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

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FOREWORD

The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.

Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. They include Ministries and other Government institutions, international organizations such as the World Bank (WB), the European Union (EU), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), One-UN, UN Women, UNICEF, UNECA, the United Kingdom AID (UKAID), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the USAID, Enabel, PARIS 21 and others for their support in diverse ways.

My special thanks go to the local government leaders from the province to the village levels who contributed a lot to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. Exceptional gratitude to all enumerators, teachers and young people who collected the information and all respondents for their cooperation and dedication. The National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) deserves special appreciation for the excellent operational and coordination of all census activities.



CHAPTER 1: POPULATION SIZE, SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION, AND STRUCTURE

1.1 Size and special Distribution of the population

1.1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Western province

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 2,896,484 residents in the Western province, which represents 21.8% of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394 residents). The population of the Western province is predominantly female; 1,511,849 are women corresponding to 52.2 % of the total population of the Western province. Rubavu is the most populated district with 546,683 residents in 2022. Its population represents 18.9% of the total residents' population of Western province. The least populated district in the Western province is Nyabihu with 319,047 inhabitants, corresponding to 11.0% of the total resident population of Western province.



1.1.2 Distribution of Population Density of the Western province by District

Population density is a measurement of population per unit land area. Density is the number of the inhabitant per Km². The Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022 revealed that, the population density in Rwanda is 503 inhabitants per Km². The Western province has 693 inhabitant per Km². The district with a high population density is Rubavu with 1,614 Inhabitants per km². The district with a lowest population density is Karongi with 482 Inhabitants per km². The figure below indicates distribution of population density per district.


Figure 1. 1 Population density (inhabitant per Km²) by district in Western province

1.1.3 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of the Rubavu district

The results in previous table 1.1 indicates that 546,683 residents were enumerated in Rubavu district, and the population share is 18.9% of the total population of Western province. The population of Rubavu district is predominantly female: 279,384 are women corresponding to 51.1 % of its the total population. The table below 1.2 indicates the number of the population of Rubavu district by sector, by sex, the percentage of female and their shares across sectors to the total population of Rubavu district.

Females are predominant in eleven out of 12 sectors of the district except Nyakiriba sector with 43.4% of total population of this above said sector. Rubavu (80,107 population) and Rugerero (66,926 population) are the most populated sectors. They represent 14.7% and 12.2% of the total population of Rubavu district, respectively. The two less populated sectors are Kanzenze (23,127 inhabitants) and Mudende (32077 inhabitants). They represent 4.2% and 5.9% of the total resident population of Rubavu district, respectively.

1.1.4 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Rubavu district by residence area

The results of Rwanda Population and housing census 2022 revealed that, the total population of Rwanda are spatially distributed in rural area that represent 72.1% and urban area represent 27.9%. The Western province is predominantly by the urban area (77.9%) and rural area (22.1%). Rubavu district population is predominantly by urban area 53.9% while rural represents 46.1%. Gisenyi is the sole urban sector within Rubavu district. The Table 1. 3 below illustrates the results.

1.1.5 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Rubavu district


Rubavu population is mostly young. 60.9% of the resident population of Rubavu is under 25 years, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past. The elderly (60 years and above) represents 4.8 % of the total population of the district. The percentage share of the population aged 0-14 represents 40.2%. The Table 1. 4 illustrates the results, and more details of sectors are in the annex.

1.1.6 population share (%) of some specific interventions target groups in Rubavu District by sex

The Rwanda population and housing census 2022 indicate the population on specific ages-based programs, policy and strategies interventions in health, education, employment and also indicates the population categories in their respective characteristics such as children, youth, working population, among other things. For instance, children under five years children for immunization programs (Under 5 children), children in school age (0-17 years), people in the official working age group (16-64 years and above), etc. Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The Table 1. 5 gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Rubavu district. The population aged 0-17 represents 47.5 % of the total population of the district, 16-30 years represent 28.1%; the working age population 16 and above represents 57.3 % of the same population. The table below shows distribution of Rubavu districts by targeted interventions by their age.

CHAPTER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

2.1 Socio-cultural characteristics of the population

2.1.1 Distribution (Count and %) of the resident population of Rubavu district by Nationality and by sector

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that, the Rwandan population by nationality represent 99.1% and foreigners represent 0.9%. In the Western province, foreigners represent 0.5% and Rubavu districts, the Rwandan by nationality represent 99.5% and foreigners represent 0.5% (2,780). The sector of Rubavu district that have the highest percentage of foreigners compared to others; is Gisenyi (3.3%). The Table 2. 1 illustrates the distribution of the population by nationality with their respective sectors of residence.

