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## **SUMMARY**

In the first quarter of 2020, Rwanda's total trade was US\$ 1206.89 million, an increase of 29 percent over the first quarter of 2019. Exports were US\$ 207.95 million, imports were US\$ 916.68 million and re-exports were US\$ 82.25 million.

In this quarter, total domestic exports increased by 45.97 percent when compared to the first quarter of 2019 (US\$ 207.95 million and US\$ 142.47 million respectively) but decreased by 13.84 percent when compared to the fourth quarter of 2019. Total imports of Rwanda increased by 23.78 percent in the first quarter of 2020 when compared to the same quarter of 2019 (US\$ 916.68 million and US\$ 739.97 million respectively) and also by 2.72 percent over the fourth quarter of 2019. Re-exports, decreased by 2.85 percent in the first quarter of 2020 over the same quarter of 2019 (US\$ 82.25 million and US\$ 84.66 million respectively) and also by 5.82 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2019.

The top five export destinations were; United Arab Emirates, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Pakistan, Hong Kong and Uganda. Together, these five countries accounted a share of 77.62 percent of total value of domestic exports (US\$ 161.42 million).

The commodity groups with the largest export values were; "Other commodities & transactions, n.e.s" (US\$ 107.19 million), "Food and live animals" (US\$ 59.54 million), and "Crude materials, inedible, except fuels" (US\$ 24.59 million).

In terms of re-exports, the top five destinations were the Democratic Republic of Congo, Burundi, Qatar, Ethiopia and Tanzania, United Republic of. Democratic Republic of Congo accounted for 87.79 percent of Rwanda's total re-exports. The most re-exported commodity group were "Mineral fuels, lubricants & related materials" (US\$ 27.96 million), followed by "Food &live animals" (US\$ 21.51 million).

In terms of total imports (CIF); China, India, the United Arab Emirates, Kenya and United Republic of Tanzania were the top five countries of origin of imports to Rwanda and they totalized US\$ 518.38 million of imports equivalent to 56.55% share of the total value of imports.

The commodity groups with the largest values among the top imported products were "Machinery and transport equipment" (US\$ 185.48 million), "Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials" (US\$ 149.14 million) and "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" (US\$ 132.92 million).

## INTRODUCTION

This Statistical Report of Formal External Trade in Goods covers the first quarter of 2020, the period running from January to March. It is produced by the External Trade Statistics Team of the Department of Economic Statistics (DES) at the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR).

One of the key mandates of the DES is to compile, analyze and produce statistics and information on external trade sector following international recommendations. The Rwanda Revenue Authority (RRA), from the Customs Department, provides the data compiled by NISR. They are processed using EUROTTRACE and MS Access database management systems (DBMS).

To collect and compile formal external trade statistics, NISR relies on the General Trade System under which the recorded aggregates include all goods entering or leaving the country's economic territory with the exception of simple transit trade.

**Imports** include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses.

**Exports** cover domestic exports defined as goods of national origin; that is, goods produced in the exporting country and the nationalized goods.

**Re-exports** which are exported in the same conditions as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged and include re-exports from customs bonded warehouses.

**Partner country** is the last known country of destination for exports and the country of origin for imports by the time of compilation.

**Valuation of imports and exports:** Imports are valued on a CIF (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis while exports and re-exports are valued on a FoB (Free on Board) basis.

**Classification of commodities:** The data are categorized by partner country and the international standard classifications such as the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS) and the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC), all linked to the national Customs Procedure Codes (CPCs).

Furthermore, the compilation of External Trade Statistics abides by the recommendations of the *International Merchandise Trade Statistics: Concepts and Definitions 2010* (IMTS 2010) of the United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD). Hence, the data for this report are compiled on **IMTS 2010** basis (not to be confused with data compiled on **Balance of Payments** or **National Accounts** basis)

## 1. Rwanda's Formal External Trade in Goods


This section provides an overview of Rwanda's total trade in goods covering the period from first quarter 2018 to the first quarter of 2020, on a quarterly basis.

In the first quarter of 2020, Rwanda's total trade was US\$ 1206.89 million, an increase of 29 percent over the first quarter of 2019 and a decrease of 1 percent from US\$ 1221.07 million in the preceding quarter (fourth quarter of 2019).

Figure 1 below summarizes the balance of Rwanda's formal trade in goods. Year-over-year, the deficit on traded goods increased considerably by 30.10 percent, from the same period in 2019.

Total imports of goods constitute 75.95 percent of total trade in goods (US\$ 916.68 million), while domestic exports constituted 17.23 percent (US\$ 207.95 million) and re-exports constituted 6.82 percent (US\$ 82.25 million). For more detailed figures, see Appendix 6.1.

