

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FOREWORD

The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.

Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. They include Ministries and other Government institutions, international organizations such as the World Bank (WB), the European Union (EU), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), One-UN, UN Women, UNICEF, UNECA, the United Kingdom AID (UKAID), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the USAID, Enabel, PARIS 21 and others for their support in diverse ways.

My special thanks go to the local government leaders from the province to the village levels who contributed a lot to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. Exceptional gratitude to all enumerators, teachers and young people who collected the information and all respondents for their cooperation and dedication. The National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) deserves special appreciation for the excellent operational and coordination of all census activities.



CHAPTER 1: POPULATION SIZE, SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION, AND STRUCTURE

1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population

1.1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Eastern Province

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census enumerated a total of 3,563,145 residents in the Eastern Province. This population accounts for approximately 26.9% of the overall population of Rwanda, which stands at 13,246,394 residents. Notably, the Eastern Province has a predominance of female residents, with a count of 1,828,751 males, making up around 51.3% of the province's total population.

Among the districts in the Eastern Province, Nyagatare emerges as the most populated, with a recorded population of 653,861 residents in 2022. This figure represents 18.4% of the total population residing in the Eastern Province. Conversely, the least populated district in the Eastern Province is Ngoma, with a population of 404,048 inhabitants. This corresponds to 11.3% of the total resident population in the Eastern Province.



1.1.2 Population Density of the Eastern Province by District

Population density is a crucial measure that quantifies the number of individuals residing within a given unit of land area. It is typically expressed as the number of inhabitants per square kilometer (Km²).


The figure below shows that the overall population density in Rwanda is estimated to be 503 inhabitants per Km². Within the Eastern Province, the population density stands at 433 inhabitants per Km². Rwamagana District exhibits a higher population density compared to other districts, with a value of 740 inhabitants per Km². Conversely, Kayonza District has lower population density, with 338 inhabitants per Km².

1.1.3 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of the Rwamagana District

The previous table (Table 1.1) highlights that the Rwamagana District was enumerated with a total of 484,953 residents, representing approximately 13.6% of the total population in the Eastern Province. In terms of gender distribution, the population of Rwamagana District is predominantly male, with 243,794 males comprising 50.3% of the total population. Table 1.2, presented below, provides detailed information on the population of Rwamagana district at sector level by sex. Females outnumber males in sectors such as Munyaga (52.9%), Fumbwe (52.6%), Munyiginya (52.5%), Rubona (52.4%), and Musha (52%). On the other hand, the share of females in Muhazi is 34.3%. Furthermore, the table reveals the top two most populated sectors in Rwamagana District, are Muyumbu (56,881) and Muhazi (53,482). Conversely, the less populated sectors are Nzige (19,285) and Munyaga (20,812)

1.1.4 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Rwamagana District by Area of Residence

The results of Rwanda Population and Housing Census 2022 (RPHC-2022) revealed that, the total population of Rwanda are spatially distributed in rural area represent 72.1% and urban area represent 27.9%. The Eastern Province is predominantly by the rural areas (79.1%) and urban areas (20.9%). Rwamagana District population lives predominantly in rural area (62.9%) while resident population in urban represents 37.1%. The sectors of Rwamagana District which are entirely rural are Munyaga, Nzige and Rubona sector while the following sectors have a high percentage of urbanization: Kigabiro(72.6%), Muyumbu(65.3%) and Muhazi(61.9%).

1.1.5 Age-Sex Structure of the Population of Rwamagana District

The population of Rwamagana District is predominantly composed of the young population, with approximately 56.05% of the resident population being under 25 years old. This demographic characteristic is represented in the age pyramid (Figure 1.2), which indicates a high level of fertility in the recent past. On the other hand, the elderly population (aged 60 years and above) accounts for 5.83% of the total population in the district. Table 1.4 below illustrates the results, and more details of sectors are in the annex.



1.1.6 Population Share (%) of Some Specific Interventions Target Groups in Rwamagana District by Sex

The Rwanda Population and Housing Census 2022 plays a crucial role in identifying specific age-based programs, policies, and strategies that are designed to address the needs of various population groups. It provides valuable information for interventions in areas such as health, education, employment, and more, enabling targeted interventions based on population categories and their respective characteristics. For instance, children under five years for immunization programs (Under 5 years children), children in school age (3-17 years), people in the official working age group (16 years and above), etc. Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The below table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Rwamagana district. The population aged 0-17 represents 43.5 % of the total population of the district, 16-30 years represent 27.0%; the working age population 16 and above represents 60.9 % of the same population. The table below shows distribution of Rwamagana district by targeted interventions by their age.

CHAPTER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

2.1 Socio-Cultural Characteristics of the Population

2.1.1 Nationality of the Population of Rwamagana District

The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the Rwandan population represent 99.1% and foreigners represent 0.9% at national level. In the Eastern Province, foreigners represent 1.7% and 0.2% in Rwamagana District that is to say 1,042 residents' foreigners. Two sectors of Rwamagana Districts that have the highest percentage of foreigners compared to others are Kigabiro and Muhazi (0.5% each). The table below illustrates the distribution of the population by nationality with their respective sectors of residence.