2.1.2 Religious affiliation of the resident population of Karongi District

In Rubavu District (Table 2. 2), Christianity is the predominant religion: 29.2% are Catholics, 23.7% are ADEPR, 16.3% are Adventists, 11.8% are protestants, and 7.0% are others Christians. Globally, 88.0% of the total population of Rubavu District are Christians. Other religious represented are Muslim (3.9%) and Jehovah witness (1.5%) while 2.8% of the resident population declared themselves to be without religion.

2.1.3 Marital Status of the resident population of Rubavu district aged 12 years and above by sex and by sector

The results of 5RPHC-2022 (Table 2. 3), 49.4% of the resident population of Rubavu district aged 12 and above were living in union (married officially to one wife/husband, married not officially to one wife/husband, live in polygamous union) at the time of the census, while 44.9% were never married. 4.2% were widowed, while separated and divorced were respectively 1.4% and 0.2%. At the sector level, two sectors, Busasamana (53.6%), Mudende (52.4%) and Nyakiriba (52.2%) have the highest percentages of the currently married people. Gisenyi (56.5%) and Nyamyumba (47.3) have the highest percentages of the never married persons. Kanzenze and Busasamana sectors have high percentage of widowed persons (5.1% and 5.0% respectively). Details of the resident population of Rubavu district aged 12 years and above by marital status and sex is presented in the annex.

2.1.4 Distribution (%) of the resident population of Rubavu district aged 12 years and above by Marital status, Age groups and Sex [Both sexes]

The percentages of resident population of Rubavu district by marital status vary by sex and age: The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.8% (age group of 12-14 years) to 2.3% (age group of 80 years and above). The percentage of persons currently living in union starts by increasing from 0.2% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 88.2% (age group of 40-44 years) before decreasing to 42.7% (age group 85+) due mainly to widowhood (54.6%). The highest percentage of divorced persons (0.5%) is observed from age group 45-49, while the highest percentage of the separated persons (2.5%) is found in age group 30-34, 35-39 and 40-44 years.

2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population of Rubavu district

2.3.1 School attendance

The Table 2. 5 below shows that, in Rubavu district, 34.1% of pre-primary-age population (3-5 years) are currently attending school, 65.9% of children have never attended and 0% of children have previously attended (i.e children who have already had prior exposure to nursery school education before the time of census but who were not attending nursery school/dropped-out during census time). Gisenyi Sector has the highest proportion of children (age between 3 to 5) currently attending school in Rubavu District (59.3%). Followed by the Nyundo Sector has a percentage of 45.0 % of children currently attending school. Busasamana sector has the lowest percentage of children currently attending school, with only 20.5% enrolled. On the other hand, Kanama and Busasamana sectors have the highest proportion of children aged 3 to 5 who have never attended school (76.6 and 79.5%, respectively).

Table 2. 6 shows that in Rubavu District 78.5% of children age 6 to 11 years (the official primary school-going age) are currently attending school, 19.6% have never attended school and only 1.9% have previously attended school (which means that 21.5 of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school).

By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) across sectors in Rubavu District, comparisons reveal the disparities in primary school attendance across different sectors within Rubavu District. Sectors like Busasamana and Cyanzarwe exhibit lower rates of children currently attending school (66.4 and 67.2%, respectively) and higher rates of children who have never attended (31.5 and 30.0%, respectively). On the other hand, sectors like Gisenyi and Rugerero demonstrate higher rates of children currently attending school (94.1 and 84.6%, respectively) and lower rates of children who have never attended (3.8 and 13.9%, respectively).

In Rubavu District 25.3% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school (i.e. they dropped out of school), 67.7% are currently attending school and 7.0% have never attended secondary school.

The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) across sectors in Rubavu District, shows that Gisenyi sector has the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school at 82.0%. Conversely, Busasamana sector has the lowest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school with 52.4%.

