





Foreword






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
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Figure 1: Administrative map of Nyagatare district

1.1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of the Eastern Province



- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC4) has enumerated 2,595,703 residents in the Eastern Province, which represent 25% of the total population of Rwanda (10,515,973 residents).
- The population of the Eastern Province is predominantly female: 1,337,613 are women corresponding to 51.5% of the total population of the Eastern province.
- Nyagatare and Gatsibo are the mostly populated Districts with more than 400 thousands residents for each. Their populations represent, respectively, 17.9% and 16.7% of the total resident population of the Eastern Province.
- The least populated district is Rwamagana with about 313 thousand inhabitants, corresponding to 12.1% of the total resident population of the Eastern Province.
- Two districts with high population density (Inhabitants per km²) are Rwamagana (460 inhabitants by km²) and Ngoma (388 inhabitants by km²)
- Three districts with low population density (Inhabitants per Km²) are Kayonza (178 inhabitants by km²), Nyagatare (242 inhabitants by km²) and Gatsibo (274 inhabitants by km²)



- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC4) has enumerated 465,855 residents in Nyagatare district, which represent 18% of the total population of the Eastern Province (2,595,703 residents).
- The population of Nyagatare district is predominantly female; 237,530 are women corresponding to 51% of the total population.
- In each sector of Nyagatare district, the percentage of females is more than 50% of the total population except in Nyagatare (49.8%) Rwempasha (49.4%) and Rwimiyaga (49.9%).
- Karangazi, Rwimiyaga and Nyagatare are the most populated Sectors with over 50 thousands residents each. They represent 12.3%, 12.3% and 11.2 % of the total population of District, respectively.
- Kiyombe and Rwempasha are the least populated sectors in Nyagatare district with 17,152 and 20,512 residents respectively. .

- Nyagatare district population is predominantly rural: 89.8% of its population (465,855 inhabitants) lives in rural areas,
- 27.5% of the population of Nyagatare district resides in urban areas. Around half of sectors of Nyagatare district are entirely rural.



- The Nyagatare population is mostly young. 64% of the resident population of Nyagatare is under 25 years old, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past.
- The elderly (60 years and above) represent 3.9% of the total population of the District. The distribution of the resident population by age and by sector is in the annex.

- Some age groups are targets of specific interventions. For instance children under five year for immunization programs, children in primary school age (7-12 years), people in the official working age group (16-64 years), etc.
- Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The above table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Nyagatare district.
- The population aged 0-17 represents 50.9 % of the total population of the district. The economically active population aged 16 and 64 years represents 51.1%.

- Christianity is the predominant religion in Nyagatare district with more than 95.8%, being Protestant (49.5%), Catholic (34.5%), or Adventist (11.0%) and Jehovah Witness for 0.8%,
- Muslims represent 1.7% of the resident population,
- 1.9% of the resident population declared to be without religion.

- Near half of the resident population of Nyagatare district aged 12 and above (49.3%) was married at the time of the census, while 43% were never married. Up to 5.3% were widowed, while separated and divorced were relatively few (0.5% and 1.9%, respectively).
- At the sector level,
 - Two sectors have the high percentages of the currently married people Rwimiyaga (53.4%) and Katabagemu sectors (52.1%),
 - Rwempasha sector is having the high percentage of the never married persons (48.9%),
 - Karama, Kiyombe and Gatunda sectors have the high percentage of widowed persons (about 7% each)

The percentages of the resident population of Nyagatare district by marital status vary by sex and age:

- The percentage of the never married persons decreases from 99.3% (age group of 12-14 years) to 3.8% (age group of 85 years and above).
- The percentage of persons currently married starts by increasing from 0.7% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 85.5% (age group of 35-39 years) before decreasing down to 40% due mainly to widowhood.
- The percentage of divorced persons never reaches 5%, while the percentage of the separated persons is below 1% among all age groups.

School attendance among children varies across education levels:

- It is low (34.7 %) for the preschool-age population (3-6 years), widespread (90.2%) for the primary school-age population (7-12 years), and (74%) for the secondary school-age population (13-18 years).
- School attendance varies also across the sectors:
 - for the preschool-age, it varies from 20.3% in Rukomo to 48.6% in Rwempasha,
 - for the primary school-age, it varies from 84.5% in Musheri to 95,7% in Kiyombe, and
 - for the secondary school, it varies from 67.3% in Katabagemu to 84% in Rwempasha.

