,999,691. The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary, University, and Not stated. In Rwanda, 16.7% of the population aged 3 years and above has never attended school, while 2.7% have attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, 7.1% for upper secondary, 3.6% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of the Eastern province aged 3 and above is 3,215,103. The distribution of the highest level of education attended is like the national level, with slight variations. In the Eastern Province, 18.1% of the population has never attended school, while 2.9% have attended nursery, and 60.9% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.6% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.3% for lower secondary, 6.0% for upper secondary, 2.2% for university, and a small proportion (0.0%) is not stated.

The total population of Gatsibo district aged 3 and above is 495,985. In Gatsibo district, 18.3% of the population has never attended school, while 2.5% have attended nursery, and 62.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.6% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.4% for lower secondary, 5.2% for upper secondary, 1.5% for university, and a small proportion 0.0% is not stated. The distribution of the highest level of education attended varies among sectors, with differences in the percentage of individuals at each education level. For example, Gasange has a higher percentage (23.3%) of individuals who have never attended school compared to other sectors, while Gatsibo Sector has a higher percentage (7.6%) of individuals attended upper secondary school. Each sector has its own unique distribution of education levels attended by the population. The table below indicates the findings:

2.4 Characteristics of the Employed Population

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Aggregate employment generally increases with growing population. Therefore, the ratio of Employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment-to population ratio is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

2.4.1 Employment to population ratio by sex, Province, District and area of residence

The results presented in the below

Table 2. 10 shows that the employment to population ratio stood at 45.9% in Rwanda, it is lower among females (40.2 %) than males (52.4 %). On the other side, it was observed that the employment to population ratio is higher in urban areas of Rwanda (53.5%) than in rural areas (42.7%).

It was observed that in the Eastern Province, the employment to population ratio stood at 47.9%, it is higher in urban areas (53.1%) than in rural areas of the Eastern Province (46.5%). It was also revealed that the employment to population ratio is 48.8% among people residing in Gatsibo district s, it is higher in urban areas of Gatsibo (57.5 %) than in rural areas of Gatsibo (47.9%).



2.4.2 Employment to population ratio(EPR) among the resident population of Gatsiboaged 16 years and above by age group and sex

Figure 2. 1 allows the study of intensity of Employment to population ratio and its variation by sex. The figure reveals the following remarks: The employment to population ratio among males as well as females increases from age group 16-19 to 35-44 and starts decreasing from age group 45-49 to 85 years and above as people starts getting very older and retire. It was observed that in district of Gatsibo, the highest employment to population ratio among males stands at 70.6% and was observed in age group 30-34, On the other side the highest employment to population among females is 53.4% and was observed in the age group 40-44. The lowest employment to population ratio among males stands at 9.6% and was observed among males in the age group 85+, the lowest employment to population ratio among females is 6.0% and was observed among females in the age group 85+.

CHAPTER 3: SUB-POPULATION

3.1 Children Population (0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda, as stipulated in Article 3 of the National Law n° 54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child, which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0–17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

3.1.1 Number and share of children in Gatsibo district

At the national level, the children population constitute 44.5% of the total population of 13,246,394 residents. The Eastern Province has 1,656,727 children with a share of 46.5% of the total resident population. In Gatsibo district, the children constitute 46.9% of the resident population of the district with a percentage of males slightly greater than the females' one (48.8% to 45.1%). At sector level, the children's share is high in Murambi (48.6%), Kabarore (48.5%) and Rwimbogo (48.2%) and is small in Nyagihanga (44.4%). The table below indicate distribution of children by sector and by sex.

3.1.2 Children with birth registration in Gatsibo district

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 94.3% at the national level. The birth registration rate in Gatsibo district is 92.0%. The variation by sex is not very significant and the birth registration in rural areas is same as it rural (92.0%). The table below illustrates the findings:

3.1.3 Birth registration by sector

The results from the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that, birth registration varies across sectors and areas of residence. The high percentages of children birth registrations are found in Nyagihanga (95.4%), Kageyo (95.3%) and Gasange (95.2%) while the lowest is in Kabarore (86.1%). Results presented in Table 3. 3 Percentage of the children aged 0-17 in Gatsibo district whose birth was registered by sex, Sector, and area of residence show that, Gasange, Kageyo, Muhura, Murambi, Nyagihanga and Remera sectors are entirely rural (No urban areas). The percentage of children birth registration is almost the same in Gatsibo district both for males and females (91.9% and 92.1%).