2.3.2 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Primary School of Rubavu district by Sex and Sector

Gross and Net Attendance Ratios are used to measure the extent of coverage of an educational program. It gives a comparison of the children attending school with the total size of the school-age population. It can also be used for assessing how far a country has succeeded in bringing to school all those who are eligible to attend.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years). The gross attendance rate in Rwanda is 141.7, in the Western Province is 139.8 and 125.0 in Rubavu districts. The Net Attendance Rate (NAR) in Primary school for Rubavu district (78.5%) is below the NAR of the Western Province (87.8%) and the NAR of national level (89.3%).

A Gross Attendance Rate (GAR) of 125.0% in Rubavu District for the population 6 to 11 years indicates a high percentage of those who attended primary schools aged below 6 years and or above 11 years. On the other hand, the NAR of 78.5% for the population 6 to 11 years indicates that only 78.5% of the population 6 to 11 years were attending primary schools in Rubavu District by 2022 (Table 2. 6). In 2022, students older or younger than the official primary school age range made up 37.2% $[(GAR125.0 - NAR78.5)/GAR125.0]$ of the primary school population of Rubavu District.

With a NAR of 93.9%, the Gisenyi Sector has the greatest percentage of pupils that are attending primary school and are of primary school-age. In comparison to other sectors, the Busasamana sector has the lowest NAR at 66.4%, indicating a lesser percentage of pupils who are attending primary school within the eligible age range. All most all sectors have gender parity indexes greater than 1.00, suggesting better access to education for female students compared to male students (Table 2.8).

2.3.3 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Secondary School of Rubavu district by Sex and Sector

The table 2.9 provides information on the gross and net attendance rates in the secondary school level (12-17 years) in Rubavu District, disaggregated by sex and sector. The Western Province and Rubavu District both have lower NARs than the national average (20.6% and 20.8%, respectively, versus 22.3%). Comparing males and females in Rubavu District in terms of Net Attendance Rates (NAR), the table 2. 9 indicates that a higher proportion of females (21.7%) in Rubavu District, within the secondary school-age range (12-17 years), are attending school compared to males (19.9%). Female students older or younger than the official secondary school age range made up 43.3 % $[(GAR38.3 - NAR21.7) / GAR38.3]$ of the female with secondary school age of Rubavu District, while for male students it made up 48.3 % $[(GAR38.5 - NAR19.9) / GAR38.5]$. This shows that females have a higher attendance rate in Rubavu District compared to males when considering the overall attendance rates, regardless of age or grade-level eligibility.

Among the sectors in Rubavu District, Gisenyi have the highest GAR for both sexes, with a rate of 94.8%. Sectors such as Busasamana and Cyanzarwe have relatively lower GAR compared to others (19.0% and 16.9% respectively). Gisenyi has the highest NAR for both sexes in Rubavu District, with a rate of 50.4%. Sectors like Busasamana and Cyanzarwe have relatively lower (less than 10%) NAR compared to others (9.7% and 8.4% respectively).

2.3.4 Highest level of school attended in Rubavu district

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate the total population of Rwanda aged 3 and above is 11,999,691. The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary, University, and Not stated. In Rwanda, 16.7% of the population aged 3 years and above has never attended school, while 2.7% have attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, 7.1% for upper secondary, 3.6% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of the Western Province aged 3 and above is 2,613,461. The distribution of the highest level of education attended is like the national level, with slight variations. In the Western Province, 19.6% of the population has never attended school, while 2.2% have attended nursery, and 60.7% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.6% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 8.7% for lower secondary, 6.2% for upper secondary and 2.2% for university.

The total population of Rubavu District aged 3 and above is 497,934. In Rubavu District, 22.9% of the population has never attended school, while 2.2% have attended nursery, and 52.8% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.4% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.4% for lower secondary, 8.2% for upper secondary and 4.0% for university. The distribution of the highest level of education attended varies among sectors, with differences in the percentage of individuals at each education level. For example, Busasamana has a higher percentage (32.5%) of individuals who have never attended school compared to other sectors, while Gisenyi has a higher percentage (18.4%) of individuals attended University. Each sector has its own unique distribution of education levels attended by the population. The Table 2. 10 indicates the findings:

2.4 Characteristics of the Employed Population in Rubavu district

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Aggregate employment generally increases with growing population. Therefore, the ratio of Employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment-to population ratio is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

2.4.1 Employment to population ratio by sex, Province, District and area of residence

The results presented in the below Table 2.11 shows that the employment to population ratio stood at 45.9 in Rwanda, it is lower among females (40.2 percent) than males (52.4 percent). On the other side, it was observed that the employment to population ratio is higher in urban areas of Rwanda (53.5 percent) than in rural areas (42.7 percent).

