## SUMMARY

In the third quarter of 2015, Rwanda's total trade amounted to US\$ **623.25** million, an increase of 0.3 percent over the third quarter of 2014. Exports totaled US\$ **96.14** million, imports totaled US\$ **481.10** million and re-exports were valued at US\$ **46.01** million.

Total domestic exports decreased by 26.07 percent during the period of the third quarter 2015 over the same quarter of 2014 (US\$ 96.14 million and US\$ 130.05 million respectively) and increased by 1.39 percent compared to the second quarter of 2015. Total imports of Rwanda increased by 12.47 percent in the third quarter of 2015 when compared to the same quarter of 2014 (US\$ 481.10 million and US\$ 427.75 million respectively) and rose by 2.23 percent over the second quarter of 2015. Re-exports from Rwanda decreased by 27.74 percent in the third quarter of 2015 over the third quarter of 2014 (US\$ 46.01 million and US\$ 63.68 million respectively) and registered a decrease of 6.97 percent over the second quarter of 2015.

The top five export destinations were: Switzerland, Kenya, the Democratic Republic of Congo, the United States of America and the United Arab Emirates. Together, these five countries accounted for 65.74 percent share of total value of domestic exports (US\$ 63.21 million). In comparison, in the third quarter of 2014 they totalized US\$ 87.19 million (around 68 % of the total value of exports in that period).

The commodity groups with the largest increase in values on exports were: "Coffee, not roasted, not decaffeinated" (US\$ 25.12 million), "Niobium, vanadium ores, tantalum and concentrates" (US\$ 15.76 million), "Other black tea (fermented) and other partly fermented tea" (US\$ 9.38 million), "Other unwrought gold (incl. gold plated with platinum), non monetary" (US\$ 7.80 million) and "Tin ores and concentrates" (US\$ 7.29 million)

In terms of re-exports, the top five destinations in the third quarter 2015 were: the Democratic Republic of Congo, Burundi, Sri Lanka, Kenya and the United Kingdom. Democratic Republic of Congo accounted for 78.48 percent share of Rwanda's total re-exports.

The most re-exported commodity group was: "Motor Spirit (gasoline) premium" (US\$ 12.46 million), followed by "Gas oil (automotive, light, amber for high speed engines)" (US\$ 7.06

million), “Kerosene type Jet Fuel” (US\$ 3.29 million), “Broken Rice” (US\$ 2.39 million) and “Semi milled or wholly milled rice, whether or not polished or glazed” (US\$ 2.32 million).

In terms of total imports, there have been minor changes in top five origins of imports of Rwanda during the third quarter of 2015 in the extent that Uganda replaced India on the second place when compared to the second quarter of 2015. China, Uganda, Kenya, India, and Japan outline the top five countries of origin of imports to Rwanda and totalized US\$ 261.67 million of imports (54.39% of the total value of imports) while in the third quarter 2014 they totalized US\$ 257.89 million (60% of the total value of imports in that concerned period).

The commodity groups with the largest quarterly increases in values among the top 20 imported products were: “Other portland cement” (US\$ 19.39 million), “Telephones for cellular networks or for other wireless” (US\$ 19.24 million), “Other medicaments in measured doses for retail sale” (US\$ 16.40 million), “Other vehicles with diesel or semi diesel engine, cylinder>2500cc” (US\$ 12.16 million) and “Mineral or chemical fertilizers containing the three fertilizing elements nitrogen, Phosphorus, Potassium” (US\$ 9.56 million).

## INTRODUCTION

This Statistical Report of Formal External Trade in Goods covers the third quarter of 2015, the period running from July to September. It is produced by the External Trade Division of the Economic Statistics Department of the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR).

The Economic Statistics Department is mandated to compile, analyze and produce statistics and information on external trade. The data compiled by the Division is provided by the Rwanda Revenue Authority (RRA), Customs Department and then processed by NISR using EUROTRACE DBMS and MS Access software.

To collect and compile external trade statistics, NISR relies on the General Trade System under which the recorded aggregates include all goods entering or leaving the economic territory of a country with the exception of simple transit trade.