3.2 Youth population in Rwanda

For statistical purposes, the United Nations defines "youth" as those persons between the ages of 15 and 24 years, without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda's Development, the definition of Youth in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14 -35 years to 16–30 years.

3.2.1 The youth population in Gatsibo district

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 revealed that the youth population represent 27.14% (3,595,670) of the total population (13,246,394). In Gatsibo district, the youth population was 145,378 which represents 26.4% of the total resident population of the district (551,164). The sector with the highest youth share is Ngarama (28.2%) while Kiziguro (24.5%) and Kiramuruzi (24.6%) have the lowest share of youth. The table below indicate distribution of youth by sector and by sex.

3.2.2 Educational characteristics of youth

Youth who never attended school represent 5.1 % of the youth resident population at national level; it represents 6.0% of the total resident population in the Eastern Province and 5.8% of the total resident population of Gatsibo district. The percentage of youth who never attended school varies a lot within sectors of Gatsibo district. The highest percentage was registered in Remera (7.7%) while the lower percentages were registered in Murambi (4.4%), Kiziguro (4.5%) and Kiramuruzi (4.7%).

3.2.3 Highest level of education attended ed by youth in Gatsibo district

In Gatsibo district , among all youths, 56.0% attended only the primary school level, 22.3 % attended the lower secondary education, 13.0% attended the upper secondary education, 2.3% attended university, and 5.8% have never attended school. The highest level of education attended varies across all sectors in Gatsibo district . The sectors with the high percentages of youth with no schooling are Remera (7.7%), Kabarore, Ngarama and Rwimbogo (6.5% each). The percentage of youth with university level is high in Kiramuruzi and Ngarama (3.4%), and Kabarore (3.3%). The sectors with the high percentages of youth with primary education are Kageyo (64.5%), Murambi (64.3%) and Nyagihanga (64.1%). Table 3. 6 provides detailed information about the highest level of education attended by the youth population across all sectors in Gatsibo district.

3.2.4 Employment to population ratio among youth(16-30).

The Census results showed that in Rwanda the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.3%, it is higher among males than females 44.8% and 36.2 % respectively. It was observed that in the district of Gatsibo, the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 42.3%, it is higher in among males (44.8%) than females (40%).

The highest employment to population ratio among youth in Gatsibo district was observed in Rwimbogo sector (48.6%), Ngarama (47.9%) and Kabarore (45.6%), the lowest employment to population ratio among youth was observed in Gatsibo (27.3%) and Remera (36.5%).

3.2.5 Distribution (%) of the currently employed youth age 16-30 years by Province, District, Sector and status in employment

In Gatsibo district, the majority of youth aged 16-30 currently employed are employees (56.4%) followed by self-employed (33.9%). The high percentages of youth employees are found in Ngarama (67.0%) and Kabarore (63.6%), while the low percentages are in Rwimbogo (45.4%), Murambi and Gitoki (47.1% and 47.2% respectively). The highest share of self-employed youth is found in Murambi (43.6%), while the low percentages are found in Ngarama (23.7%).

3.2.6 Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Gatsibo District by sex, district, and area of residence.

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, In Rwanda the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training stood at 39.5 %. It is higher among females (43.8 %) than males (34.9 %).

In the Eastern Province, the proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training is 38.9 %, it is lower among males (34.5 %) than females (43.8 %). The 2022 census results also revealed that the aforementioned proportion is higher in rural areas of the Eastern Province (40.7 %) than in urban areas of the Eastern Province (32.5 %).

The proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among people residing in Gatsibo district stood at 38.6 %. It is much higher (39.7%) among people residing in rural areas of Gatsibo district than the ones residing in urban areas of Gatsibo district (29.5 %). The table below (Table 3. 9) indicates results on Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Eastern Province by Sex, Sector, and Area of Residence.

3.3 Persons with disabilities

In 2015, 193 countries agreed to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals with a commitment where possible, “to disaggregate the statistics they generate by disability to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities (PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programmes, or are included in the workforce. At the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 years and above have a disability while in Gatsibo district, the disability prevalence rate is 3.4%. At sector level, the highest prevalence rates of the resident population

aged 5 years and above with disability are in Gatsibo (5.5%). The lowest is in Muhura (2.1%) and Gasange (2.5%).

3.4 Elderly Population(60 years and above)

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through

an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person.