It was observed that in Western province, the employment to population ratio stood at 42.3 %, it is higher in urban areas (55.7%) than in rural areas (40.6%).

It was also revealed that the employment to population ratio is 48.5 percent among people residing in Rubavu districts, it is higher in rural areas of Rubavu (49.5%) than in urban areas (47.7%).



2.4.2 Employment to population ratio(EPR) among the resident population of Rubavu aged 16 years and above by age group and sex

Figure 2. 1 allows the study of intensity of Employment to population ratio and its variation by sex. The figure reveals the following remarks: The employment to population ratio among males as well as females increases from age group 16-19 to 35-44 and starts decreasing from age group 45-49 to 85 years and above as people starts getting very older and retire. It was observed that in district of Rubavu, the highest employment to population ratio among males stands at 75.2% and was observed in age group 35-39, On the other side the highest employment to population among females is 56.8% and was observed in the age group 40-44. The lowest employment to population ratio is observed among people aged 85 years and above where males stands at 7.8% and 4.0% for female.

CHAPTER 3: SUB-POPULATION

3.1 Children Population (0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda, as stipulated in Article 3 of the National Law n° 54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child, which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0–17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

3.1.1 The number and share of children aged 0-17 years among the total resident population of Rubavu district by sex and sector of residence.

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 revealed that, the children population constitute 44.5% of the total population of 13,246,394. The Western province has 1,355,679 children with a share of 46.8% of the total resident population. In Rubavu District, the children constitute 47.5% of the resident population of the district, with a percentage of females slightly greater than the males' one (48.2 % to 46.8%). The children's share is high in Cyanzarwe (53.1%) and Busasamana (50.3%), and small in Gisenyi (36.5%) and Nyakiriba (41.2%). The Table 3. 1 below indicate distribution of children by sector and by sex.

3.1.2 Children with legal birth registration in Rubavu district

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 94.3% at the national level. The birth registration rate in Rubavu district is 93.8%. Birth registration performance is almost the same in urban (94.6%) and (92.8%) in the rural areas of Rubavu district. The Table 3. 2 below illustrates the findings:

3.1.3 Birth registration by Sector

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that birth registration varies across sectors and areas of residence (urban and rural), Gisenyi sector has not rural area. High percentages of birth registrations are found in Nyamyumba (96.7%), Rugerero(95.0%) and Gisenyi (94.6%) while the lowest is in Cyanzarwe (92.1%). The percentage of birth registration for males is almost the same as the one for females. In urban areas of Rubavu district, birth registration is 94.6% while in rural areas, it is 92.8%.

3.2 Youth population in Rwanda

The United Nations, for statistical purposes, defines ‘youth’, as those persons between the ages of 15 and 24 years, without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda’s Development, the definition of Youth in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14–35 years to 16–30 years.

3.2.1 The youth population in Rubavu district

The results of 5th Population and housing Censuses conducted in 2022 revealed that, the youth represent 27.1% (3,595,670) of the total population (13,246,394). The youth population in Rubavu district was 153,630 which represents 28.1% of the total resident population of the district (546,683). The sector with the highest youth share is Gisenyi (36.2%) while Cyanzarwe (24.8%) and Nyundo (25.8%) have the lowest share of youth. The table below indicate distribution of youth by sector, and by sex.

3.2.2 Educational characteristics of youth

Youth who never attended school represent 5.1 % of the youth resident population at national level; it represents 6.6% of the total resident population in Western province and 9.5% of the total resident population of Rubavu district. The percentage of youth who never attended school varies a lot within sectors of Rubavu district. The highest percentage was registered in Busasamana (17.7%) while the lowest percentages were registered in Rugerero (6.7%), Nyamyumba (5.3%) and Gisenyi (2.8%).

3.2.3 Highest level of education attended by youth in Rubavu District

In Rubavu district, among all youths, 46.1% attained only the primary school level, 20.0% attained the lower secondary education, 18.1% attained the upper secondary education, 5.6% attained university, and 9.5% have not attended any formal of school. The highest level of education attained varies across sectors of the district. The sectors with the highest percentage of youth with no schooling are Busasamana (17.7%), Mudende and Cyanzarwe with 15.6% both. The percentage of youth with university level is high in Gisenyi (21.7%). The sectors with the highest percentages of youth with primary education are Cyanzarwe (59.9%) and Nyundo (58.8%). 3.2.4 Employment to population ratio among youth(16-30).