2.1.2 Religious Affiliation of the Resident Population of Rwamagana District

In Rwamagana District, Christianity is the predominant religion: 35.82% are catholic, 26.36% are ADEPR, 11.99% are protestant, 11.3% are Adventist. Other religious represented are Muslim (3.10%) and Jehovah witness are (0.93%) while 3.94% of the resident population declared themselves to be without religion.

2.2 Marital Status of the Resident Population of Rwamagana District

2.2.1 Marital Status by Sector

The results of 5RPHC-2022 revealed that 49.2% of the resident population of Rwamagana District aged 12 and above were living in union (married officially to one wife/husband, married not officially to one wife/husband, live in polygamous union) at the time of the census ,43.9% were never married while 4.3% were widowed, 2.2% separated and 0.2% divorced. At the sector level, 3 sectors with the highest percentage of the currently living in union are: Muyumbu (53.7%) and Nyakaliro (53.3%) while sectors with the highest percentages of the never married persons are found in Gishali (48.7%) Muhazi (46.5%), Kigabiro(45.3%) and Mwurire(45.2%). Munyaga and Munyiginya and Rubona sectors have high percentage of widowed persons (6.2% and 5.7% respectively).

2.2.2 Marital Status by Age Groups

The percentages of resident population of Rwamagana District by marital status vary by age: The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.9% (age group of 12-14 years) to 1.9% (age group of 80 years and above). The percentage of persons currently married starts by increasing from 0.1% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 83.7% (age group of 40-44 years) before decreasing to 47.6% (age group 80+) due mainly to widowhood (49.7%). The highest percentages of divorced persons are observed within the age groups 40-44, 45-49, 50-54 (0.7 each %) while the highest percentages of the separated persons are found in the age group 40-54 years (4.6%) and the age group 40-44 years (4.5%).

2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population

2.3.1 School Attendance

Table 2.5 below shows that, in Rwamagana District, 50.2% of pre-primary-age population (3-5 years) are currently attending school, 49.8% of children have never attended and 0% of children have previously attended (i.e children who have already had prior exposure to nursery school education before the time of census but who were not attending nursery school/dropped-out during census time). Nyakaliro Sector has the highest proportion of children (age between 3 to 5) currently attending school in Rwamagana District (58.2%).

Following closely, the Muyumbu Sector has a percentage of 58.1% of children currently attending school. Rubona sector has the lowest percentage of children currently attending school, with only 33.3% enrolled. On the other hand, Rubona and Musha sectors have the highest proportion of children aged 3 to 5 who have never attended school (66.7% and 62.9%, respectively).

Table 2.6 shows that in Rwamagana District 89.9% of children aged 6 to 11 years (the official primary school-going age) are currently attending school 8.4% have never attended school and only 1.7% have previously attend school (which means that 10% of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school). By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) across sectors in Rwamagana District, comparisons reveal the disparities in primary school attendance across different sectors within Rwamagana District. Sectors like Fumbwe(85.5%), Munyiginya and Rubona(86.9% each) exhibit lower rates of children currently attending school and higher rates of children who have never attended (12.9%, 10.4% against 11.0%) and, sectors like Karenge, Muyumbu(83.7% each) and Nyakaliro(83.6%) demonstrate higher rates of children currently attending school and lower rates of children who have never attended (5.3%, 5.6% against 4.4%, respectively).

In Rwamagana District 24.4% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school (i.e. they dropped out of school), 72.8% are currently attending school and 2.8% have never attended secondary school. The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) across sectors in Rwamagana District shows that Muhazi sector has the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school at 78.7%. Conversely, Rubona sector has the lowest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school with 68.2%. Munyaga Sector has the highest percentage of the population between the ages of 12 and 17 who have never attended school at 4%.

2.3.2 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Primary School

Gross and Net Attendance Ratios are used to measure the extent of coverage of an educational program. It gives a comparison of the children attending school with the total size of the school-age population. It can also be used for assessing how far a country has succeeded in bringing to school all those who are eligible to attend.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years). The gross attendance rate in Rwanda is 141.7, in the Eastern Province GAR is 141.7% and 136.9% in Rwamagana District. The Net Attendance Rate (NAR) in Primary school for Rwamagana district (89.9%) is above the NAR of the Eastern Province (87.4%) and that of the national level (89.3%).

A Gross Attendance Rate (GAR) of 136.9% in Rwamagana District for the population 6 to 11 years indicates a high percentage of those who attended primary schools aged below 6 years and or above 11 years. On the other hand, the NAR of 89.4% for the population 6 to 11 years indicates that only 89.9% of the population 6 to 11 years were attending primary schools in Rwamagana District by 2022

Table 2.8 shows that the students older or younger than the official primary school age range made up 34.3% $[(GAR136.9 - NAR89.9)/GAR136.9]$ of the primary school population of Rwamagana District.