## 2. Domestic Exports

### 2.1. Overview

Compared to the fourth quarter of 2019, the first quarter of 2020 registered a decrease in values of 13.84 percent, with total domestic exports amounting to US\$ 207.95 million. Year-over-year, domestic exports' values increased also by 45.97 percent compared to the same quarter of 2019 (see Figure 1).


### 2.2. Rwanda's Export Markets

#### 2.2.1. Trade Partners

Rwanda's key destination markets of exports during the first quarter of 2020 were the United Arab Emirates (US\$ 118.26 million, 56.87 percent share), the Democratic Republic of Congo (US\$ 19.80 million, 9.52 percent share), Pakistan (US\$ 10.87 million, 3.77 percent share), Hong Kong (US\$ 7.01 million, 3.37 percent share), and Uganda (US\$ 5.47 million, 2.63 percent share).

Together, these five countries accounted for US\$ 161.42 million; that is 77.62 percent share of total value of domestic exports. Figure 2 summarizes these figures from quarter one of 2018 up to the first quarter of 2020. For the top twenty domestic exports partners see appendix 6.5a.


## 2.2.2. East African Community Partner States

In the first quarter of 2020, Rwanda's domestic exports to the East African Community Partner States was estimated at US\$ 14.21 million, around 7 percent of total domestic exports value see appendix 6.8b. Of these, about 38.52 percent were destined to Uganda (US\$ 5.47 million).

Domestic exports' values to EAC Partner States increased by 176 percent in comparison with the fourth quarter of 2019 but decreased by 48 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2019.

In terms of exports to EAC partner states, South Sudan stood at the second place with domestic exports from Rwanda valued at US\$ 4.95 million.

### **3. Imports**

#### **3.1. Overview**

In the first quarter of 2020, Total value of imports was US\$ 916.68 million, an increase of 2.72 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2019 which was US\$ 892.38 million and an increase of 23.88 percent when compared to the corresponding quarter of 2019 which was US\$ 739.97 million (see Figure 1 above and appendix 6.1).


During this quarter of 2020, the five most imported commodities in terms of USD values ranked from top to bottom were “Machinery and transport equipment”, “Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material”, “Mineral fuels, lubricants &related materials.”, “Other commodities & transactions, n.e.s.”, and “Chemicals & related products, n.e.s.”

#### **3.2. Origin of the imports of Rwanda**

##### **3.2.1 Trade Partners**

In the first quarter of 2020, the top five imports of Rwanda came from the following countries: China (US\$ 200.38 million), India (US\$ 92.34 million), United Arab Emirates (US\$ 87.52 million), Kenya (US\$ 78.65 million) and Tanzania (US\$ 59.49 million). A more extensive table showing the top twenty partner countries in terms of imports is provided in Appendix 6.6a.

Rwanda's main imports from China were "Machinery & transport equipment" and "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material". Imports from India were dominated by Imports from United Arab Emirates were dominated by: "Mineral fuels, lubricants & related materials", and "Machinery & transport equipment"; Imports from Kenya were also dominated by "Chemicals & related products, n.e.s." and "Other commodities & transactions, n.e.s" while Tanzania's exports to Rwanda were dominated by "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" and "Other commodities & transactions, n.e.s".


### **3.2.2 East African Community Partner States**

In the first quarter of 2020, Rwanda's imports from EAC Partner States totaled US\$ 138.66 million; representing 15.13 percent of all imported commodities (see Appendix 6.8a).

In this quarter, imports from Kenya represents 56.72 percent of total imports from EAC partner state while Imports from Tanzania were 42.90 percent.

In general, Rwanda's imports from EAC Partner States increased by 16.63 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2019 (US\$ 118.89 million in the first quarter of 2019).

## 4. Re-exports

### 4.1. Overview

In the first quarter of 2020, Rwanda's re-exports was estimated at US\$ 82.25 million, a decrease of 5.84 percent over the fourth quarter of 2019 (from US\$ 87.33 million in the fourth quarter) and a decrease of 2.85 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2019 (US\$ 84.66 million).


The top three products re-exported by Rwanda in the first quarter of 2020 accounted for around 70.91 percent of total Rwanda's re-export values. These are; "Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials" which amounted to US\$ 27.96 million, "Food and live animals" which amounted to US\$ 21.51 million, "Animals and vegetable oils, fats & waxes estimated at US\$ 8.85 million.

### 4.2. Rwanda's Re-exports Markets

#### 4.2.1. Trade Partners

The analysis of re-exports figures by country of destination for the first quarter of 2020 shows that African countries were the main buyers. Out of US\$ 82.25 million of re-exports value of Rwanda, the African countries accounted for 96.10 percent of total re-exports. The Democratic Republic of Congo was the main destination, with 89.89 percent share of Rwanda's total re-exports amounting to US\$ 73.94 million. Other important destinations of Rwanda's re-exports, ranked by percent share, were Burundi (4.51 percent), Qatar (2.88 percent), Ethiopia (1.60 percent) and Tanzania (0.67 percent). Figure 6 below illustrates respective quarterly values per top five destinations of Rwanda's re-exports and the rest of the world.