The Census results showed that in Rwanda the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.3%, it is higher among males than females 44.8% and 36.2 % respectively. It was observed that in the district of Rubavu, the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 39.2%, it is higher in among males (44.2%) than females (34.7%)

The highest employment to population ratio among youth in Rubavu district was observed in Bugeshi (50.1%), Cyanzarwe (48.9%) , and Mudende (48.2%) and low percentages in Nyakiriba (34.2%) and Nyamyumba (32.7%).

3.2.5 Status in employment of youth population in Rubavu district

In Rubavu district, the majority of youth aged 16-30 currently employed are employees (67.9%) followed by self-employed (24.8%). The highest percentage of youth employees is found in Mudende (80.5%), while the lowest is in Kzenze (60.3%). The biggest share of self-employed youth is found in Rubavu (31.8%) while the lowest is in Mudende (13.5%) and Nyundo (18.1%).

3.2.6 Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Western Province by sex, district, and area of residence.

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, In Rwanda the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training stood at 39.5 %. It is higher among females (43.8 %) than males (34.9 %).

In the Western Province, the proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training is 42.6 %, it is lower among males (38.5%) than females (46.3 %). 2022 census results also revealed that the aforementioned proportion is higher in rural areas of the Western Province (44.6 %) than in urban areas (36.1%).

The proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among people residing in Rubavu district stood at 40.2%. It is much higher (43.9%) among people residing in rural areas of Rubavu district than the ones residing in urban areas of Rubavu district (37.4%). The table below (Table 3. 9) indicates results on Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Rubavu district by Sex, Area of Residence and Sector.

3.3 Persons with disabilities

In 2015, 193 countries agreed to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals with a commitment where possible, “to disaggregate the statistics they generate by disability to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities(PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programmes, or are included in the workforce.

At the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 years and above have a disability. while in Rubavu district the disability prevalence rate is 3.1%. At sector level, the highest prevalence rates of the resident population aged 5 years and above with disability are in Cyanzarwe (4.7 %) and while the lowest is in Gisenyi (2.1%).

Regarding the prevalence of disability among the population age 5 years and above by type of disability, 1.4% have a disability of not seeing, 1.1% have a disability of walking. 3.4 Elderly Population(60 years and above)

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person.

It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action programme, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programmes on ageing. This was done to guarantee

economic and social security to older persons and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

3.4.1 Elderly population of Rubavu district by Sector

In 2022, the elderly persons constitute 4.8% of the total resident population of Rubavu district. The share of the elderly females (5.5%) is higher than the male (4.1%), reflecting the higher life expectancy for women.

3.4.2 Employment among elderly people

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.2%. The aforementioned share is higher among the elderly males (33.7%) than elderly females (24.3%).

In Rubavu district, people keep on working until old age as shown by the fact that 30.5 % of elderly people were employed during the week preceding the time of the census. The percentage of employed elderly males (35.7%) is higher than elderly females (26.8%). Employment among elderly residents is high in Cyankarwe (44.3%) and Bugeshi (42.2%). It is low in Nyakiriba sector (16.0%).

3.4.3 Marital status of elderly people

In Rubavu district, more than half of the elderly population (63.4%) were married and 33.2% were widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly was 2.2% while divorce is 0.2% and separation rate is 0.9%. Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector of residence. Marriage among elderly people is more important in Nyakiriba (72.8%) and Bugeshi (67.6 %) sectors. Widowhood is widespread in Rugerero (38.0%) and Rubavu (36.7%) and lowest in Nyakiriba (24.8%) and Bugeshi (30.0%) sectors. The Table 3. 14 below illustrates distribution of elderly people across sectors.

CHAPTER 4: HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

4.1 Household characteristics

In this chapter 5th Population and housing census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, head of household by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and cooking, water sources, sanitation facilities, asset possessed by household and mode of waste and disposals.