The analysis at sector level shows that Karengwe and Muyumbu have the highest (93.6% each) percentage of children that are attending primary school and are of primary school-age(NAR). In comparison to other sectors, the Fumbwe sector has the lowest NAR at 85.4%, indicating a lesser percentage of children who are attending primary school within the eligible age range. Almost all sectors have gender parity indexes greater than 1.00%, which means that in all sectors of Rwamagana District, there is a better access to education for female students compared to male students.

2.3.3 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Secondary School

The table 2. 9 provides information on the gross and net attendance rates in the secondary school level (12-17 years) in Rwamagana District, disaggregated by sex and sector. Rwamagana District have higher NARs(25.4%) and GARs(42.1%) than both the national(18.8% for NAR and 39.8%) for GAR) and Provincial average(16.3% for NAR and 34.7% for GAR). Comparing males and females in Rwamagana District in terms of Net Attendance Rates (NAR), the table 2. 9 indicates a higher proportion of females 30.2%, within the secondary school-age range (12-17 years), compared to males one(20.5%).

Female students older or younger than the official secondary school age range made up 37.1 % $[(GAR48.0 - NAR30.2)/GAR48.0]$ of the female with secondary school age of Rwamagana District, while for male students it made up 43.2% $[(GAR36.1 - NAR20.5)/GAR36.1]$. This shows that females have a higher attendance rate in Rwamagana District compared to males when considering the overall attendance rates, regardless of age or grade-level eligibility.

Among the sectors in Rwamagana District, Muhazi has the highest GAR for both sexes, with 55.4% and the highest NAR for both sexes in Rwamagana District(31.6%) while Munyaga sector has the lowest for both GAR (30.0%) and NAR (16.7%) in the district.

2.3.4 Highest level of School Attended in Rwamagana District

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate the total population of Rwanda aged 3 and above is 11,999,691. The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary and University. In Rwanda, 16.7% of the population aged 3 years and above has never attended school, while 2.7% have attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, 7.1% for upper secondary and 3.6% for university.

The total population of the Eastern Province aged 3 and above is 3,215,103 while it is 442,056 in Rwamagana district. The distribution of the highest level of education attended is like the national level, with slight variations. In the Eastern Province, 18.1% of the population has never attended school, while 2.9% have attended nursery, and 60.9% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.6% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.3% for lower secondary, 6.0% for upper secondary, 2.2% for university, and a small proportion 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of Rwamagana District aged 3 and above is 442,056. In Rwamagana District, 15.6% of the population has never attended school, while 2.9% have attended nursery, and 59.1% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 10.5% for lower secondary, 7.8% for upper secondary, 3.3% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The distribution of the highest level of education attended varies among sectors, with differences in the percentage of individuals at each education level. For example, Munyaga has a higher percentage (20.4%) of individuals who have never attended school compared to other sectors, while Nzige has a higher percentage (65.7%) of individuals attended primary school, Karenge and Muyumbu(1.1% each) have higher percentages of individuals who have attended Ingoboka/vocational school, Kigabiro has a higher percentage of individuals who have attended low secondary school(12.2%) and university level(6.4%) while Gishari (13.3%) has a high percentage of individuals who have attended upper secondary school. Each sector has its own unique distribution of educational levels attended by the population. The table below indicates the findings:

2.4 Characteristics of the Employed Population

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Aggregate employment generally increases with growing population. Therefore, the ratio of Employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment-to-population ratio is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

2.4.1 Employment to Population Ratio by Sex, Province, District and Area of Residence

The results presented in the below table 2.11 shows that the employment to population ratio stood at 45.9% in Rwanda, it is lower among females (40.2%) than males (52.4%). On the other side, it was observed that the employment to population ratio is higher in urban areas of Rwanda (53.5%) than in rural areas (42.7%). It was observed that in Eastern province, the employment to population ratio stood at 47.9%, it is higher in urban areas (53.1%) than in rural areas (46.5%). In Rwamagana, the employment to population ratio stood 50.7% of residents aged 16 and above while for males stood at 58.7% and 43.7% for females. In urban, the employment rate is 54.4% for both sexes where it 64.7% for males and 45.3% for females while in rural, it is 48.7% for both sexes and it is 55.5% for males and 42.8% for females.



2.4.2 Employment to Population Ratio(EPR) Among the Resident Population of Rwamagana aged 16 Years and Above by Age Group and Sex

Figure 2.1 allows the study of intensity of Employment to Population Ratio (EPR) and its variation by sex. The figure reveals the following remarks: The employment to population ratio among males as well as females increases from age group 16-19 to 35-39 and starts decreasing from age group 40-44 to 85 years and above as people starts getting very older and retire. It was observed that in district of Rwamagana, the highest employment to population ratio among males stands at 72.9% and was observed in age group 30-34, On the other side the highest employment to population among females is 54.8% and was observed in the age group 35-39. The lowest employment to population ratio among males and females stands at 9.9% and 5.7% respectively in the age group 85+.

