- The 4<sup>th</sup> Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC4) has enumerated 2,471,239 residents in the Western Province, which represent 23.5% of the total population of Rwanda (10,515,973 residents).
- The population of Western province is predominantly female; 1,302,794 are women corresponding to 52.7% of the total population of the province.
- Rubavu, Rusizi and Nyamasheke are the most populated districts with more than 380 thousands residents for each. Their populations represent respectively, 16.3%, 16.2% and 15.4% of the total resident population of Western Province.
- The less populated district is Nyabihu with about 294 thousand inhabitants, corresponding to 11.9% of total resident population of Western province.
- Three districts with a high population density (Inhabitants /km²) are Rubavu (1,039 inhabitants /km²), Nyabihu (555 inhabitants /km²) and Ngororero (491 inhabitants /km²).
- The district with a low population density (Inhabitants /km²) are Rutsiro (281 Inhabitants /km²).




Figure 2: Population Density (Inhabitants / km²) by district in Western province

- The 4<sup>th</sup> Rwandan Population and Housing Census (PHC4) has enumerated 381,804 residents in Nyamasheke district, which represent 15.4% of the total population of the Western Province (2,471,239 residents).
- The population of Nyamasheke district is predominantly female; 203,383 are women corresponding to 53. 3% of the total population.
- Kagano and Kanjongo are the most populated sectors with over 32 thousands residents each. They represent 8.7% and 8.6% of the total resident population of the district.



The population of Karongi district is mostly young. 62.1% of resident population of Nyamasheke is under 25 years old, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past.

The elderly (60 years and above) represent 5.6% of the total population of the district. The distribution of the resident population by age and by sector is in the annex.

- Some age groups are targets of specific interventions. For instance children under five year for immunization programs, children in primary school age (7-12 years), people in the official working age group (16-64 years), etc.
- Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The above table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Nyamasheke district.
- The population aged 0-17 represents 48.5 % of the total population of the district. The economically active population aged 16 and 64 years represents 52.1%.

- 45.8% of the resident population of Nyamasheke district aged 12 and above were married at the time of census, while 46.6% were never married. Up to 6.1% were widowed, while separated and divorced are relatively few (0.3% and 1%, respectively).
- At sector level,
  - > Two sectors have high percentage of currently married people; Kanjongo and Macuba sectors (48.6% each),
  - ➤ Ruharambuga and Bushenge sectors have high percentage of never married persons (51.4% and 50.2% respectively),
  - Mahembe, and Gihombo sectors have high percentage of widowed persons (7.2% and 7.1% each).

The percentages of the resident population of Nyamasheke district by marital status vary by sex and age:

- The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.5% (age group of 12-14 years) to 4% (age group of 85 years and above).
- The percentage of persons currently married starts by increasing from 0.5% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 85.3% (age group of 35-39 years) before decreasing to 39.7% mainly due to widowhood.

- It is very low (26.9%) for the pre-school-age population (3-6 years), very high (94.6%) for primary school-age population (7-12 years), high (80.7%) for secondary school-age population (13-18 years) school attendance varies also across the sectors:
- School attendance varies also across sectors:
  - ▶ for the preschool-age, it varies from 17.3% in Bushekeri to 46.6% in Karambi,;
  - ▶ for the primary school-age, it varies from 89.1% in Cyato to 98.3% in Karambi, and
  - ➢ for the secondary school, it varies from 71.2% in Karengera to 87.5% in Gihombo and Rangiro each.

Table 11 reveals furthermore that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (7-12 years).

- The gross attendance rates are greater than 100% in all sectors, with some variations. The net attendance rate (NAR) in Primary school for Nyamasheke district (90.5%) is above the NAR at Province and National level (87.9% and 88.2.3%, respectively).
- The highest net attendance rate in primary school (NAR) at sector level is in Macuba (95.0%) and the low NAR is in Cyato (81.1%).

- As national level, school attendance at secondary level is not universal in Nyamasheke district.
- The gross attendance rates in Nyamasheke district varies between 22.7%, and 60.5% while Net attendance rate is below 50% in Nyamasheke district. This means that more than half of the Nyamasheke district children who are supposed to attend secondary school are not actually attending that level.
- There are minor differences in the attendance rates among males and females: the GAR is 42.0% for males vs 46.2% for females while the NAR is 17.3% for males vs 21.7% for females.
- There are some variations by sector in net attendance rate: 27.5% in Nyabitekeri while it is 9.2% in Cyato.



- The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above.
- The labour force participation rate varies greatly by district in Western province: from 65.2% in Rubavu to 80.1% in Ngororero district.
- 75.2% of the resident aged 16 years and above are in labour market, either working or looking for a job (economically active).
- Labour force participation rate among among males and females, varies 74.6% for males and 75.7% for females.
- Labour force participation is high (82%) in urban areas than in rural areas (75.1%).

- Early entry and late exit to the labour market in Nyamasheke district. As shown by the graph, the labour force participation rate were above 30% at age 16 (the official entry age in the labour market) and above 60% after age 65 (official age of retirement).
- Intense labour force participation is observed between ages 25 and 64 where more than 80% of the population is in the labour market.
- Some gender disparity in labour force participation: Between 16 and 24years, females contribute more than males to labour force, while from age 25, females contribution becomes less than male's one.

- In the Western Province, unemployment rate varies by district; from 2% in Karongi and Ngororero each to 5.2% in Rubavu district.

- Between 15-17years, 21.2% children aged were employed during seven days precedin the census at the national level. This percentage is 17% in Nyamasheke district.




Figure 6: Employed among children aged 15-17 years in Nyamasheke district
















• In Nyamasheke district, walls of housing units are mostly built with sundried bricks (49.8%) and wood/mud (35.4%).




■ In Nyamasheke district, main sources of energy for lighting used by private households are kerosene lamp (52.2%), firewood (11.3%), electricity(8%) and candle(7.2%). However high percentage of households (20.8%) use an unspecified source of energy for lighting.

At sector level,

- The percentages of the private households that use kerosene lamp for lighting are high in Bushenge (66.7%) and Nyabitekeri (65.9%), Shangi(64.6%0, Karambi(64.4%) and Ruharambuga(63.7%).


- In urban areas, three main sources of energy used for lighting are electricity (37.1%), kerosene lamp (35.5%) and candle (9.7%).
- In rural areas, most private households use kerosene lamp (52.5%), firewood (11.4%), electricity(7.5%) and candle(7.2%) for lighting.