4.1.1 Number of households and size of household members

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the total of 3,312,743 households in Rwanda, 671,506 in the Western province and 124,080 in Rubavu district. The average household size in Rubavu district is 4.3 persons per household. At the Sector level, the highest sizes are found in cyanzarwe (4.6 persons/household), Nyamyumba and Nyundo (4.5 persons/household each). The smallest household sizes are found in Gisenyi (3.9 persons/household each). The table below indicates number of households and size of household members per sector.

4.1.2 Private households' heads by sex

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that nationally 28.9% of private households are headed by women. In Rubavu district, private households headed by females are 28.2%. At sector level, the highest percentages of households headed by women are found in Kanzenze sector (35.7%) and Cyanzarwe sector (29.4%) while the lowest is found in Nyamyumba sector (26.3%).

4.2 Housing Characteristics

4.2.1 Type of habitat

The results of 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that in the Western province the predominant type of habitat is planned rural settlement(Umudugudu) housing (70.5%) and dispersed/isolated housing (18.3%). The most common type of habitat in Rubavu district is planned rural settlement(Umudugudu) housing (70.7%) followed by spontaneous/squatter housing (11.5%) and old settlement (6.7%). The type of habitat varies across sectors. Spontaneous/squatter housing is most prevalent in Busasamana (51.2%) and Kanama (20.9%) and low in Bugeshi (0.1%) and Mudende (0.1%). The sectors with the high percentages of dispersed/isolated housing units are Nyundo (11.9%) and Kanzenze (11.9%). The Table 4. 3 below displays results by sector.




Figure 4. 9 Distribution (count and %) of the private households of Rubavu District by main source of water and by Sector

The type of habitat in Rubavu district varies according to the area of residence. In urban areas, the predominant type is planned rural settlement housing (72.8%) and spontaneous/squatter housing (12.9%). In rural areas, the predominant type is planned rural settlement housing (68.1%) followed by old settlement (12.4%). The Figure 4. 1 below indicate details:

4.2.2 Tenure of the housing in Rubavu district

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the ownership of housing in the Western province represents 80.5% and tenant represent 13.5%. In Rubavu district, 67.2% are occupied by their owners while 27.3% of housing units are occupied by tenants. At the sector level, the percentage of owners of households units is high in Bugeshi (86.8%), Busasamana (86.7%) and Mudende (86.2%) and low in Gisenyi (32.9%), Rubavu (54.2%), and Rugerero (59.4%). The percentage of tenants of housing units is high in Gisenyi (61.4%) and Rubavu (40.7%) and low in Mudende (9.1%) and Busasamana (7.4%). The table below indicate details:



In Rubavu district, 3 types of tenure of housing units (owners, tenants and free lodging) predominate in urban area as well as in rural area and their percentages vary substantially according to the area of residence. The percentage of owners of housing units is 53.9% in urban areas to 84.0% in rural areas, The percentage of tenants of housing units is 40.6% in urban areas to 10.5% in rural areas. The percentage of free lodging is 4.4% in urban areas to 4.9% in rural areas. The figures below indicate details:

4.2.3 Material of the housing units in Rubavu district

4.2.3.1. Main materials of the roof

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets in Rwanda (74.1%), in the Western province, the Iron sheet represent (59.0%). In Rubavu district, housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets (77.7%). Only 0.2% are covered by industrial tiles and 21.9% by local tiles. The variation by sector is significant. The high percentages of housing units covered by iron sheets are found in Bugeshi (99.9%), Busasamana and Gisenyi(99.5% each) and Mudende (97.8%). The lowest is Kanama with 26.6% and Nyundo (26.0) of housing units covered by iron sheets. The highest percentage of the housing units covered by local tiles is found in Nyundo sector (73.7%). The Table 4. 5 below displays details:



4.3.2 Distribution of the private households of Rubavu district by main material of the roof of the housing

The results of the census reveal that the materials used for roofing of the households' units in Rubavu district vary slightly according to the area of residence. In both rural and urban areas of Rubavu district, the predominant roofing materials are the iron sheets (64.8% in rural and 87.9 % in urban areas). The percentage of housing units covered by local tiles is 34.7% in rural areas while it is 11.8% in urban areas. Housing units covered by industrial tiles are 0.1% in urban and 0.2% rural areas. The below illustrates details:

