


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Figure 1: Administrative map of Huye district



- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC) has enumerated 2,589,975 residents in the Southern Province, which represent 24.6% of the total population of the of Rwanda (10,515,973 residents).
- The population of the Southern Province is predominantly female; 1,356,221 are women corresponding to 52.4% of the total population of the province.
- Nyamagabe, Kamonyi are the mostly populated Districts with about 340 thousands residents for each. Their populations represent, respectively, 13.2%, 13.1% of the total resident population of the Southern Province.
- The least populated District is Nyaruguru with about 294 thousand inhabitants, corresponding to 11.4% of the total resident population of the Southern Province.
- Three districts with a high population density (Inhabitants perkm²) are Huye (565 inhabitants by km²), Kamonyi (519 inhabitants by km²) and Ruhango (510 inhabitants by km²).
- Two districts with a low population density (Inhabitants by km²) are Nyaruguru (291inhabitants bykm²), Nyamagabe (313 inhabitants bykm²).



- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC4) has enumerated 328,398 residents in Huye District, which represent 12.7% of the total population of the Southern Province (2,589,975 residents).
- The population of Huye district is predominantly female; 170,294 are women corresponding to 51.9% of the total population.
- Females are predominant in almost all sectors of the District except in Ngoma (38.8%)
- Tumba and Mbazi are the mostly populated sectors with over than 30 thousands residents each. They represent 9.6% and 9.5% of the total population of District, respectively.
- Gishamvu and Karama are less populated sectors with 13 thousand inhabitants.

- Huye District population is predominantly rural: 83.9% of the resident population (**275,630** inhabitants) lives in rural areas vs. 16.1% (**52,768**) in urban areas
- Ngoma is the most urbanized sector of Huye District with 88% of its population residing in urban areas. The following most urbanized sectors are Tumba (81.7%) and Mukura (12%.6).

- Huye population is mostly young. 58% of the resident population of Huye is under 25 years old, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past.
- The elderly (60 years and above) represent 6% of the total population of the District. The distribution of the resident population by age and by sector is in the annex.

Figure 4: Age pyramid of the resident population of Huye District in 2012



- Some age groups are targets of specific interventions. For instance children under five year for immunization programs, children in primary school age (7-12 years), people in the office working age group (16-64 years), etc.
- Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The above table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Huye district.
- The population aged 0-17 represents 44.5% of the total population of the district. The economically active population aged 16 and 64 years represents 56.1%.

- 42.3% of the resident population of Huye district aged 12 and above was married at the time of the census, while **46.8%** was never married. Up to 8.4% were widowed.
- At the sector level,
 - Three sectors have the high percentages of the currently married people Rwaniro (46%), Simbi and Kigoma sectors (45% each),
 - Tumba sector is having high percentage of the never married persons (54%),
 - Mukura sector has the highest percentage of widowed persons (10.3%),

The percentages of the resident population of Huye district by marital status vary by sex and age:

- The percentage of the never married persons decreases from 99.6% (age group of 12-14 years) to 1.8% (age group of 85 years and above).
- The percentage of persons currently married starts by increasing from 0.4% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 77.8% (age group of 35-39 years) before decreasing to 29.2% due mainly to widowhood.

- The percentage of divorced persons never reaches 5%, while the percentage of the separated persons is below 2% among all age groups.

School attendance among children varies across education levels:

- It is very low (26.3%) for the preschool-age population (3-6 years), widespread (92.4%) for the primary school-age population (7-12 years), and high (73.6%) for the secondary school-age population (13-18 years) at the time of the census.
- School attendance varies also across sectors:
 - for the preschool-age, it varies from 13% in Karama to 48.8% in Ngoma.
 - for the primary school-age, it varies from 89% in Karama to 95% in Ngoma, and
 - for the secondary school, it varies from 66.9% in Simbi to 81.9% in Kigoma.

Table 11 reveals that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (7-12 years).