CHAPTER 3: SUB-POPULATION

3.1 Children Population (0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda, as stipulated in Article 3 of the National Law n° 54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child, which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0–17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

3.1.1 Number and Share of Children in Rwamagana District

At the national level, the population of children comprises 44.5% of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394). In the Eastern Province, there are 1,656,727 children, accounting for 46.5% of the total resident population. In Rwamagana District, children make up 43.5% of the resident population, with a slightly higher percentage of females (43.8%) compared to males (43.2%). When examining the sector level, Musha, Gahengeri, and Fumbwe have a high proportion of children, with percentages of 47.7%, 47.5%, and 47.1% respectively. Conversely, Muhazi has a relatively small percentage of children at 29.1%.

3.1.2 Children with Legal Birth Registration in Rwamagana District

The findings from the 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that the national level birth registration rate for children stands at 94.3%. In Rwamagana District, the rate of birth registration is slightly lower but still substantial at 94.0%. While there is not a significant disparity in registration rates between gender (94.1% for male and 94.0% for female). Census shows that urban areas exhibit a higher rate of birth registration at 94.6%, compared to rural areas which have a slightly lower rate of 93.7%.

3.1.3 Birth Registration by Sector

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 reveal considerable variation in birth registration rates across sectors and areas of residence. It is important to note that Munyaga, Nzige, and Rubona sectors do not have urban areas. Notably, higher percentages of birth registrations are observed in Gishali (96.7%), Karenge (95.9%), and Muhazi (95.5%) sectors, while the lowest percentages are found in Mwulire and Nyakaliro sectors (92.3% each). Moreover, the percentage of birth registration for males is nearly identical to that of females, indicating a balanced distribution of registration across gender.

3.2 Youth Population (16-30 years)

For statistical purposes, the United Nations defines "youth" as those persons between the ages of 15 and 24 years, without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda's Development, the definition of Youth in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14 -35 years to 16–30 years.

3.2.1 Number and Share (%) of the Youth Population in Rwamagana District

The findings from the 5th RPHC-2022 shows that the youth population accounts for 27.14% (3,595,670) of the total population of 13,246,394. in Rwamagana district, the youth population is 130,746, which represents 27% of the total resident population of the district (484,953). When examining the sector-level distribution, Muhazi sector takes the lead with the highest share of youth at 33.4%, followed by Gishali sector at 29.9%, and Kigabiro sector at 29.1%. On the other hand, Gahengeri and Rubona sectors have the lowest share of youth, each accounting for 24.1%. These figures provide valuable insights into the demographic composition of the youth population across different sectors within the district.

3.2.2 Educational Characteristics of Youth

At the national level, youth who have never attended school make up 5.1% of the total youth resident population. In the Eastern Province, this figure increases slightly to 6.0% of the total resident population, and in Rwamagana district, it stands at 5.3% of the total resident population. The percentage of youth who have never attended school exhibits variability across sectors within Rwamagana district. Muhazi sector records the highest percentage at 12.7%, indicating a significant proportion of youth who have not had access to formal education. Conversely, Karengé and Nyakaliro sectors have the lowest percentages, each registering a figure of 2.5%.

3.2.3 Highest Level of Education Attended by Youth in Rwamagana District

In Rwamagana District, the educational attainment levels among the youth population are as follows: 48.8% have attended only the primary school level, 22.9% have attended lower secondary education, 17.6% have achieved upper secondary education, 4.4% have obtained a university degree, and 5.3% have never attended school. The highest level of education attended varies significantly across sectors within the District. Muhazi sector records the highest percentage of youth who have never attended school at 12.7%. On the other hand, Gishali sector stands out with a high percentage of youth who have attended a university level education at 8.3%. Rubona sector, in contrast, has the highest percentage of youth with primary education at 58.8%.

3.2.4 Employment to Population ratio Among Youth(16-30).

The Census results showed that In Rwanda the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.3%, it is higher among males than females 44.8% and 36.2% respectively. In Rwamagana District, 43.6% of the youth were employed during the seven days preceding the census. Notably, there are high percentages of employed youth in Gishali (49.9%), Muyumbu (49.1%), and Nyakaliro (47.3%) sectors. Conversely, Nzige, Mwulire and Musha sectors report a considerably lower percentage of employed youth at 35.7%, 37.3% and 37.4% respectively.

3.2.5 Distribution (%) of the Currently Employed Youthaged 16-30 Years by Province, District, Sector and Status in Employment

In Rwamagana district, the majority of youth aged 16-30 currently employed are employees (65.0%) followed by own account worker without regular employees (28.7%). Among the youth employees, the highest percentage can be found in Musha sector at 74.9%. On the other hand, Munyaga sector reports the lowest percentage of youth employees at 52.3%. When considering self-employed youth, Munyaga sector holds the highest share at 35.9%, Conversely, Musha sector has the lowest percentage of self-employed youth at 20.3%.

2.2.6 Proportion of Youth (16-30) Neither in Employment nor in Education or Training in Eastern Province by Sex, District, and Area of Residence.

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, In Rwanda the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training stood at 39.5 %. It is higher among females (43.8 %) than males (34.9 %). In Eastern Province, the proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training is 38.9%, it is lower among males (34.5%) than females (43.1%). 2022 census results also revealed that the proportion is higher in rural areas (39.1%) than in urban areas (32.6%). The proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among people residing in Rwamagana District stood at 36.7%. It is much higher (39.1%) among people residing in rural areas of Rwamagana District than the ones residing in urban areas of Rwamagana District (32.6%).