4.2.3.2 Main materials of the walls

The results of the census show that the housing units of wall are mostly built with sundried bricks with cement in Rwanda (36.3%) furthermore the data reveal that in the Western province the housing units of wall are mostly built with sun dried bricks without cement(47.5). In Rubavu district, walls of the housing units are also mostly built with sundried bricks with cement (40.4%) and sundried bricks without cement (36.8%). At the sector level, sun dried bricks with cement are the mostly used materials in Gisenyi (60.9%) and Rubavu (58.0%), sun dried bricks without cement are the mostly used materials in Cyanzarwe (73.3) and Nyundo (62.2). Wood with mud without cement is the most frequently used material in Mudende (53.8%). The Table 4. 6 below displays details:



The main materials used for walls of the housing units in Rubavu district are mostly sun-dried bricks, wood with mud and burnt bricks and their percentages vary substantially according to the area of residence. In urban areas, the predominant materials are sundried bricks with cement (56.5%) followed by sundried bricks without cement (27.8%) and burnt bricks (6.1%). In rural areas, wood with mud are predominant materials with sundried bricks without cement (48.4%) followed by wood with mud without cement (20.6%) and sundried bricks with cement (19.9%). 4.2.3.3 Main materials of the floor

The results 5RPHC 2022 indicate that the main material of the floor of the housing units is earth (60.4%) in countrywide. In the Western province, the earth is the main material of the floor of the housing units (74.6%). In Rubavu district, the main material of the floor of the housing units is earth (57.8%) followed by cement (36.5%). At sector level, the cement as main material used for the floor is most found in Gisenyi (72.9%), Rubavu (54.8%) and Nyakiriba (49.6%) while the earth as main material used for the floor is predominant in other sectors with higher share found in Cyanzarwe (89.5 %), Busasamana (84.0%) and Bugeshi (82.4%). 

By areas of residence, the results of census indicate the main materials used for floor of the housing units in Rubavu district are mostly cement, earth and ceramic/clay/granite tiles. In urban areas, the predominant materials are cement (55.7%) and earth (37.1%). In rural areas, the predominant materials are earth (84.2%) and cement (12.1%). The Figure 4. below provides details:

At national level, the results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 52.5% of private households are connected to the grid while 47.5% are not connected. The percentage of private household connected to the grid line is 60.4% while it is 30.6% in Rubavu district. At the sector level, Sectors with high percentages of private households are connected to the grid line is Gisenyi (97.7%) and Rubavu (85.6%) while Bugeshi (36.3%) and Mudende (32.4%) have lower percentages of private households connected to the grid line are. 

4.3.2 Main source of energy for lighting in Rubavu district

In Rubavu district, the main source of energy for lighting used by households is electricity (71.4%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using electricity for lighting is high in Gisenyi (97.7%) and Rubavu (85.8%) the sector with low percentage of private households using electricity for lighting is Mudende (38.6%). The flashlight/phone flashlight takes the second spot in terms of lighting which is dominant source of lighting in Mudende (35.2%) and Bugeshi (32.5%). The **Error! 

According to the area of residence, the main source of energy for lighting is electricity (84.5%), followed by candles (5.8%) and flashlight/phone flashlight (5.6%). In rural areas, 54.7% of private households use electricity as main source of energy for lighting while 21.9% use flashlight and 12.3% use firewood. The provides details:

4.3.3 Main sources of energy for cooking in Rubavu district

At the district level, the main sources of energy for cooking used by the private households are firewood (56.3%) followed by charcoal (38.9%) and gas (4.0%). At the sector level, firewood is the most used source of cooking energy by private households in Bugeshi (89.1%) and Mudende (88.4%) followed by Busasamana (85.9%) and Cyanzarwe (83.7%). Sectors with the high percentage of private households using charcoal as main source of cooking energy are Gisenyi (66.5%), Rubavu (68.6%) and Rugerero (58.2%). Sector with the highest percentages of private households using gas as main source of cooking energy is Gisenyi (26.8%) while other sectors are below 5%. The Table 4. 10 below illustrates details:



4.3.4.1 Main source of drinking water

The results of 5RPHC 2022 reveal that improved water sources is the most water sources in Rwanda that represent (82.3%). In Rubavu district, 93.5% of private households use improved drinking water sources. At the sector level, the percentage of the private households using drinking water from improved sources is highest in Busasamana (100.0%), and the lowest in Nyundo (75.7%). 