**Imports** include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses.

**Exports** cover domestic exports defined as goods of national origin; that is, goods produced in the exporting country.

**Re-exports** which are exported in the same conditions as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged and include re-exports from customs bonded warehouses.

**Valuation of imports and exports:** Imports are valued on a CIF (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis while exports are valued on a FoB (Free on Board) basis.

**Classification of commodities:** The data is categorized by partner Country and the international standard classifications such as the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS) and the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC), all linked to the national Customs Procedure Codes (CPCs).

Furthermore, the compilation of External Trade Statistics abides by the recommendations of the International Merchandise Trade Statistics, (IMTS-2010) of the United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD).

## 1. Rwanda's Formal External Trade in Goods


This section provides an overview of Rwanda's total trade in goods covering the period from 2013 to the third quarter of 2015, on a quarterly basis.

In the third quarter of 2015, Rwanda's total trade in goods amounted to US\$ 623.25 million, an increase of 0.30 percent from US\$ 621.40 million in the same quarter of 2014 and of 1.36 percent from US\$ 614.88 million in the preceding second quarter of 2015.

Figure 1 summarizes the balance of Rwanda's trade in goods. Year-over-year, the deficit on traded goods increased considerably by 45 percent, from the same period in 2014. This widening in the trade deficit is explained by a continuous increase in imports and decrease in exports (with the exception of the third quarter of 2015).

Total imports of goods constitute 77.19 percent of total trade in goods (US\$ 481.10 million), while total exports (US\$ 96.14 million) and re-exports (US\$ 46.01) constitute 15.43 percent and 7.38 per cent, respectively. For more detailed figures, see Appendix 6.1.

## **2. Domestic Exports**

Compared to the second quarter of 2015, the third quarter of 2015 has seen a rise in values of domestic exports of 1.39 percent, with total domestic exports amounting to US\$ 96.14 million. Although the increase is not substantial, it follows three consecutive quarters of decline in domestic exports (see Figure 1 above).

The increase in domestic exports in third quarter of 2015 compared to the previous quarter is largely explained by a 137.60 percent increase in the exports' values of "Coffee, not roasted, not decaffeinated", which is the main product exported by Rwanda (as of the third quarter of 2015); and an increase of 149.78 percent in the exports' values of "Other unwrought gold (incl. gold plated with platinum), non monetary", which is the fourth most exported commodity (as of the third quarter of 2015) and one that has seen a rapid increase of 646.81 percent since the third quarter of 2014.

Nevertheless, year-over-year, domestic exports decreased 26.07 percent compared to the same quarter of 2014 (see Figure 1). This decrease in total exports' values is largely explained by reductions in the values of "Niobium, vanadium ores, tantalum and concentrates" and "Tin ores and concentrates" exported, which decreased by 51.75 percent and 61.60 percent, respectively.

### **2.1. Exports by Commodity**

In the third quarter of 2015, the five most exported commodities accounted for 65.32 percent of total domestic exports.

Compared to the previous quarter, exports of "Coffee, not roasted, not decaffeinated", with an estimated value of US\$ 25.12, occupied the first place in the third quarter of 2015 displacing "Niobium, vanadium ores, tantalum and concentrates" to the second place (US\$ 15.76 million). "Other black tea (fermented) and other partly fermented tea" maintained its third place amounting to US\$ 9.38 million, followed by "Other unwrought gold (incl. gold plated with platinum), non monetary" (US\$ 7.80 million) and "Tin ores and concentrates" (US\$ 7.29 million) languishing on the fourth and fifth place.


## 2.2. Rwanda Export Markets

### 2.2.1. Trade Partners

Rwanda's key destination markets of exports during the third quarter of 2015 were: Switzerland (US\$ 17.94 million, 18.66 percent share), Kenya (US\$ 16.52 million, 17.19 percent share), the Democratic Republic of Congo (US\$ 10.82 million, 11.28 percent share), the United States of America (US\$ 9.10 million, 9.47 percent share) and United Arab Emirates (US\$ 8.79 million, 9.14 percent share). Together, these five countries account for US\$ 63.21 million or 65.74 percent share of total value of domestic exports in the third quarter of 2015. Figure 2 summarizes these figures year-to-date (from the beginning of the current year up to the third quarter of 2015).