**Figure 6: Rwanda's key re-export partners, 2019Q1-2020Q1**



#### **4.2.2. East African Community Partner States**

Rwanda's re-exports to EAC Partner States increased by 45.77 percent in value terms during the first quarter of 2020 compared to the same quarter of 2019 (US\$ 3.75 million and 2.57 US\$ million, respectively) and decreased by 28.86 percent when compared to the fourth quarter of 2019 (US\$ 3.75 million and US\$ 5.27 million respectively).

## **5. Trade with Selected Regional Economic Organizations**

### **5.1. Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa**

During the first quarter of 2020, Rwanda's total trade with the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA) Member States was US\$ 212.71 million compared to US\$ 217.72 million registered in the same quarter of 2019 and US\$ 225.78 million registered in the fourth quarter of 2019.

Exports to COMESA Member States decreased by 7.37 percent in 2020Q1 when compared to the same quarter of 2019 and increased by 65.54 compared to the fourth quarter of 2019.

Imports from COMESA Member States increased by 0.47 percent in 2020Q1 when compared to the same quarter of 2019 but decreased by 16.43 percent when compared to the fourth quarter of 2019.

On the re-exports side, Rwanda registered revenues estimated at US\$ 78.22 million during the first quarter of 2020 from COMESA Member States; a decrease of 3.41 percent in value terms against the same quarter of 2019 and of 8.05 percent when compared to the fourth quarter of 2019.

Thus, a surplus in trade balance of US\$ 11.98 has been registered during the 2020Q1 against another of US\$ 17.93 million during the same quarter of 2019 and a deficit of US\$ 14.41 million registered in the fourth quarter of 2019.

### **5.2. Communauté Economique des Pays de Grands Lacs**

During the first quarter of 2020, total exports to Communauté Economique des Pays de Grands Lacs (CEPGL) Member States (Burundi and the Democratic Republic of Congo), including re-exports, totalized US\$ 98.49 million and total imports were US\$ 3.06 million. Therefore, the trade in goods surplus with CEPGL member states totaled US\$ 95.43 million compared to US\$ 94.74 million registered in the same quarter of 2019 and to US\$ 93.23 million in the fourth quarter of 2019.

### **5.3. Southern African Development Community**

Rwanda's total trade with the Southern African Development Community (SADC) Member States totaled US\$ 214.83 million during the first quarter of 2020 compared to US\$ 156.44 million in the first quarter of 2019 and US\$ 259.96 million during the fourth quarter of 2019.

Year-over-year, domestic exports to the SADC increased by 26.98 percent, from US\$ million 16.12 in the first quarter of 2019 to US\$ 20.47 million in the fourth quarter of 2020; while total imports increased by about 90.19 percent, from US\$ 63.02 million to US\$ 119.85 million. Over

the same period, re-exports decreased by 3.62 percent, from US\$ 77.30 million to 74.50 US\$ million.

Therefore, the trade in goods deficit with SADC totaled US\$ 24.88 million compared to a surplus of US\$ 30.41 million during the same quarter of 2019 and to a deficit of US\$ 69.47 million in the fourth quarter of 2019.

#### **5.4. European Union**

Trade in goods with the European Union (EU) in the first quarter of 2020 totaled US\$ 87.26 against US\$ 106.70 million registered in the same quarter of 2019 and US\$ 95.60 million in the fourth quarter of 2019.

The quarterly exports to EU Member Countries decreased by 25.71 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2019 (US\$ 14.28 million against US\$ 12.38 million). The total value of imports from EU decreased by 18.49 percent during the first quarter of 2020 over the same quarter of 2019 (US\$ 91.41 million against US\$ 74.51 million).

Re-exports to EU decreased by 62.79 percent during the first quarter of 2020 over the same quarter of 2019 (US\$ 1.02 million and US\$ 0.38 million respectively).

To sum, Rwanda's trade with EU registered a trade deficit of US\$ 61.75 million in the first quarter of 2020 and of US\$ 76.12 million in the same quarter of 2019 while US\$ 46.16 million has been registered as deficit in the fourth quarter of 2019.

#### **5.5. Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS)**

During the first quarter of 2020, total exports to the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) Member Countries, including re-exports, totalized US\$ 0.54 million and the total imports were US\$ 17.09 million. Therefore, the trade in goods deficit with ECOWAS Member States extended to US\$ 16.56 million from the trade surplus of US\$ 0.37 million in the same quarter of 2019.