3.3 Persons with Disabilities

In 2015, 193 countries agreed to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals with a commitment where possible, “to disaggregate the statistics they generate by disability to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities (PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programmes, or are included in the workforce.

At the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 years and above are living with a disability. In Rwamagana District, the prevalence rate of disability is slightly lower at 3.1%. When examining the sector-level data, it is observed that certain sectors have higher prevalence rates of disability among the resident population aged 5 years and above. Munyaga sector records the highest prevalence rate at 5.2%, followed by Munyiginya sector at 4.6%. On the other hand, Nyakaliro, Rubona and Karengye sector report the lowest prevalence rate at 2.1%, 2.3% and 2.4% respectively.

Regarding the prevalence of disability among the population age 5 years and above by type of disability, there is a minor variation at all levels, Rwamagana district shows that 1.43% have a disability of seeing, 1.00% have a disability of walking. All the remaining type of disabilities (Self-care, short stature, and albinism their respective prevalence) are under 1.00%% across all districts of Eastern province. The table below indicates that in Rwamagana District the prevalence of disability of seeing is at 1.31%, 0.93% have a disability of walking, 0.52 % have a disability of remembering or concentrating and 0.50% have a disability of hearing.

3.4 Elderly Population(60 Years and Above)

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person.

It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action programme, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programmes on ageing. This was done to guarantee economic and social security to older people and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

3.4.1 Elderly Population of Rwamagana District by Sector

In 2022, the elderly population accounted for 5.8% of the total resident population in Rwamagana District. Notably, the share of elderly females is higher at 6.7% compared to the male population at 5.0%. When examining the distribution of the elderly population across sectors, it is observed that Munyaga sector has the highest proportion at 7.7%, followed by Muhazi sector at 7.1% and Karengye sector at 7.0%. On the other hand, Muyumbu sector and Nyakaliro sector report the lowest percentages, with 4.0% and 4.4% respectively.

3.4.2 Employment Among Elderly People

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.2%. The share is higher among the elderly males (33.7%) than elderly females (24.3%). In Rwamagana District, it is evident that people continue working well into old age, as demonstrated by the fact that 31.1% of elderly individuals were employed. Notably, the percentage of employed elderly males is higher than that of elderly females, with figures of 35.4% and 27.9% respectively. When analyzing employment among elderly residents at the sector level, it is observed that Karenge sector reports the highest percentage at 38.5%, followed closely by Munyiginya sector at 38.2%. Conversely, Muhazi sector record lowest employment rates among the elderly, with 19.6%.

3.4.3 Marital Status of Elderly People

In Rwamagana District, a significant portion of the elderly population, approximately two-thirds (62.6%), are married, while a third (32.0%) are widowed. The rate of celibacy among the elderly is 2.8%, and the divorce or separation rate stand at 2.7%. The practice of being married to one spouse without official documentation, which is commonly referred to as informal marriage, is more prevalent among the elderly in certain sectors. Muhazi sector records the highest percentage at 14.1%, followed closely by Munyaga sector at 13.8%. Additionally, both Musha and Rubona sectors report the same percentage of 12.8% in this category.

CHAPTER 4: HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

4.1 Household Characteristics

In this chapter, the 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, households' heads by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and cooking, water sources, sanitation facilities, asset possessed by household and mode of waste and disposals.

4.1.1 Number and mean size of the private households

The findings from the 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (RPHC) of 2022 reveal that there are a total of 3,312,743 private households in Rwanda. Specifically, in the Eastern Province, the census recorded 886,132 private households, while in the Rwamagana District alone, there are 121,051 private households. On average, each household in the Rwamagana District consists of 3.8 individuals. When examining the household sizes at the sector level, the highest average sizes were observed in Musha, where households contain an average of 4 persons each. Conversely, the smallest household sizes were found in Kigabiro, with an average of 3.6 individuals per household.

4.1.2 Private Households' Heads of Rwamagana District

According to the findings of the 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (RPHC) conducted in 2022, it was revealed that on a national scale, 28.9% of private households are led by female. In the specific context of Rwamagana District, the percentage of private households headed by females is slightly higher, at 30.3%. Analyzing the data at the sector level, it shows that the sectors with the highest proportions of households led by females are Muhazi sector and Munyaga sector with 35.6% each. On the other hand, the sectors with the lowest percentages of households headed by female are Muyumbu sector with 24.8% and Nyakaliro sector with 25.9%.

4.2 Housing Characteristics

4.2.1 Type of Habitat

The findings from the 5th Population and Housing Census of 2022 reveal that in the Eastern Province, the predominant type of habitat is Umudugudu, which refers to planned rural settlements, accounting for 86.5% of the housing structures. This percentage is quite similar to the situation in Rwamagana District, which is one of the Districts within the Eastern Province, where 82.8% of the housing structures also fall under the category of Umudugudu, followed by dispersed/ isolated housing with 10.9%. The type of habitat varies across sectors. Umudugudu/Planned rural settlement is most prevalent in Gishari (96.4%) and Munyaga (94.6%) and low in Nyakaliro (59.1%) . The sectors with the high percentages of dispersed/isolated housing units are Gahengeri(26.1%), Nyakaliro(23.5%) and Fumbwe(20.3%). The table below displays results by sector.