In comparison with the previous quarter, Belgium (US\$ 4.88 million, 5.07 percent share), located in the top five exports markets in the preceding quarter, was displaced to the 8<sup>th</sup> place after Singapore's (US\$ 5.92 million, 6.16 percent share) and Hong Kong's (US\$ 5.63 million, 5.85 percent share) increased market share (see Figure 2 below).

## 2.2.2. East African Community (EAC) Partner States


Rwanda's exports of US\$ 19.65 million to the East African Community Partner States (EAC) in the third quarter of 2015 accounted for around a fifth of total domestic exports. Of these, about four fifths were destined to Kenya (US\$ 16.04 million), a share that remained constant year-to-date.

Figure 3 illustrates the total value of Rwanda's exports to EAC Partner States from 2013 up to the third quarter of 2015.

Domestic exports to EAC partner states decreased by 24 percent in comparison with the second quarter of 2015, but only by 7 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2014. Year-to-year, Kenya is the only country that experienced an increase in value of Rwanda's exports, a 28.60 percent increase from US\$ 12.48 million to US\$ 16.04 million in the third quarter 2015.

In terms of EAC export shares, Uganda and Burundi followed Kenya and received domestic exports from Rwanda valued at US\$ 1.65 million and US\$ 1.49 million, respectively.

### **3. Imports**

The total value of imports in the third quarter of 2015 amounted to US\$ 481.10 million, an increase of 2.23 percent compared to the second quarter of 2015 which amounted to US\$ 470.60 million and of 12.47 percent compared to the corresponding quarter of 2014 amounting US\$ 427.75 million (see Figure 1 above).

The increase observed between the second and third quarter of 2015, can be largely attributed to five categories of commodities whose value of imports more than quadrupled. These are: “Other vehicles with diesel or semi diesel engine, cylinder>2500cc” (up by US\$ 9.9 million), “Mineral or chemical fertilizers containing the three fertilizing elements nitrogen, Phosphorus, Potassium” (up by US\$ 8.69 million), “Parts and accessories of the machines of heading 84.71” (up by US\$ 7.05 million), Maize seed for sowing (up by US\$ 6.37 million) and “Other (Structures & parts of structures, of iron/ steel)” (up by US\$ 6.28 million).

#### **3.1. Imports by Commodity**


During the third quarter of 2015, the five most imported commodities represent 15.95 percent of Rwanda’s total imports. These, ranked from top to bottom, consisted of “Other portland cement” (down 14.55 percent over the same quarter of 2014 to US\$ 19.39 million); “Telephones for cellular networks or for other wireless” (up 10.35 percent year-over year to US\$ 19.24 million); “Other medicaments in measured doses for retail sale” (down 14.15 percent compared to the same quarter of 2014 reaching US\$ 16.40 million); “Other vehicles with diesel or semi diesel engine, cylinder>2500cc” (up 463.13 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2014 amounting US\$ 12.16 million); and “Mineral or chemical fertilisers containing the three fertilising elements nitrogen, Phosphorus, Potassium” (up 68.44 percent on 2014 third quarter levels reaching US\$ 9.56 million).

## 3.2. Import origins of Rwanda

### 3.2.1. Trade Partners

In the third quarter of 2015, top five imports of Rwanda originated from the following countries: China (US\$ 97.88 million), Uganda (US\$ 63.35 million), Kenya (US\$ 39.83 million), India (US\$ 35.81 million) and Japan (US\$ 24.80 million). Around one third (32.95 percent) of Rwanda's top five imports came from Asia (US\$ 158.48 million). See Figure 4 for a comparison with the rest of the world.


### 3.2.2. East African Community (EAC) Partner States

In the third quarter of 2015, Rwanda's imports from EAC Partner States totaled US\$ 125.95 million, representing 26.17 percent of overall imported commodities from EAC.

Figure 5 shows that Rwanda's imports from the East African Community (EAC) Partner States in the third quarter of 2015 mainly originated from Uganda and Kenya (50.3 percent and 31 percent of total imports from EAC, respectively), representing together around 80 percent of total imports from EAC. Tanzania follows in the third place with a 15.8 percent share of total imports from EAC and Burundi last with only a 2.2 percent share.