It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action programme, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programmes on ageing. This was done to guarantee economic and social security to older people and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

3.4.1 Elderly population of Gatsibo district by Sector

In 2022, the elderly persons constitute 6.5% of the total resident population of Gatsibo district. The share of the elderly females (7.3%) is higher than the male's one (5.5%), reflecting the higher life expectancy for women. By sector, Nyagihanga (7.7%), Muhura (7.1%) and Kageyo (7.5%) have the highest share of elderly among their total population while Kabarore, Ngarama and Rwimbogo have the lowest (5.5% for Kabarore and Ngarama, 5.9% for Rwimbogo).

3.4.2 Employment among elderly people

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.2%. The aforementioned share is higher among the elderly males (33.7%) than elderly females (24.3%).

In Gatsibo district, 35.8 % of elderly people were employed. The percentage of employed elderly people is higher among males than females (41.2% vs. 32.0%).

Employment among elderly residents is high in Rwimbogo sector (42.5%) and Muhura (40.0%). It is low in Gatsibo Sector (26.8%) and Nyagihanga sector (31.4%).

3.4.3 Marital status of elderly people

In Gatsibo district, more than half of the elderly population (62.1%) were living in union (Married to one wife/husband officially, married to one wife/ husband not officially, Live in a polygamous union) and 33.6% were widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly was 1.6% while divorce or separation rate is 2.7%. Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector of residence. Marriage among elderly people is more important in Nyagihanga (68.2%) and Rwimbogo sector (68.1%) sectors. Widowhood is widespread in Kiziguro sector (38.1%) and Kiramuruzi sector (36.7% each) and lowest in Nyagihanga (28.1%). The table below illustrates distribution of elderly people across sectors.

CHAPTER 4: HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

4.1 Household characteristics

In this chapter, the 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, households' heads by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and cooking, water sources, sanitation facilities, asset possessed by household and mode of waste and disposals.

4.1.1 Number and mean size of the private households

The results of the 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the total of 3,312,743 private households in Rwanda. In the Eastern Province, they are 886,132 and 136,208 in Gatsibo district.

The average household size in Gatsibo district is 4.0 persons per household. At the Sector level, the highest sizes are found in Gasange and Gatsibo Sectors (4.3 persons/household each). The smallest household sizes are found in Nyagihanga and Ngarama (3.8 persons/household each). The table below indicates number of households and size of household members per sector.

4.1.2 Private households' heads of Gatsibo district

The results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 28.9% of private households are headed by women at national level. In Gatsibo district, private households headed by females are 29.3%. At sector level, the highest percentages of households headed by women are found in Kiramuruzi Sector (34.5%) and Gatsibo Sector (34.3%) while the lowest are found in Muhura

sector (24.9%).

4.2 Housing Characteristics

4.2.1 Type of habitat

Results from the 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that, in Eastern Province the predominant type of habitat is Planned rural settlement also known as umudugudu settlement (86.5%) and Dispersed/Isolated housing (7.4%). The same trend is observed at district level, where the most common type of habitat in Gatsibo district is umudugudu settlements (80.5%) and Dispersed/Isolated housing (13.8%).

Results presented in Table 4.1 show that the type of habitat varies across all sectors in Gatsibo district . Umudugudu settlement is the most prevalent type of habitat in Rwimbogo (93.0%) Rugarama (89.5%), and Nyagihanga (88.4%) Kiziguro sector (87.5%). Sectors with the highest percentages of dispersed or isolated housing units are: Muhura (30.4%) followed by Gasange (23.3%) and Gitoki (20.3%).




Figure 4. 9 Percentage of the private households of Gatsibo district by main source of water and by Sector

The data displayed in Figure 4. 1Distribution (%) of the private households of Gatsibo district by type of habitat and by Area of residence reveal a similar trend observed at the national level even at provincial level is also evident across areas of residence where, the Planned rural settlement and Dispersed/Isolated housing remain the predominant type of habitat both in urban (86.0% and 7.6%) and rural areas (79.9% and 14.5%).

4.2.2 Tenure of the housing

The results presented in **Error! Reference source not found.** indicate that, ownership of housing in the Eastern Province represents 72.1% of the private households, while 21.1% of the private households are occupied by tenants. In Gatsibo district, 79.1% of housing units are occupied by their owners, while 15.2% are occupied by tenants.