When analyzing the distribution of type of habitat based on the area of residence, it is evident that the predominant type is planned rural settlement. This holds true for both urban areas, where planned rural settlements account for 83.6% of the habitat types, and rural areas, where the distribution remains consistent at 82.3%.

4.2.2 Tenure of the housing

According to the findings from the 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (RPHC) conducted in 2022, the ownership of housing units in the Eastern Province accounts for 72.1% of the total, while tenants represent 21.1%. Specifically, in the Rwamagana District, 26.1% of housing units are occupied by tenants, while a significant majority of 67.8% are occupied by their owners. When examining the data at the sector level, it is noteworthy that sectors such as Rubona, Nzige and Musha have a high percentage of households where the housing units are owned by the occupants, with rates of 80.9%, 78.7%, and 78.5% respectively. On the other hand, the sector with the lowest percentage of housing units owned by occupants is Kigabiro, where 51.0% of the units are owned. In terms of housing units occupied by tenants, Kigabiro has the highest percentage (44.0%), followed by Muyumbu with 35.5%, and Muhazi with 31.6%. Conversely, sectors like Rubona, Musha, and Nzige have the lowest percentages of housing units occupied by tenants, with rates of 14.7% each for Rubona and Musha, and 16.3% for Nzige.



Based on the area of residence, it is evident that two types of tenure for housing units, namely owners and tenants, prevail both in urban and rural areas.

The percentage of housing units owned by occupants is 52.6% in urban areas and rises to 75.9% in rural areas. Conversely, the percentage of housing units occupied by tenants is 41.2% in urban areas and decreases to 18.0% in rural areas.

4.2.3 Material of the Housing Units

4.2.3.1 Main Materials of the Roof

The results of the 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units in Rwanda are primarily covered by iron sheets, accounting for 74.1% of the total. In the Eastern Province, this trend is even more pronounced, with iron sheets covering 98.9% of housing units. Specifically, in the Rwamagana District, a significant proportion of housing units, representing 99.6%, are covered by iron sheets.

Across all sectors of Rwamagana District, the distribution of housing units covered by iron sheets remains consistent, with at least 99% of households utilizing this type of roofing material. The only exception is Muhazi sector, where 98.4% of households use iron sheets as their roofing material.



Based on the area of residence, it is evident that the predominant roofing material in both urban areas and rural areas is iron sheets. In urban areas, iron sheets account for 99.6% of the roofing materials used, while in rural areas, they represent 99.5% of the roofing materials chosen.

4.2.3.2 Main Materials of the Walls

According to the census results, the most used material for the walls of housing units is sundried bricks with cement. This material accounts for 36.3% of the walls in Rwanda as a whole, 36.4% in the Eastern Province, and 40.2% specifically in the Rwamagana District. When examining the data at the sector level, Nyakaliro sector has the highest percentage of housing units using sundried bricks with cement for the walls, with a rate of 60.8%, followed closely by Muyumbu sector with 59.8%, while sun dried bricks without cement are most used in Nzige(44.1%) and Karenge(37.2%). The third place is occupied by woods with mud without cement, where they are most found in Munyaga(64.5%).



Based on the area of residence in Rwamagana District, the primary materials used for the walls of housing units vary between urban and rural areas. In urban areas, the most used material is sun-dried bricks with cement, accounting for 59.8% of the walls. It is followed by sun-dried bricks without cement at 14.0%, and wood with mud and cement (9.6%). In contrast, in rural areas, the predominant materials for wall construction are wood with mud with cement, comprising 29.7% of the walls. This is followed by wood with mud without cement at 28.1%, and sun-dried bricks without cement at 24.4%. The specific distribution of wall materials differs between urban and rural areas within Rwamagana District.

4.2.3.3 Main Materials of the Floor

The results of the 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (RPHC) conducted in 2022 reveal that the primary material used for the floor of housing units nationwide is Earth, accounting for 60.4% of the total. In the Eastern Province, however, Earth is the main material used for the floor of housing units, representing 60.9% of the cases. Similarly, in Rwamagana District, Earth is the predominant material for the floor, comprising 55.0% of the cases, followed by cement at 37.1%. At the sector level, Nzige and Rubona have the highest usage of Earth as the main material for the floor, with rates of 73.6% and 72.7% respectively. On the other hand, the highest percentage of the housing units with Cement as main material used for the floor is found in Kigabiro(54.5%), Muyumbu(45.1%) and Muhazi(45.0%).



Based on the area of residence, the results of the census indicate that the predominant materials used for the floor of housing units differ between urban and rural areas. In urban areas, the main material used for the floor is cement with 57.9%. It is followed by earth at 33.8% and ceramic/clays/granite tiles(5.9%). On the other hand, in rural areas, the predominant materials for the floor are earth, representing 66.3% of the cases, followed by cement at 26.1% and dung hardened(6.4%). These findings highlight the variations in the use of flooring materials based on the area of residence, with cement being more prevalent in urban areas and earth being more commonly used in rural areas.