Rwanda’s imports from EAC Partner States, while high, decreased by 7 per cent when compared to the same quarter of 2014 (US\$ 126.22 million in the third quarter of 2014, and US\$ 125.95 million in the third quarter of 2015).

#### 4. Re-exports

Re-exports from Rwanda accounted for only 7.38 per cent of the total trade of goods (see Figure 1 above). In the third quarter of 2015, Rwanda’s re-exports amounted to US\$ 46.01 million, representing a decrease of 6.97 percent over the second quarter of 2015 (from US\$ 49.46 million in the second quarter to US\$ 46.01 million in the third quarter of 2015) and a fall of 27.74 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2014 (US\$ 63.68 million).

This is mainly explained by a decrease in values of re-exports of “Kerosene type Jet Fuel” which stood at US\$ 6.15 million in the second quarter of 2015 and at US\$ 3.29 million in the third quarter of 2015 and amounted US\$ 5.49 million in the same quarter of 2014 (3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter).

#### **4.1. Re-exports by commodity**

In the third quarter of 2015, the top five products re-exported by Rwanda accounted for around 60 per cent of total Rwanda's re-exports. These are: "Motor Spirit (gasoline) premium", which amounted to US\$ 12.46 million, showing an increase in value of 112.38 percent over the third quarter of 2014 and of 22.92 percent compared to the second quarter of 2015; "Gas oil (automotive, light, amber for high speed engines)", which amounted to US\$ 7.06 million following a year-to-year decrease of 81.05 percent and an increase of 1.09 percent when compared with the second quarter of 2015; "Kerosene type Jet Fuel", which amounted to US\$ 3.29 million showing a decrease in value of 39.96 percent over the third quarter of 2014 (US\$ 5.49 million) and of 46.44 percent when compared to the second quarter of 2015; "Broken Rice", which amounted to US\$ 2.39 million up by 361.53 percent compared to the third quarter of 2014 (US\$ 0.52 million) and by 114.40 percent when compared to the second quarter of 2015 (US\$ 1.12 million); and "Semi milled or wholly milled rice, whether or not polished or glazed", which amounted to US\$ 2.32 million (down 9.73 per cent year-over-year and up by 5.99 per cent compared).

#### **4.2. Rwanda Re-export Markets**


##### **4.2.1. Trade Partners**

The analysis of re-exports figures by country of destination for the third quarter of 2015 show that African countries were our main buyers. Out of the top 20 products re-exported by Rwanda, which account for 86 per cent of total re-exports, African countries bought 90.4 percent, totaling US\$ 41.62 million out of US\$ 46.01 million of the total value of Rwanda's re-exports in the third quarter of 2015.

The Democratic Republic of Congo was the main destination, with 78.48 percent share of Rwanda's total re-exports and amounting to US\$ 36.11 million. Other important destinations of Rwanda's re-exports, ranked by percent share, in the third quarter 2015 were Burundi (6.55 percent), Sri Lanka (3.93 percent), Kenya (2.99 percent) and the United Kingdom (1.80 percent). Together, these five countries account for 93.74 percent of the total value of total Rwanda's re-exports (US\$ 43.13 million out of US\$ 46.01 million).

Figure 6 illustrates respective year-to-date values per top five destinations of Rwanda’s re-exports and the rest of the world. Sri Lanka features for the first time.

**Figure 6. Rwanda’s key re-export partners, 2015**



#### 4.2.2. East African Community (EAC) Partner States

Rwanda’s re-exports to EAC Partner States decreased by 29 percent in value terms during the third quarter of 2015 compared to the third quarter of 2014 (US\$ 4.64 million and US\$ 6.53 million, respectively). In addition, revenues from re-exports to these regional partners dropped by 3 percent in value terms when compared to the second quarter of 2015 (US\$ 4.64 million versus US\$ 4.79 million). Figure 7 summarizes the above.