At sector level, the percentage of owners of housing units is high in Gasange (90.6%), Nyagihanga (89.7%) and Kageyo (89.3%) and low in Kabarore (60.8%), Gatsibo (71.2%), and Kiramuruzi (73.8%). The percentage of tenants of housing units is high in Kabarore (26.5%), Rugarama (19.4%) and Ngarama (19.2%) and low in Gasange (6.3%), Remera (7.2%), Kageyo and Nyagihanga (7.5% each).



The data displayed in **Error! Reference source not found.** show that, tenure of housing units district varies substantially in Gatsibo according to the area of residence. For instance, the percentage of owners of housing units is 56.0% in urban areas against 81.8% in rural areas,

whereas 37.4% of housing units are occupied by tenants in urban areas against 12.6% in rural areas. The free lodging is higher in urban areas (4.9%) than in rural areas (3.2%).

4.2.3 Material of the housing units

4.2.3.1 Main materials of the roof

The results of the 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets in Rwanda (74.1%) and in the Eastern Province (98.9%). In Gatsibo district, housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets (98.8%). A very small proportion of private households are covered by industrial tiles (1.1%), and by concrete (less than 0.1%). The variation by sector is not very significant. The percentages of housing units covered by iron sheets is higher than 98% in almost all sectors except in Kageyo (87.8%). The highest percentage of the housing units covered by local tiles is found in Kageyo sector (12.0%). The table below displays details:



According to the area of residence, the predominant roofing materials are the iron sheets in both urban areas (99.4%) and rural areas (98.7%). The percentage of housing units covered by local tiles is 1.2% in rural areas while it is 0.5% in urban areas. The figure below illustrates details:

4.2.3.2 Main materials of the walls

The results of the census show that the most materials of the walls of the housing units are sundried bricks with cement: 36.3% in Rwanda, 36.4% in the Eastern Province and 30.1% in Gatsibo district. At the national level, it is followed by sundried bricks without cement (30.7%) while the second most materials of the walls of the housing units in the Eastern Province and Gatsibo district are sun dried bricks without cement (30.5% and 34.5% respectively). At the sector level, sun dried bricks with cement are the mostly used materials in Kabarore (49.7%), Ngarama and Rugarama (44.2% each). Wood with mud and cement is the most frequently used material in Kiziguro (15.1%), Kiramuruzi (14.1%) and Murambi (12.2%). The table below displays details:



According to the area of residence, the main materials used for walls of the housing units in in urban areas are mostly sun-dried bricks with cement (55.1%). Other materials used for walls with relative percentages are mostly sun-dried bricks without cement (22.2%), wood with mud without cement (9.3%) and wood with mud and cement (7.2%). In rural areas, sundried bricks without cement are predominant materials with (35.9%) followed by wood with mud without cement (27.4%) and sun-dried bricks with cement (27.2%). 4.2.3.3 Main materials of the floor

The results of the 5RPHC 2022 indicate that the main material of the floor of the housing units is the Earth (60.4%) in countrywide. In the Eastern Province, the earth is the main material of the floor of the housing units (60.9%). In Gatsibo district, the main material of the floor of the housing units is the earth (67.0%) followed by cement (22.7%) and dung hardened (9.3%). At sector level, the earth as main material used for the floor is most found in Nyagihanga (84.2%), Kageyo (81.1%), Gitoki (74.9%), and Gatsibo Sector (69.4%). The high percentages of housing units whose floor is cement are found in Kabarore and (30.9%), Kiramuruzi (30.1%) and Kiziguro (28.6%). The high percentage of the housing units with Dung hardened as main material used for the floor is found in Gasange (19.0%) and Murambi (18.9%). The table below displays details:



4.3. Source of energy of the private households

4.3.1 Grid line connectivity in Gatsibo district

At national level, the results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 52.5% of private households are connected to the national grid while 47.2% are not connected. In Eastern Province, the percentage of private household connected to the national grid line is 47.3% while it is 35.6% in Gatsibo district. At the sector level, Kiziguro (50.1%) and Kiramuruzi (49.5%) have the higher percentages. Sectors with lower percentages of private households connected to the national grid line are Rwimbogo (27.4% and Kageyo (21.4%). The table below displays details:



4.3.2 Main source of energy for lighting in Gatsibo district

In Gatsibo district, the main source of energy for lighting used by households is electricity (48.8%) followed by Flashlight/ Phone Flashlight (41.8%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using electricity for lighting is high in Kiziguro (59.2%), Kiramuruzi (57.1%), Gatsibo sector (54.8%) and Nyagihanga (53.4%). The sectors with the high percentages of private households using flashlight/phone flashlight for lighting are Murambi (54.1%) and Rwimbogo (47.9%). Table below provides details:



4.3.3 Main sources of energy for cooking in Gatsibo district

At the district level, the main sources of energy for cooking used by the private households are firewood (89.7%) followed by charcoal (6.3%). At the sector level, firewood is the most used source of cooking energy by private households in Kageyo (96.8%) and Nyagihanga (96.1%) followed by Remera (94.7%) and Gasange (94.2%). 

