


HEALTH & ECONOMIC SITUATION OF ADOLESCENTS IN RWANDA



DISTRIBUTION BY EDUCATION, USUAL ECONOMIC STATUS & INDUSTRY OF MAIN JOBS




There are more female students than male. And yet, females drop out of school more than males: only 0.1% of females have completed secondary, compared to the males who are 1%. Even if many adolescents drop out of school, the biggest percentage of Rwandan adolescents are employed, with agriculture/forestry/fishing being the most prevalent job activity.

POVERTY SITUATION BY GENDER




OWNERSHIP OF ASSETS BY GENDER

HEALTH INSURANCE DISTRIBUTION BY GENDER AND INSURANCE INSTITUTIONS



CURRENT USE OF CONTRACEPTIVE METHODS





PREGNANCY AND MOTHERHOOD BY PROVINCE






MALARIA PREVALENCE