4.3.4.2 Main type of toilet facility

The results of census reveal that the main type of toilet facility used by the private households in Rwanda is pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (68.8%), in Rubavu district main types of toilet facility used by the private households are pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (53.5%) and pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households (26.1%). At the sector level, the percentage of pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household is high in Bugeshi (73.7%) and Mudende (64.7%) while it is low in Rubavu (48.0%) and Gisenyi (25.5%). Flush toilets are mainly not shared and the high percentages of households using this type are found in Gisenyi (26.5%). For shared pit latrines with constructed floor slab, Busasamana (14.8%) is the sectors with the high percentage of private households using this kind of toilet. The Table 4. 12 below indicates the types of toilets facilities.



The type of toilet facility used by the private households varies according to the area of residence in Rubavu district. In urban areas, the types of toilets most used are pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (47.1%) and pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by several households (31.8%) followed by flush toilets used by one household (7.5%). In rural areas, the main types of toilets used are pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (61.6%) and pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several household (18.7%). 4.3.4.3 Mode of waste disposal in Rubavu district

The results of the census reveal that, In Rubavu district, the high percentage of households (47.1%) evacuate their waste in the household's fields or bushes while 30.1% of private households evacuate their waste in the household compost dumping and 11.2% by the waste collection companies. At the Sector level, the high percentages of households evacuating their waste through the waste collection companies is in Gisenyi (77.5). The household's fields and bushes as main mode of waste disposal is the most used in almost sectors, this mode is high in Cyanzarwe (70.9%), Busasamana (64.0%) and Mudende (57.1%). The high percentages of households using household compost dumping are in Nyundo (47.0%) and Kanzenze (41.5%). The table below indicates details:



4.4 Assets possessed by private households

4.4.1 Communication assets possessed by private households in Rubavu district

At the district level, 81.2% of private households possess a radio, 79.3% a mobile phone, 25.4% a smartphone, 17.2% a TV and 4.3% a computer. The percentage of private households possessing a radio is high in Gisenyi (97.0%) and Rubavu (87.3%). It is low in Busasamana (66.4%). The percentage of private households possessing a television is high in Gisenyi (54.5%) and Rubavu (24.9%) while it is low in Mudende (4.1%) and Kanzenze (5.1%). Mobile phone is mostly possessed by private households of Gisenyi (93.0%), Rubavu (79.3%) and Rugerero (75.8%). The sectors with high percentage of households with smartphone are Gisenyi (95.4) and Rubavu (86.1%) while the percentage of households possessing this asset is low in Cyanzarwe and Busasamana (5.0% each). The computer is mostly possessed in Gisenyi (20.1%), other sectors are below 5.0%. The Table 4. 14 below provides details:

4.4.2 Access to the Internet

The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the percentages of households with at least one member using internet are 22.2% at national level while they are 16.6% in Western Province and 25.4% in Rubavu district. At sector level, the high percentage of households with at least one member using internet is high in Gisenyi(72.1%), Nyakiriba(30.1%) and Rugerero(29.9%). The sector with the lower percentages of households with at least one member using internet is Cyanzarwe(7.9%).



According to the area of residence in Rubavu district, the results of the census show that the access to the Internet varies greatly in accordance with the area of residence in Rubavu district. CHAPTER 5: AGRICULTURE IN RUBAVU DISTRICT

The agriculture was the one of the areas of investigation of the 5th Rwanda Population and housing census conducted in 2022. The households engaged in Livestock husbandry; the number of private crop farming households cultivating different types of crops, by Sector, the number of private households raising different types of livestock, by Sector and type of household raised in district were captured in the census.

5.1 The households engaged in crop farming and livestock husbandly

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that Nationally, 2,280,854 of private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture, among them 62.6% are engaged in crop farming and 50.4% are engaged in Livestock husbandry. Rubavu district is the one of districts of the Western province where crop farming and animal husbandly are practiced. In Rubavu district, Agricultural households occupy (45.9%) with 34.0% of households engaged in crop farming and 29.9% Households engaged in Livestock husbandry. Rubavu district has sectors located in rural areas where the agriculture activities are applied, Cyanzarwe sector has a high proportion of Households engaged in crop farming (49.3%) and Bugeshi with households engaged in livestock husbandry (50.6%).

5.3 Distribution of private households engaged in raising different types of livestock, by Sector

Nationally and in the Western province, the results of the census indicate that most private households are considerably more engaged in raising cows, goats, and chicken than other livestock.