At the sector level, the percentage of the private households using water from improved drinking sources is highest in Kabarore (89.5%), and the lowest in Kiramuruzi (51.2%). 

4.3.4.2 Main type of toilet facility

The results of census reveal that the main types of toilet facility used by the private households in Rwanda are Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (68.8%). In Gatsibo district the main types of toilet facility used by the private households are pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (77.6%) and constructed floor slab used by several households (13.2%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household is high in Kageyo (84.7%), Rugarama (82.1%) and Rwimbogo (82.7%), while it is low in Gatsibo (63.6%) and Kiramuruzi (72.2%). The highest percentage of the households using pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households is found in Gatsibo (27.1%) sector and the lowest in Gasange (7.5%). The sector with high percentages of private households using pit latrine without constructed floor slab used by one household are Gasange (11.4%) and Nyagihanga (10.2%). The sector with the highest percentage of private households having no toilet facility (using bush as their toilet facility) is Muhura (1.2%). **Error! 

The data displayed in **Error! Reference source not found.** indicate that, type of toilet facilities used by the private households varies according to area of residence in Gatsibo district . In urban areas, the most used types of toilet facilities are pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (66.5%) followed by pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households (26.4%) and pit latrine without constructed floor slab used by one household (4.2%). In rural areas, the main types of toilet facilities used by households are pit

latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (78.9%) followed by pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households (11.7%) and pit latrine without constructed floor slab used by one household (7.2%). As expected, the use of unshared flush toilet facility is more likely to be found in rural areas (1.4%) compared to urban areas (0.1%).

4.3.4.3 Mode of waste disposal in Gatsibo district

The results from the 5th RPHC2022 reveal that, in Gatsibo district, the main modes of waste disposal used by private households are household compost dumping (72.1%), household's fields or bushes (22.1%) and public compost dumping (3.6%). At the sector level, high percentages of the households using household compost dumping are in Murambi (82.8%), Rugarama (78.7%) and Kiramuruzi (76.7%). Sectors with high percentages of households disposing their waste on household's fields or bushes are Nyagihanga (37.2%), Kageyo (32.4%) and Gasange (30.5%). Sector with the highest percentage of the private households using public compost dumping is Gatsibo (20.4%). **Error! Reference source not found.** provides details about mode of waste disposal across all sectors in Gatsibo district.



The data displayed in **Error! Reference source not found.** indicate that, the modes of waste disposal used by the households vary according to area of residence in Gatsibo district . In urban areas, the most used modes of waste disposal are household compost dumping (69.7%) followed by household's fields or bushes (17.8%) and public compost dumping (7.7%). In rural areas, the main modes of waste disposal used by households are household compost dumping (72.4%) followed by household's fields or bushes (22.6%) and public compost dumping (3.1%). The use of waste collection companies as mode of households' waste disposal is more likely to be found in urban areas (2.4%) than in rural areas (0.3%).

4.4 Assets possessed by private households in Gatsibo district

4.4.1 Communication assets possessed by private households in Gatsibo district

At the district level, 76.5% of private households possess a radio, 71.4% mobile phone, 12.9% smartphone, 6.3% TV and 1.3% computer.