4.3 Source of Energy of the Private Households

4.3.1 Grid Line Connectivity in Rwamagana District

At national level, the results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 52.5% of private households are connected to the national grid while 47.2% are not connected. In Eastern Province, the percentage of private household connected to the national grid line is 47.3% while it is 59.4% in Rwamagana District. At the sector level, four sectors (Gahengeri, Musha, Nzige and Rubona) have below 50% of private households connected to grid line.



4.3.2 Main Source of Energy for Lighting in Rwamagana District

In Rwamagana District, the main source of energy for lighting used by households are electricity(67.6%), flashlight/phone flashlight(24.2%) and candles(4.6%). At the sector level, the percentages of households using electricity for lighting are high in Kigabiro with 79.7%, Muyumbu with 75.9%, Muhazi and Karengye with 74.2% each, and Nyakaliro with 71.6%. The sectors with the high percentages of private households using flashlight/phone flashlight for lighting are Rubona(39.3%) and Musha(37.1%) while the sector with the high percentage of private households using candles is Muyumbu(6.7%).



Based on the area of residence, the main source of energy for lighting differs between rural and urban areas. In rural areas, the primary source of energy for lighting is electricity, accounting for 60% of households. This is followed by flashlight/phone flashlight usage at 31.2%, and candles at 4.2%. In contrast, in urban areas, a larger proportion of households, specifically 81.9%, rely on electricity as their main source of energy for lighting. Only a smaller percentage, 11.1%, use flashlight/phone flashlight for lighting purposes and 5.1% of private households use candles.

4.3.3 Main Sources of Energy for Cooking in Rwamagana District

At the District level, the main sources of energy for cooking used by private households are firewood, accounting for 73.7% of households, followed by charcoal at 22%, and gas at 2.4%. When examining the data at the sector level, it becomes evident that firewood is the most commonly used source of cooking energy by private households in Munyaga sector, representing 95.8% of households, followed by Rubona with 94.4%, and Nzige with 93.3%. In terms of households using charcoal as the main source of cooking energy, the sectors with the highest percentages are Muyumbu with 45.4% and Kigabiro with 43.3%.

Regarding gas as the main source of cooking energy, the sector with the highest percentage of private households using it is Kigabiro with 6.3%.



4.3.4 Water and Sanitation of the Private Households in Rwamagana District

4.3.4.1 Main source of drinking water

The results of the 5RPHC 2022 reveal that improved drinking water sources are the most common water sources in Rwanda, accounting for 82.3% of the total. In Rwamagana District, a higher percentage of private households, specifically 90.5%, use improved drinking water sources. At the sector level, the percentage of the private households using water from improved drinking sources are highest in Kigabiro (98.5%) and Munyaga (98.2%), and the lowest in Karengwe (77.7%).



4.3.4.2 Main Type of Toilet Facility

The results of the census indicate that the main types of toilet facilities used by private households in Rwanda are "Not shared Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household" accounting for 68.8% of households. In Rwamagana District, the main types of toilet facilities used by private households are "Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one HH" at 73.9%, followed by "Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by several HHs" at 17.4% and "Pit Latrine without constructed floor slab used by one HH" at 5.4%. At the sector level within Rwamagana District, the percentages of households using "Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one HH" are high in Rubona with 84.5%, Musha with 83.3%, Karenge with 82.3%, and Nzige with 81.7%. The lowest percentage is found in Kigabiro at 59.5%.

The high percentages of households using "Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by several HHs" are high in Kigabiro(29.8%) and Muyumbu(25.3%) while it is low in Rubona (9.7%). For pit latrines without constructed floor slab used by one household, Fumbwe (9.4%) and Gahengeri (8.6%) are the sectors with the high percentage of private households using this kind of toilet.



According to the area of residence in Rwamagana district, the type of toilet facility used by the private households varies. In urban areas, the most used types of toilets are "Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one HH" with 63.6% of households and "Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by several HHs" at 27.5%, followed by "Flush toilets not shared" with 4.2% of households. In rural areas, the main types of toilets used is Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one Household (79.4%) and Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by several Households (12.1%), followed by "Pit Latrine without constructed floor slab used by one HH" at 6.6%. 4.3.4.3 Mode of Waste Disposal in Rwamagana District

The results of the census show that in Rwamagana District, 75.1% of households choose to evacuate their waste through household compost dumping. This method involves disposing of waste in a composting system within the household. On the other hand, 17.0% of private households evacuate their waste by throwing it in their fields or bushes. Only, 3.4% of private households evacuate them by using companies in charge of waste collection. At the sector level within Rwamagana District, there are variations in waste disposal practices. The sectors with the highest percentages of households using household compost dumping are Munyaga at 87.7% and Karenge at 85.1%. The high percentages of private households evacuating their waste by throwing it in their fields or bushes are most found in Fumbwe (30.9%) and Muyumbu(28.8%). In contrast, Kigabiro has the highest percentage (14.3%) of households that utilize waste by using collection companies.