## 5. Trade with Selected Regional Economic Organizations

### 5.1. Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA)

During the third quarter of 2015, Rwanda's total trade with COMESA Member States attained US\$ 202.12 million against US\$ 221.47 million registered in the same quarter of 2014 and against US\$ 189.07 million registered in the previous quarter of 2015; that is 8.7 percent decrease and 0.1 percent increase respectively. There were increases in values of 14 percentage of quarterly exports comparing to the same quarter of 2014 and increases of 4.7 percentage when compared to the exports figure registered during the second quarter of 2015 (US\$ 41.08 million during the third quarter 2015, US\$ 36.11 million during the third quarter of 2014, US\$ 39.25 million in the second quarter of 2015).

Moreover, the quarterly value of imports from COMESA Member States decreased by 3.6 percent against the same quarter of 2014 (US\$ 119.53 million against US\$ 124.04 million respectively) and also increased by 7.6 percent when compared to the second quarter of 2015 (US\$ 111.05 million).

On the re-exports side, Rwanda registered revenues estimated at US\$ 41.51 million during the third quarter of 2015 from COMESA Member States; accusing then a backdrop of 32 percent in value terms against the same quarter of 2014 (US\$ 61.32 million) and an increase of 7.1 percent when compared to the second quarter of 2015 (US\$ 38.77 million). Thus, a negative trade balance of US\$ 36.95 million has been registered during the third quarter of 2015 whereas a negative trade balance of US\$ 26.61 million has been registered during the third quarter of 2014. Likewise, US\$ 33.03 million has been registered as a negative trade balance with COMESA Member States during the second quarter of 2015.

### **5.2. Communauté Economique des Pays de Grands Lacs (CEPGL)**

Total exports to Communauté Economique des Pays de Grands Lacs (CEPGL) Member States (Burundi and the Democratic Republic of Congo), during the third quarter of 2015 stood at US\$ 61.31 million, against imports of US\$ 5.72 million. The trade in goods surplus with CEPGL member states worked out at US\$ 55.59 million while it was US\$ 70.98 million during the same quarter of 2014 and US\$ 33.03 million in the second quarter of 2015.

### **5.3. Southern African Development Community (SADC)**

For SADC Member States, Rwanda's total trade attained US\$ 101.21 million during the third quarter of 2015 while it totalized US\$ 109.97 million in the third quarter of 2014 and US\$ 87.28 million during the second quarter of 2015.

The quarterly exports increased by 27 percent over the same quarter of 2014 (US\$ 21.47 million and US\$ 16.93 million respectively).

The total imports from SADC Member States increased by 12 percent in the third quarter of 2015 over the same quarter of 2014 (US\$ 43.45 million and US\$ 38.71 million respectively).

A decrease of 33.21 percent of the value of Rwanda's re-exports to SADC Member States has been registered during the third quarter of 2015 over the same quarter of 2014 (US\$ 36.29 million against US\$ 54.33 million respectively).

Consequently, a trade balance surplus of US\$ 14.30 million in the third quarter of 2015 was registered while it was at US\$ 32.55 million in the same quarter of 2014 and US\$ 6.22 million in the second quarter of 2015.

#### **5.4. European Union (EU)**

Trade in goods with the European Union (EU) in the third quarter of 2015 totaled US\$ 76.01 million against US\$ 114.30 million registered in the same quarter of 2014 and US\$ 84.57 million in the second quarter of 2015. That is 34 percent decrease over the same quarter of 2014 and 10 percent decrease when compared to the second quarter of 2015.

The quarterly exports to EU Member Countries decreased by 73 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2014 (US\$ 9.60 million while US\$ 35.73 million respectively). The total value of imports from EU decreased by 16 percent during the third quarter of 2015 over the same quarter of 2014 (US\$ 65.49 million and US\$ 77.74 million respectively). Re-exports to EU increased by 11 percent during the third quarter of 2015 over the same quarter of 2014 (US\$ 0.92 million and US\$ 0.83 million respectively).

Thus, Rwanda's trade with EU registered a negative trade balance of US\$ 54.97 million during the third quarter of 2015 while it has showed a negative balance of US\$ 41.18 million in the same quarter of 2014 and US\$ 51.41 million in the second quarter of 2015.