At sector level, the percentage of private households possessing a radio is high in Kabarore (80.6%), Rwimbogo (80.2%), Kiramuruzi (79.2%) and Gatsibo (79.0%). Radio possession is low in Remera (70.9%), Kageyo (71.0%) and Murambi (71.6%). The percentage of private households possessing a television is high in Kiramuruzi (11.6%), Kiziguro (9.5%) and Kabarore (8.8%) while it is low in Murambi and Nyagihanga (3.3% each) and Gasange (3.5%). Mobile phones are mostly possessed by private households in Kabarore (77.8%), Rwimbogo (77.0%) and Kiramuruzi (75.4%). The percentage of households owning at least one mobile phone is low in Kageyo (62.7%) and Remera (63.2%). Sectors with high percentage of households owning at least one smartphone are Gatsibo (21.2%) and Kiramuruzi (19.3%), whereas the ones with low percentage are Kageyo (6.9%) and Nyagihanga (7.5%). The computer is mostly possessed in Kiramuruzi (2.3%), Ngarama (2.1%) and Kiziguro (1.9%). Computer possession is the lowest in Murambi and Nyagihanga sectors (0.6% each). **Error! 4.4.2 Access to the Internet

The results from the 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that, 22.2% of private households have at least one member with access to the Internet in Rwanda. 18.1% of the private households in Eastern Province have access to the internet. The data also show that, 15.5% of the private households in Gatsibo district have access to the internet. At sector level, the percentage of households whose members have access to the Internet is high in Kabarore (22.3%), Kiramuruzi (21.5%) and Gatsibo (20.7%). The high percentages of households with members having no access to the Internet are found in Nyagihanga (91.8%), Kageyo (91.4%) and Murambi (90.8%). **Error! 

The data presented in Figure 4.1 show that, access to the internet varies according to areas of residence in Gatsibo district . In urban areas, 36.4% of the private households have at least one member with access to the internet, while only 13.0% of the private households have access to the internet in rural areas.

CHAPTER 5: AGRICULTURE IN GATSIBO DISTRICT

The agriculture was the one of the areas of investigation of the 5th Rwanda Population and housing census conducted in 2022. The households engaged in Livestock husbandry; the number of private crop farming households cultivating different types of crops, by Sector, the number of private households raising different types of livestock, by Sector and type of household raised in district were captured in the census.

5.1 The households engaged in crop farming and livestock husbandly

The results from the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that, at national level, 2,280,854 of the private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture activities, among them 2,074,928 are engaged in crop farming (62.6%) and 1,669,273 in livestock husbandry (50.4%). In Gatsibo district, 78.5% of the private households are engaged in agriculture activities, 72.0% in crop farming and 53.7% engaged in livestock husbandry.

The data presented in **Error! Reference source not found.** show that, the distribution of households engaged in agriculture activities varies substantially across sectors in Gatsibo district. The percentage of private households involved in agriculture activities is high in Muhura (89.4%), Gasange (88.4%) and Murambi (88.0%) while it is low in Gatsibo (67.0%) and Kabarore (69.1%). Crop farming households are more prevalent in Muhura (84.6%), Murambi (83.3%) and Gasange (83.2%). The percentage of households engaged in crop farming is low in Gatsibo (61.0%), Kabarore (62.8%) and Ngarama (63.0). Sectors with high percentage of households engaged in livestock husbandry are Muhura (70.8%) and Gasange (70.1%), whereas the ones with low percentage are Kabarore (40.4%) and Rwimbogo (45.2%).

5.2 Distribution of private household engaged in crop farming of different types of crops, by Sector

The results of 5th Population and housing census 2022 indicate that the most cultivated crops by the private households of Gatsibo district are beans, banana, sorghum, cassava, sweet potato beans, sorghum, sweet potato, maize, fruits and vegetables.

5.3 Distribution of private households engaged in raising different types of livestock, by Sector

Nationally and in the Eastern Province, the results of the census indicate that most private households are considerably more engaged in raising cows, goats and chicken than other livestock. **Error! Reference source not found.** indicates that, in Rwanda most of the private households are engaged in raising of cows (925,808 HHs), goats (643,420 HHs) and pigs (494,305 HHs) compared to other types of livestock. At Provincial level, private households are more engaged in raising of goats (241,558 HHs) followed by cows (166,551 HHs) and Chickens (119,812 HHs) comparatively to other types of livestock raised in the Eastern Province. In Gatsibo district, private households are more engaged in raising of cows (40,210 HHs), goats (39,830 HHs) and Chickens (18,131 HHs).

Results presented in **Error! Reference source not found.** show that, the livestock raising substantially vary across sectors in Gatsibo district . Cows are mostly raised by a large number of private households in Muhura (4,239 HHs) and less raised in Ngarama sector (1,842 HHs). Goats are mostly raised by many households in Murambi (3,412 HHs) and raised by few households in Gasange sector (1,978 HHs). Chickens are mostly raised by many households in Kabarore (2,235 HHs) and raised by few households in Gasange sector (786 HHs).