- The gross attendance rates are greater than 100% in all sectors, with some variations. The net attendance rate (NAR) in Primary school in Huye district is (87.5%) is below the NAR at Province and National level (87.9% and 88.2%, respectively).
- The highest net attendance rate in primary school (93.6%) is in Ngoma sector followed by Maraba and Kigoma sectors with (90.5% each) while the sector with the lowest NAR is Kinazi with 81.3%.

- As the national level, school attendance at secondary level is not universal in Huye District. The net and gross attendance rates in Huye district are below 50%. This means that more than half of Huye district children who are supposed to attend secondary school are not actually attending that level.
- There are some variations by sector: the net attendance rate is 42% in Ngoma sector while it is 16.1% in Rwaniro sector.
- There are differences in both attendance rates (GAR and NAR) among males and females: the GAR is 44.2 % for male vs 50.5% for female while the NAR is 21.9% for male vs 27.1% for female.



- The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above.
- The labour force participation varies greatly by district in Southern Province: from 61.2% in Nyamagabe to 79.4% in Muhanga district.
- 68.2% of residents aged 16 years and above in Huye district are in the labour market, either working or looking for a job (economically active).
- Labour force participation rate is higher among males than females in both urban (73.4% vs 59.8%) and rural areas (70.3% vs 67%).

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- Early entry and late exit to the labour market in Huye as shown by labour force participation rate were around 30% at age 16 (the official entry age in the labour market) and above 60% at 65 years (official age of retirement).
- Intense labour force participation (between ages 25 and 60) with more than 50% of the population in the labour market.
- Some gender disparities in labour force participation: the labour force participation rate is high among males at all age groups.

- In the Southern Province, variations of unemployment rate are important by district: from 2.1% in Muhanga to 5.3% in Nyamagabe district
- 4.0% of the total active population aged 16 years and above in Huye district were unemployed the week preceding the census.
- In Huye district, unemployment rate (UR) is higher in urban (6.3%) than in rural areas (3.6%).

- At the national level, the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 79%.
- Nyamagabe is the district in the Southern Province with a low percentage (72.7%) of children whose birth was registered at the time of the census.

- Between 5 and 9 years few children (0.9%) were employed at the time of the Census at the national level. This percentage is 1.0% in Huye District. There is slight difference between girls and boys.
- Between 10 years and 14 years the percentage of children who were employed during 7 days preceding the census is around 2.8% at national level, while it is around 2.4% in Huye District.
- Between 15-17years, 21% children aged were employed 7 days preceding the the census at the national level. This percentage is 18.4% in Huye District.

Figure 6: Employed among children aged 5-17 years by district in southern province



- Youth who have never attended school represent 12.4% of the youth resident population at national level; it represents 12.3% of the youth resident population in the Southern Province and 10% of the total youth resident population of Huye District.
- The percentage of youth who never attended school varies gradually across sectors of Huye district. - The highest level of education attained varies across sectors of the district.

- In Huye district, more than half of the youth was employed at the time of the census (54.3%), while 41.5% were out of the labour market (inactive). Only 2.7% were unemployed.



- The most common type of habitat in Huye district is the clustered rural settlement (known as Umudugudu). Overall 48% of the private households are of that type. It is followed by dispersed/isolated housing (35.6%) and spontaneous/squatter housing (14.6%).
- Percentage of dispersed/isolated housing across sectors varies between 13% and 63%.
- Huye and Gishamvu are the sectors with high percentage of dispersed/isolated habitat (62.7% and 59.7% respectively) while Ngoma has more spontaneous/squatter housing (53.5%).

The type of habitat varies according to the area of residence.

- In urban areas, the predominant type of habitat is spontaneous/squatter housing (68.8%), the clustered rural settlement (umudugudu) (12.9%) and the planned urban housing is only 7.8%.











Figure 13: Distribution (%) of the private households of Huye District by improved and unimproved source of water and by Sector






Figure 14: Distribution (%) of the private households of Huye District by main source of water from Improved and unimproved water and by area of residence