Table 11 reveals that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (7-12 years).

- The gross attendance rates are greater than 100% in all sectors, with minor variations. The net attendance rate (NAR) in Primary school for Nyagatare district (83.3%) is far below to the NAR at Province and National level (86,3% and 88,2%, respectively). The high net attendance rate in primary school (91.7%) is in Kiyombe sector followed by Mukama sector with 91.6% while the sector with low NAR is Musheri with 73.8%.

- As the national level school attendance at secondary level not universal in Nyagatare district. The net and gross attendance rates in Nyagatare district are below 40%. This means that more half of the Nyagatare children who are supposed to attend secondary school are not actually attending that level.
- There are minor differences in the attendance rates between males and females,
- There are variations by sector. For instance net attendance rate is 28.8% in Matimba sector while it is 11.0% in Katabagemu sector.

- The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above.
- The labour force participation varies greatly in Eastern Province: 70.5% in Bugesera and Ngoma 81%.
- 74.1% of Nyagatare resident aged 16 years and above are in the labour market, either working or looking for a job (economically active)
- Labour force participation is slightly higher among males (75.6%) than among females (72.6%) and it slightly higher in rural areas (77.7 %) than in urban areas (69.7 %).

Figure 5: Labour-force participation rate (LFPR) among the resident population aged 16 and above in Nyagatare district by age-group and by sex




Figure 5 allow the study of the calendar and intensity of labour force participation and its variation by sex .The figure reveals:

- Early entry and late exit to the labour market in Nyagatare district . . As shown by the graph, the labour force participation rate were above 30% at age 16 (the official entry age in the labour market) and after age 65 (official age of retirement). Intense labour force participation is intense between ages 25 and 60 years with around 50% of the population in the labour market.
- gender disparities are remarkable in labour force participation; from 20 years males contribute more than females to the labour market.

- In the Eastern Province, variations of unemployment rate are important by district; from 1.1% in Ngoma and 5% in Bugesera district.
- 2.2% of the total active population aged 16 years and above in Nyagatare district was unemployed the week preceding the census.

- At the national level the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 79%.
- Nyagatare district is the district in the Eastern Province with low percentage (73.4%) of children whose birth was registered at the time of the census.
- The situation is better in Rwamagana (82.3%), Bugesera (81.7%) and Kirehe (78.8%) whose percentages of birth registration are higher than the average of Eastern province.

Figure 6: Employment among children aged 5-17 years by sex in Nyagatare district



- In Nyagatare district, more than half of the youth was employed at during seven days preceding the census (59.9%), while 38.3% were out of the labour market (inactive). Only 1.5% were unemployed.



- The most common type of habitat in Nyagatare district is the clustered rural settlement (known as Umudugudu). Overall 71.9% of private households are of that type. It is followed by dispersed/isolated housing (17.8%) and spontaneous/squatter housing (8%).
- The type of habitat varies a lot across sectors. The clustered rural settlement is more prevalent in some sectors with more than 45% of the housing being of that type in the sectors of Gatunda (95.9%), Katabagemu (95%), Tabagwe (91.6%), Karama (85%) and Kiyombe (77.4%). The habitat has more dispersed/isolated housing in Rwempasha (38%), Rwimiyaga (26.2 %) and Karangazi (23.9%), more planned in Nyagatare sector (11.3%), and more spontaneous/squatter housing in Matimba (20.4%) and Rwempasha (19.2%).









- In Nyagatare district the main sources of energy for lighting used by the households are kerosene lamp (39.2%), electricity (17.9%), candle (12%) and firewood (1%). However a high percentage of the households (26%) use unspecified source of energy for their lighting.
- At the sector level, the percentage using electricity for lighting is higher in Nyagatare sector (35.1%) than in other sectors where it varies between 1.7% (in Rwempasha sector) and 28.6% (in Musheri sector). The percentage of private households that use kerosene lamp for lighting is higher in Tabagwe, Kiyombe (59.3%) Rwempasha (53.1%). It is low in Katabagemu (12.4%) and Mimuri (23.9%).