The results of the census indicate the main modes of waste disposal used by the households vary also by area of residence: In urban areas, the households evacuate their domestic waste mainly by using compost dumping (65.3%). Other private households evacuate their domestic waste by throwing them in household's fields or in the bushes (19.3%), for other private households, their waste is collected and evacuated by companies (9.0%) and other private

households evacuate their domestic waste by putting them in public compost dumping. In rural areas, the households evacuate their waste mainly by using compost dumping (80.3%) and others in their fields or in the bushes (15.8%). The figure below illustrates details:

4.4 Assets Possessed by Private Households in Rwamagana District

4.4.1 Communication Assets Possessed by Private Households in Rwamagana District

At the District level, the census results show that a significant percentage of private households possess various electronic devices. Specifically, 84.5% of private households possess a radio, 81.1% have a mobile phone, 22.7% own a smartphone, 15.1% possess a TV, and 3.2% have a computer. When looking at the distribution within the sectors, the percentage of private households possessing a radio is highest in Muyumbu (89.9%), Kigabiro (89.2%), and Nyakaliro (88.8%). On the other hand, the lowest percentage is observed in Munyaga (72.9%). The percentage of private households possessing a television is high in Kigabiro (24.4%), while the lowest percentage is in Munyaga (4.9%). Mobile phones are widely possessed by private households in Muyumbu (87.6%) and Kigabiro (86.5%). The sectors with high percentage of households with smartphone are Kigabiro (36.7%), Muhazi(29.5%) and Muyumbu (29.4%) while the percentage of households possessing this asset is low in Munyaga(9.4%). The computer is mostly possessed in Kigabiro(6.4%) and Muyumbu (5.5%).

4.4.2 Access to the Internet

According to the results of the 5th RPHC-2022, the percentage of households with at least one member using the internet is 22.2% at the national level. In the Eastern Province, this percentage is slightly lower at 18.1%, while in Rwamagana District, it is slightly higher at 23.7%. At the sector level, there are variations in the percentages of households with at least one member using the internet. The sectors of Kigabiro and Muhazi have the highest percentages, with 37.5% and 33.8% respectively. On the other hand, Munyaga and Rubona are the sectors with the lower percentages of households with at least one member using the internet, with 10.3% and 11.5% respectively.



According to the census results in Rwamagana District, access to the internet varies significantly depending on the area of residence. In urban areas, approximately 39.1% of private households have at least one member who can access the internet. However, in rural areas, the percentage drops to only 15.6% of private households having at least one member with internet access.

CHAPTER 5: AGRICULTURE IN RWAMAGANA DISTRICT

Agriculture was one of the areas of investigation during the 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022. The census captured data on households engaged in livestock husbandry, the number of private households involved in crop farming and cultivating various types of crops, categorized by sector. Additionally, the census also gathered information on private households involved in raising different types of livestock, classified by sector and the type of household residing in the district.

5.1 The Households Engaged in Crop Farming and Livestock Husbandry

The results of the 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (RPHC) conducted in 2022 revealed that nationally, 2,280,854 private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture. Among them, 62.6% are involved in crop farming, and 50.4% are engaged in livestock husbandry. Rwamagana District, located in the Eastern Province, is one of the districts where crop farming and animal husbandry are carried out on a small scale. In Rwamagana district, agricultural households make up 65.8% of the total, with 58.9% of households engaged in crop farming and 43.5% involved in livestock husbandry. Among the sectors within Rwamagana district, Kigabiro and Muyumbu have a lower number of households engaged in crop farming and livestock husbandry (less than 50%) compared to other sectors (44.2% and 48.2% respectively). Households engaged in crop farming are more represented in Munyaga (77.1%) and Musha (76.3%) while those engaged in livestock husbandry are in Nzige (60.6%) and Munyaga(56.3%).

5.2 Distribution of Private Household Engaged in Crop Farming of Different Types of Crops, by Sector

The results of 5th Population and housing census 2022 indicate that the most cultivated crops by the private households of Bugesera district are beans, fruits, maize, cassava, sorghum, banana and sweet potatoes. Private households cultivated beans are more found in Gahengeri, Gishali and Muyumbu while they are less in Nzige. Private households cultivated fruits are more found in Gahengeri and Musha. Gishali has the high number Private households cultivated maize and banana. Karenge has a high number of those cultivated sorghum while Nyakaliro and Fumbwe have a high number of those cultivated sweet potatoes.

5.3 Distribution of Private Households Engaged in Raising Different Types of Livestock, by Sector

According to the census results at both the national level and in the Eastern Province, it is evident that private households are significantly more involved in raising cows, goats, chickens, pigs, and sheep compared to other types of livestock. Similarly, in Rwamagana district, livestock raising is prevalent among households, with the following numbers for each category: goats (27,168), cows (23,137), chickens (15,998), pigs (9,569), rabbits (3,620), and sheep (3,009). The number of livestock reared by households varies across different sectors and depends on the specific type of livestock. The sectors that have high proportion of private households that are engaged in livestock are: Gahengeri, Karenge and Muyumbu where more than 6500 households declared engaged in livestock.
